Gentlemen:

A review of the case file for the above-referenced site indicates that your case is currently in not in compliance with Alameda County Environmental Health's (ACEH) October 26, 2015 e-mail Directive Letter which required the submittal of a soil and groundwater investigation report by January 4, 2016. The report is overdue by nearly 6 months now. If additional time is needed, please send me an e-mail requesting an extension.

This site is out of compliance with ACEH directives. Site characterization and/or cleanup at this site is required to be protective of human health and the environment and to move this case towards closure evaluation. Please note that as Responsible Parties, you are required by California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 11, §2720 through §2728 to adequately characterize the site and undertake corrective actions as necessary.

In order to regain compliance, please undertake the tasks previously requested and submit documents to GeoTracker and ACEH's FTP server by revised dates specified below. Failure to submit the documents may result in referral and possible enforcement action by the District Attorney and / or ineligibility for reimbursement of costs incurred at the site from the Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund. The site may also be recommended for removal from the Cleanup Fund if inaction continues. Once removed from the Cleanup Fund the costs associated with the subsurface investigation and / or cleanup work that would be required at your site will not be reimbursed.

This letter is an additional attempt to preclude further enforcement actions. Pursuant to Chapter 6.7, California Health and Safety Code, civil penalties up to \$10,000 for each UST for each day of violation may be imposed. Please note that civil penalties for non-compliance are assessed from the original due date (August 19, 2011).

ACEH requests that you address technical comments previously sent by the revised dates listed below and send us the appropriate documents.
