Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff is overseeing corrective actions for petroleum and hazardous materials releases to soil, groundwater, and soil gas at the above-referenced site. Investigation and remediation activities are being conducted by the property owner in conjunction with residential development at the property. The City of Oakland Planning Department noticed approval of conversion of the existing industrial building at the site to 102 joint living and working quarters on 23 October 2017.

To update the community on the results of environmental investigations at the site, a fact sheet was distributed in October 2016, and an initial community meeting was held in late 2016. In response to community interest in this cleanup project, the ACDEH conducted two additional meetings to provide status updates in 2017.
