Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the recently submitted document entitled, "Work Plan for Soil and Groundwater Investigation," dated July 5, 2017 (electronically received on July 7, 2017), prepared by Rosso Environmental, Inc. (REI) for the subject site. The proposed scope of work presented in the above-mentioned work plan consists of installing up to five soil borings, and up to three groundwater monitoring wells to delineate potential hydraulic oil contamination. The work plan also includes maintenance records for the elevator.

Based on ACDEH staff review of the above-mentioned work plan, we generally concur with the proposed scope of work, provided that the modifications requested in the technical comments below are addressed and incorporated during the field implementation. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the technical report requested below. Please provide a 72-hour advance written notification to this office (e-mail preferred to: paresh.khatri@acgov.org) prior to the start of field activities.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- REI proposes to install up to five soil borings using direct-push technology to an approximate depth of 16 feet below the ground surface (bgs) to collect soil samples to delineate potential hydraulic oil contamination. It appears advantageous to collect "grab" groundwater samples in addition to soil samples from the soil borings as groundwater flow direction is inferred and "grab" groundwater data will aid in groundwater contaminant plume delineation. Please include "grab" groundwater sampling to the proposed scope of work.
- 2. REI included elevator service records in Appendix B in the above-mentioned work plan. According to REI, the hydraulic oil release was reported to the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services on November 19, 2015. Elevator maintenance and service records dated February 1, 2009 through November 1, 2015 were included as well as records records dated December 6, 2016 through May 1, 2017. However, there appears to be period of records missing between November 1, 2015 through December 6, 2016. Please locate and submit records for the missing period and include them in the subsurface investigation report due by the date specified below.

Responsible Party(ies) Legal Requirements / Obligations

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health's (ACDEH) Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program File Transfer Protocol (FTP) site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to SCP sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/) for more information on these requirements.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACDEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I have read and acknowledge the content, recommendations and/or conclusions contained in the attached document or report submitted on my behalf to ACDEH's FTP server and the SWRCB's GeoTracker website." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site-specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this case meet this requirement. UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, late reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. REQUIREMENTS

- Please <u>do not</u> submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. Documents with password protection <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
