Dear Mr. Lee:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff have reviewed the *Indoor/Outdoor Air and Sub-Slab Soil Vapor Sampling Results*, dated January 3, 2018, and the *Vapor Assessment Work Plan*, dated January 15, 2018. The documents were submitted on your behalf by EKI Environment and Water, Inc. (EKI). Thank you for submitting them. They have significantly improved the technical understanding of the site.

The referenced work plan proposes the installation of additional sub-slab vapor points, and the collection of additional sub-slab and indoor air samples in the former dry cleaner suite, the dentist's suite, and in additional adjacent commercial suites. Due to the predominant clay lithology beneath the site, the work plan also proposed a passive soil vapor assessment along existing and former utility lines north of the building, and south of the building in the downgradient direction of groundwater, and a subsequent evaluation of the usefulness of the method at the site.

Based on ACDEH staff discussions with your team, and review of the documents, the proposed scope of work is conditionally approved for implementation provided that the technical comments below are incorporated during the proposed work. Submittal of a revised work plan or a work plan addendum is not required unless an alternate scope of work outside that described in the work plan or these technical comments is proposed. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the report described below. Please provide at least a 48-hour advance written notification to this office (e-mail preferred to: mark.detterman@acgov.org) prior to the start of field activities.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Work Plan Approval The referenced documents propose a series of actions with which ACDEH is in general agreement of undertaking; however, ACDEH requests several modifications to the approach. Please submit a report by the date specified below.
 - a. Concurrent Sub-Slab & Indoor Air Sampling ACDEH notes that somewhat conflicting statements in regards to sub-slab and indoor air sampling are included in the report, indicating both concurrent sampling, and sampling within seven days of the collection of indoor air samples. To clarify, ACDEH requests adequate concurrent collection of these data in order to determine the site-specific attenuation factor the concrete slab provides at the site. Because different slab areas have been constructed at different times, and thus can provide different attenuation factors, ACDEH requests multiple concurrent sample locations be undertaken based on slab construction factors.
 - b. Meeting Request and Submittal of Passive Sampling Results Conversations between ACDEH and EKI in regards to the work plan referenced above indicate that a meeting will be beneficial for communicating the results of the proposed Supplemental Indoor / Outdoor Air and Sub-Slab Soil Vapor Sampling, and the Sub-Slab Depressurization (SSD) System to be

proposed in a subsequent work plan. ACDEH requests that the meeting additionally include the preliminary results of the Passive Soil Vapor Assessment, also the subject of this letter. By the date below, please identify and forward potential meeting dates and times around day 75 (April 16, 2018), after the date of this letter.

- 2. **Proposed Schedule** The referenced work plan proposed a revised submittal schedule. The schedule appears to be reasonable and expedited.
- 3. Professional Certification and Stamps Please ensure all work is conducted under the oversight of a professional engineer or geologist, and that the reports are submitted under their signature and stamp. California Business and Professions Code require the reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations or judgements performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional include a professional stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification as referenced in Attachment 1.

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.
