Ladies and Gentlemen:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) understands that the Chevron Environmental Management Company (Chevron), a Responsible Party for the listed fuel release case, and Ms. Kiersten Hoey of GHD, Inc., an environmental consulting company retained by Chevron to conduct the environmental work at the site, have sent you a *Basement / Crawlspace Survey* concerning your property at 1715 High Street in Oakland, and have not received a response back. It is important that you respond.

A hydrocarbon release occurred at the service station located at 4265 Foothill Boulevard, and the release contaminated soil, groundwater, and soil vapor beneath the site and the site vicinity. As the responsible party, Chevron is required by state regulations to define the full extent of the release(s) and to clean up the contamination to be protective of public health. Based on currently available data, it appears that your building could receive some of the contamination from this release. It is the intent of this letter to determine if this may be the case.

Because soil vapor can contaminate buildings with basements or crawl spaces, Chevron and their consultant, Ms. Hoey with GHD, have requested knowledge of the construction style of your building's foundations in an effort to determine if soil vapor may be contaminating the air in the basement or crawl space and if cleanup actions are required on their part. If needed, the costs will be covered by Chevron. This effort was required by ACDEH in order to protect your health. **ACDEH requests your response and cooperation in this matter.** 

Once received, Chevron, GHD, and ACDEH will review your response in order to determine if additional actions may be needed to determine if your health could be affected by the petroleum release.

ACDEH encourages you to work with Chevron, and their consultant GHD, and return the attached form to either Kiersten Hoey of GHD, at the contact information listed on the form, or to my attention, at ACDEH by mail or by fax as listed at the top of this letter, or by email as listed below.
