Hi Keith,

I wanted to provide an update on the Brush Street site and inform you on some new developments. First, in talking with the contractors, they are not comfortable applying Klozur into the trenches. This material is corrosive and there is some concern that, since the pipes will be installed right after the trenching and Klozur application, that there could be some corrosion on the pipes which will be high pressure gas transmission lines. Due to this development, PG&E has opted not to allow the Klozur to be applied into the pipe trenches.

Also, the contractors will be doing the well abandonment work starting on Monday of next week. Monday will be the move and setup day although the initial work may also start that day. It appears that they will use mud circulation to clear the casing. The work is being done by another one of PG&E's direct contractor, American Construction. James Yoo, of Alameda County Public Works, is working with the contractor and ERM is not directly involved.
