Paul,

I wanted to let you know that a VRAP agreement has been signed and funded by Mr. Ravan, and ACEH can now provide oversight of work at the site. We can have a kick off meeting, or you can submit a work plan along the lines of what we discussed. Please be cognizant that the LTCP requires any soil vapor to be collected 5 feet below the foundation of an existing building. That may present problems in that groundwater has been in that depth range previously. You might consider generating a Gantt Chart in order to illustrate the time required for each step, including regulatory review. As you know the standard allowed time period is 60 days. We will strive for quicker; however, right now it can be very difficult to meet even that timeline.
