Mr. Detterman,
In your letter to the San Lorenzo Unified School District dated December 17, 2012, you requested grab groundwater samples from the five proposed borings (four around former boring B-1 and one in the center of former tank excavation). The proposed borings are to be located only 10 feet from the initial drilling locations centered on potential source areas and at which only very low hydrocarbon concentrations were detected. EquoLogic requests that you reconsider the need for additional groundwater samples from proposed borings so close to existing data points.

EquoLogic has been working with the SLUSD in order to find a date suitable for working in the classroom area. EquoLogic has scheduled drilling for Saturday January 26 and requests a 30 day extension for the report deadline of February 18, 2013.
