#### Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

- 1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."
- 2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."
- 3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."
- 4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

### **Responsible Party Identification**

## Existence of Unauthorized Release

In March 1986 existing groundwater monitoring wells A-2 through A-8 were sampled and concentrations up to 31,000 micrograms per liter ( $\mu$ g/l) of Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHg) was detected in well A-2. Additionally 3.5 feet of Floating Product was reported in well A-4. An Unauthorized Release Form (URF) was completed on October 7, 1987. These data indicate than an unauthorized release had occurred.

## Responsible Party Identification

The Atlantic Richfield Company Chevron Corporation (ARCO) purchased the property in January 1966. ARCO is a responsible party for site because it owned or operated an UST used for the storage of a hazardous substance (Definition 1), owned or operated the USTs immediately before the discontinuation of its use (Definition 2), owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3), and had control over an UST at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4).

BP AMOCO / BP West Coast Products, LLC purchased or received the property in April 2000 and are responsible parties because they owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3).

Raj Mulkh and Bhatia Kulwinder, et al purchased the property in May 2005 and are responsible parties because they owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3).

Ahmed Dobashi purchased the property in August 2008 and is a responsible party because he owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3).

Abdulrahim Alazani purchased the property in May 2013, and is responsible parties because he owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3).
