# Dear Responsible Parties:

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. I am the case worker for the subject Local Oversight Program (LOP) case. I have reviewed the Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) case file and the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCBs) GeoTracker website for the above-referenced site. ACEH is in possession of one document addressing activities conducted at the subject site. The document, entitled *Underground Storage Tank Removal Report*, prepared by Garlow Associates and dated November 4, 1998, was provided to the ACEH LOP on October 20, 2015.

This case has been opened as a result of a documented release from the fueling system associated with two 10,000-gallon gasoline underground storage tanks (USTs). At the time of the tank removals on June 18, 1998, a gasoline odor and visible discoloration of soil was noted in the UST pit. Maximum petroleum hydrocarbon concentrations of 1,100 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg) total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHg), 5.2 mg/kg benzene, and 13 mg/kg methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) were detected in initial soil samples collected from beneath the USTs. Additionally, groundwater was collected on July 15, 2015 from an adjacent downgradient monitoring well (MW-5) associated with ACEH case #RO0000271, GeoTracker Global ID T0600100538. Concentrations reported in well MW-5 were reported to contain 8,800 micrograms per liter ( $\mu$ g/L) TPHg, 2,200  $\mu$ g/L benzene, 850  $\mu$ g/L MTBE and 6,700  $\mu$ g/L tertiary butyl alcohol (TBA). The contamination in well MW-5 may be attributed to a release at the subject site.

Please prepare a workplan to delineate the extent of contamination. The work plan should be prepared in conjunction with the SWRCB Low Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy (LTCP) and the SWRCB Leaking Underground Fuel Tank Guidance Manual. ACEH requests the work plan be submitted by the date specified below.

In order to insure that site's current property owner has been identified and informed of these activities, please complete the attached *List Landowners* form and return to ACEH by the date specified below. The completed form may be returned as an electronic mail attachment or by land mail to the attention of Keith Nowell.

In order to initiate a case review, ACEH will need to review all documents related to investigation performed for the site in order to develop an adequate picture of the current status of the case. Please upload any and all documents pertaining to environmental investigation and remediation activities, including all Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments, and tank removal

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reports other than the document referenced above, for your site to the ACEH ftp and the SWRCB GeoTracker websites. Please note that the case will need to be claimed in GeoTracker prior to uploading files to the SWRCB website. Additionally, GeoTracker requires electronic submittal of information (ESI) for reports prepared on or after January 1, 2005. Hence, once the site is claimed, please upload reports (GEO\_REPORTs) prepared prior to January 1, 2005 and GEO\_REPORTS, the laboratory analysis report(s) in electronic deliverable format (EDF), and figures (GEO\_MAPs) to GeoTracker for reports prepared on or following January 1, 2005.

Please claim your site and upload existing submittals to GeoTracker and ACEH's ftp websites by the date specified below. All future submittals should also be submitted to both websites. # Responsible Party(ies) Legal Requirements / Obligations

# REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

#### **ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS**

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). # PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

# PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

# **UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND**

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

# **AGENCY OVERSIGHT**

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

# **REQUIREMENTS**

- Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
  document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. <u>Documents</u>
  with password protection will not be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#\_Report Name\_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555\_WorkPlan\_2005-06-14)

#### **Submission Instructions**

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
