Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) is providing regulatory oversight for the subject Site Cleanup Program (SCP) case. As this writing, ACDEH has provided Union Pacific Railroad (UPR) with a Voluntary Remedial Action Program Agreement (VRAPA). This case has been assigned to my case work portfolio. While the VRAPA is under review by UPR and in an attempt to avoid a delay of work implementation, I have been authorized to request a work plan which presents the anticipated scope of services for this case.

As outlined in correspondences with our agency, ACDEH understands the proposed scope of work will include upgrades to the diesel shop, including concrete slab and soil removal, field screening using visual and instrumented methodologies, collection and analysis of subsurface soil samples and removal and characterization of excavated material for off-site disposal.

Please include in the work plan requested below the identification of the location and scope of historic site activities within the proposed work areas to aid in the identification of potential chemicals of concern (PCOCs), the anticipated lateral and vertical extent of the excavation(s), handling of groundwater-if encountered, proposed work schedule, and scope of analysis for the subsurface soil samples (and groundwater, if appropriate) and disposal characterization. ACDEH requests a figure depicting the diesel shop and the proposed excavation area(s) be prepared using an aerial photographic base. Please submit the work plan by the date specified below.

Note that ADCEH is no longer accepting submittals to our FTP website. Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
