Good morning Dilan, many thanks to you and your team for issuing the approved work plan directive. Mobilization is underway and we will inform your staff as requested in advance when the work will begin. In the meantime and if you recall, I mentioned our concerns with the requirement to over-excavate at the anomaly area. We have profound concerns with the implications of digging too deep relatively close to the neighboring property line. The probability of causing structural damage to older neighboring properties is strong which EBALDC would be liable for and the cost of such an excavation jeopardizes the feasibility of the overall project. Enclosed you will find a professional opinion from *Essel* – the environmental consultant, from *Rollo & Ridley* – the geotechnical engineer, and *DCI Engineers* – the structural engineer. Each has provided an opinion for not over-excavating supported by their reasons why. Please take a moment to review in an effort to reconsider your decision. You noted that removal of a secondary source material to the maximum extent possible is a component of all closures. Is that still the case if there is a real danger imposed on the public as a result of over-excavating? We welcome your response upon considering the comments provided. Thank you for your time.
