Dear Mr. Silveira:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the fuel leak case file for the above-referenced site, including the recently submitted wok plan entitled, "Subsurface Investigation Work Plan (SB-7 through SB-13 and SG-1 through SG-5)," dated December 15, 2008 and received by ACEH on January 15, 2009 (Work Plan). The Work Plan, which was prepared by P&D Environmental, Inc., proposes a scope of work to address technical comments in ACEH correspondence dated January 31, 2006. Proposed site characterization activities include collection of soil, soil vapor, and groundwater samples.

The proposed scope of work is conditionally approved for implementation provided that the technical comments below are addressed during the proposed field investigation. Submittal of a revised Work Plan is not required unless an alternate scope of work outside that described in the Work Plan and technical comments below is proposed. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the technical reports requested below

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- Soil Vapor Sampling. The proposed soil vapor sampling methods and locations are acceptable. However, petroleum hydrocarbons originating from 2301 East 12th Street have affected the property currently owned by the City of Oakland northwest of the site on the opposite side of 23rd Avenue. The potential for contamination from 2301 East 12th Street to affect future use of the property northwest of 23rd Avenue must be assessed. Therefore, we request that you collect one soil vapor sample at a location approximately 10 feet southeast of previous soil boring SB-4. Please present results in the Site Investigation Report requested below.
- 2. Soil Sampling from Direct Push Borings. We request that soils from the proposed direct push soil borings be logged continuously and screened in the field as the boring is advanced. Soil samples are to be collected for laboratory analysis from any zones within the upper 15 feet where visible staining, odor, or elevated PID readings are observed. One soil sample is to be collected from the interval where the maximum staining, odor, or PID readings are observed within the interval. If more than one interval of visible staining, odor, or elevated PID readings are observed, we request that you collect one soil sample from each distinct vertical interval of contamination. Soil sampling is not requested from the soils borings to be advanced using air knife drilling.

3. Proposed Laboratory Analyses. The proposed laboratory analyses for groundwater and soil vapor samples are generally acceptable. Please assure that the laboratory reporting for EPA Method 8260 for the groundwater samples includes reporting of concentrations for tetrachloroethene (PCE), fuel oxygenates, 1,2-dichloroethane (EDC), and ethylene dibromide (EDB) in addition to the listed analytes. Please assure that the laboratory reporting for EPA Method TO-15 includes reporting of concentrations for PCE in addition to the listed analytes. We request that soil samples be analyzed for TPH as gasoline, TPH as diesel, TPH as motor oil, BTEX, fuel oxygenates, 1,2-dichloroethane, and ethylene dibromide. Please present results in the Site Investigation Report requested below.

TECHNICAL REPORT REQUEST

Please submit technical reports to Alameda County Environmental Health (Attention: Jerry Wickham), according to the following schedule:

June 10, 2009 – Site Investigation Report

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Geotracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the Geotracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in Geotracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website for more information on these requirements (http://www.swrcb.ca.gov/ust/cleanup/electronic reporting).

PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized

representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

SUBJECT: Electronic Report Upload (ftp) Instructions

Effective January 31, 2006, the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection. (Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.)

It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.

Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.

Do not password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password.
 Documents with password protection will not be accepted.

Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer

monitor.

Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#_Report Name_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555_WorkPlan_2005-06-14)

Additional Recommendations

A separate copy of the tables in the document should be submitted by e-mail to your Caseworker in Excel format.
 These are for use by assigned Caseworker only.

Submission Instructions

1) Obtain User Name and Password:

- a) Contact the Alameda County Environmental Health Department to obtain a User Name and Password to upload files to the ftp site.
