Daniel,

The following is a brief summary of the discussion this morning:

1. ACEH will commit to review the draft CAP by December 30<sup>th</sup>, with the intent of starting the public comment period about January 8<sup>th</sup>.
2. Our work goal is to start the existing SVE system as interim mitigation of subslab vapor concentrations as an addition mitigation measure to the work space as the ventilation fans have not successfully reduced elevated PCE in indoor air at two of the three business suites.
3. To accomplish this, AGE committed to submitting an Amended Remedial Action Work Plan (submitted as Appendix D in the CAP dated October 16, 2015) by the inclusion of figures, a table of well locations (by suite) and depth, a piping figure / trenching detail, and a writeup on piping / trenching methods. As stated during the phone call, above ground piping must be secured to a structural element as ACEH is not comfortable with free standing above ground piping, but shallow trenching or secured protected floor piping may be suitable.
4. AGE also committed to having your IH review the HHRA and the completeness or appropriateness, and sign it, or a letter tying the letter to the HHRA. We also discussed a table of indoor air concentrations / subslab concentrations / calculated attenuation factors by suite and by date.
5. AGE committed to the submittal of a Remedial Design Implementation Plan which among other items would outline a baseline sampling event prior to startup of indoor air and subslab concurrently during the public comment period.

Hopefully I briefly captured the majority of our discussion.
