Dear Messrs. Mashhoon and Cropper:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) has reviewed the case file including the *Focused Site Conceptual Model and Workplan for Well Installation and MPE Operation,* dated September 26, 2018, by SOMA Environmental Engineering, Inc. (SOMA) for work proposed at 2200 Telegraph Avenue and at 2201 Valley Street, in Oakland California. Thank you for submitting the report.

The SCM reported on the results of the installation of DPT-9 to DPT-18 in July to August 2018 and identified the upper water-bearing zone at the site as a perched seasonal (ephemeral) water-bearing zone. The work plan proposed the installation of two new extraction wells screened across the perched upper zone and the deeper water-bearing zone on the parcel for 2201 Valley Street. The extraction wells will be used for Multi-Phase Extraction (MPE), and proposed MPE operations for an estimated four to five weeks, and that two rounds of rebound testing will be conducted thereafter.

ACDEH notes that residual soil contamination currently remains in place and may continue to act as a source for groundwater contamination on both parcels without further actions. The report indicates that a work plan for the delineation of essentially surficial lead is forthcoming.

Based on ACDEH staff review of the above referenced documents and of the case file we generally concur with the recently proposed scope of work, provided that you address the following technical comments, submit the requested documents, and upon ACDEH approval, perform the proposed work, and send us the technical reports requested below. Please provide 72-hour advance written notification to this office (e-mail preferred to: mark.detterman@acgov.org) prior to the start of field activities.

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.
