It appears to be just a core through the concrete and into the subsurface. There is no evidence that a drain pipe ever existed and was either removed or rusted away. There is another core approximately 1 ft (+/-) toward the northeast from the "main" one and that does not show any remnant of a pipe either. Take a look at the attached photos for more detail on this. IMGP2170 shows that the tenants have placed a fountain directly above this circular depression. IMGP2172 shows the two holes after the fountain was moved. IMGP2172 is taken looking approx east. Our original thought was that this "drain" traced toward the northeast and connected to the storm drain/sanitary sewer running northward toward the street in the breezeway. However, as you can see from the photos, there is no pipe leading away from these two holes in that direction.
