Jerry,

Scott Atthowe, the new owner of the former Carnation property at 1310 14th Street in Oakland, called to say that they have done some remodeling activities in the existing building and, as part of that, are planning to excavate two shallow trenches to connect bathrooms to the existing sewer line, which runs east-west under the center of the east-west leg of the building. The two trenches will include: (1) an approximately 15-foot long by 2 feet deep trench at the east end of the building, where new bathrooms have been constructed; and (2) an approximately 5-foot long by 40 inches deep trench at the west end of this leg of the building, where an existing bathroom has been remodeled. Both of these trenches are outside the former plume area (the first is east and the second is west of the main plume area). These trenches are shallow and should not encounter contaminated soil; however, per the closure requirements, we are providing this notification to the County.

Please let us know if there are any formal procedures or other tasks that you would advise for this activity.
