Hi Bruce,

I've attached an Enforcement Letter from the case file of the closed BP #11104 case (T0600101651) that essentially started our creation of the new release case Delong Oil (T10000005974). Records submitted to ACEH indicate that BP did not dispense diesel, and that diesel was dispensed only after the new owner (Delong Liu of Delong Oil) converted one of the former gasoline USTs. Free phase product in one of the wells was fingerprinted to be diesel thereafter. The new owner also removed a waste oil UST and discovered free phase waste oil at that time, as discussed in the attached letter. The two cases are linked on Geotracker. There is no recent site work, pending funding from the USTCF. The most recent work dates prior to the closure of the older case (BP #1114). A copy of the closure for the BP site, is on Geotracker if you need analytical details. Let me know if you have additional questions.
