Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

- 1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."
- 2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."
- 3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."
- 4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

ACEH has named the responsible parties for this site as detailed below.

Existence of an Unauthorized Release

Historical documents reportedly indicate that an 8,000-gallon diesel underground storage tank (UST) was closed in place at the site on April 9, 1987. Four soil borings were advanced at the site on March 26, 2014. Total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) as diesel was detected in each of the four grab groundwater samples collected from the soil borings at concentrations ranging from 67 to 790 parts per billion. TPH as diesel was detected in two of four soil samples at concentrations ranging from 2.4 to 6.0 parts per million. Based on these results, an unauthorized release or releases appears to have occurred from the UST system.

Responsible Party Identification

Tip Top Foods, Inc. is a responsible party for the fuel leak because they owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use (Definition 2), were the former owner of property where an unauthorized release occurred (Definition 3), and had control of the UST at the time of or following an unauthorized release (Definition 4).

The 475 Lesser Street LLC is a responsible party because they are the current owner of the property where an unauthorized release occurred (Definition 3).
