- 12/12/96 Spoke to Rob Barry (Pager → 707-434-2992) The tops of the USTs have been cut & they are pumping liquid contents into Baker Tanks. Will be removing sand from the USTs tomorrow & the USTs may not be removed until Wed. or Thurs.
- 5/15/97 Larry Harlan, Cape Environmental, 714-427-6160, Cape Environmental will be preparing the required workplan & will be the contact for future work.

- 10/24/96 Contacted Rob Barry's office & left message for him inquiring about specific date for tank removal
10/24/96 Rob Barry called. Pagen # = ~~407-434-2992~~
They removed asphalt, dug around, followed a concrete slab that ran along excavation, collected samples already, & will probably begin excavating USTs on Tues.
10/30/96 Received message from Rob Barry. Found pipes containing asbestos w/in the concrete they encountered in tank pit. So there is a bit of a delay.
11/4/96 Rob Barry called & left message saying that Nov 4 - 7, '96 they would be busy mitigating asbestos problem.
11/8/96 Rob Barry called to say that, due to delay, tanks won't be ready to remove until late ~~Fri~~^{next} week or following week.
11/19/96 Spoke to Rob Barry. Tanks will be inverted, vacuumed, cut, & removed next week on Mon & Tues Nov 25 & 26.
11/22/96 Rob Barry called to say that dewatering system is not working & tank removal will be delayed 'til after Tues. of next wk.
11/27/96 Rob Barry called to say that he will get a Marine Chemist to come out to site and ok certification of hot work so that they can use a torch to cut the tank since it is ~ $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick. This will happen on Monday Dec 2. Steve McKinley, Fire Dept, will be out to oversee this work. The tanks will be removed probably late Tues. after removing contents of tanks

The USTs will probably be removed within 30 days

9/24/96 left message

9/25/96 Rob Barry, 707-446-7996, has been retained to organize the removal of Tanks 3&4. He will submit the tank removal plan and attach plans for dewatering per.

9/27/96 Spoke to Rob Barry w/^{to CAT Inc} my comments on tank removal plan & work plan. Especially wondered why dewatering was required. Stated that he would get back to me.

10/8/96 Spoke to Rob Barry. The rationale for dewatering is:

1) aids in supporting shoring - not as much hydrostatic pressure against shoring; 2) Not as messy when they are excavating; 3) Better compaction during backfilling. Will fax schedule & will pick up plans.

10/22/96 Called Rob Barry, 707-446-7996. Excavation work will begin tomorrow and USTs will probably be removed on Fri or Mon, but he will keep County posted. Wells for dewatering have already been installed.

Ms. Eisele stated that she met w/ GSA members to discuss options for tank closure & removal at the site. They came to decision to conduct a cost evaluation & feasibility study on several options for tank closure of tanks 3 & 4. She stated that subsequent to this, they would implement tank closure & subseq. address further site characterization. I requested that she submit a letter explaining stakes & timetable.

Just retained consultant to prepare work plan for removal of 2 remaining tanks and overexcavation. Will submit a timetable listing submittal & implementation of w.p. shortly.

1/27/94

According to George Pendegras, a set of piping in concrete encased trenching was identified. After further tracing, a pipe containing an oily substance was identified, leading GSA to believe that there is another oil UST located near the two other oil USTs along side the retaining wall. They will be tracing this piping to try to locate UST. (Per field conversation.)

1/28/94 Mr. Pendegras (916) 444-0123, Brown & Caldwell, called to say that a GSA mechanic turned up some site plans from 1942 and confirmed that there are only 2 10,000-gallon USTs in the area near the retaining wall. Both tanks were filled w/ sand.

3/16/94 Spoke to Jill Almeida, Alameda Federal Center (210-2439) and she stated that she's working on budget for future work at sites and this budget needs to be approved before further work can resume. She stated that a workplan, including proposal for closure of tanks, will be submitted in near future.

4/28/94 Tim Smith, 209-267-0903 & Juliet Shin
I requested that Mr. Smith submit a report documenting the work done to date along w/ his proposal to treat the sludge that they are unable to pump out in the two remaining tanks. His report will also address slant borings beneath these tanks as part of closure. The report will be submitted by next wk.

1/26/94

Mr. Smith, T+T Earth Services (209)267-0903, stated that they would go out to the site tomorrow at 7:00 AM to begin work on the tank removals of two of the tanks. The tank that was proposed to be closed in place, will not be closed tomorrow. The Fire Dept. will not be out at the site since it is a Federal facility. However, Mr. Smith stated that he would follow the $\sim 10\%$ LEL & O₂ requirements w/ his Gas Tech. Mr. Smith also requested that they be able to backfill a portion of the pit w/ gravel tomorrow to save the integrity of the Street, w/ the understanding that any ~~asphalt~~ ^{contaminated} left in place would be fully characterized & addressed at a later date. Mr. Smith stated that he would incorporate the details of the initial meeting again in the Tank Removal Report. Mr. Smith stated that ICE was detected in initial meetings.

1/26/94

George Pendergrass, Brown + Caldwell, stated that he would be mailing the County Forms A+B. He stated that a 2nd, and possibly a third, UST has been located near the waste oil UST that they proposed to close in place. I told him that they need to close these massive tanks, and probably it would be most practical to do it all at once, along w/ the waste oil UST. Savano + Cope are the prime contractors & T+T Earth Services is the subcontractor. B+C are construction managers to oversee all work.

Tim Smith, T+T Earth Services (209) 267-0903
Called to say that they completed borings at
site. Contaminants identified were waste oil
tank (Tank 3) and Tank 2. A VR form will
be completed & submitted to the County.

& get them to me at the tank removal. He
will also fax copy of H+S training card.
(Marked forms A+B).

1/12/94

Tim Smith called to say that Fire Dept. has
no jurisdiction on federal facilities, therefore
it is up to his client to ask the Fire Dept
out there. However, his client has chosen
not to have Fire Dept. out there.

1/21/94

I spoke to Steve McKinley, Alameda Fire Dept.,
about not going out to site. He said the
disadvantages are that, if there is a fire,
Alameda Fire Dept. would be the responders,
or that no records would exist at their
agency for this tank removal. He did not
wish to give County authority to do their job.

1/21/94

I spoke to Paul, T+T, re this issue, &
expressed my inclination to have the
Fire Dept. out there. JS.
