This letter follows review of the case file for this site, up to and including the Earth Engineers (EE) "Work Plan for Geophysical Investigations and Monitoring Well Installation", dated September 24, 1996.

The EE work plan utilizes an electromagnetic survey and reflection survey to determine whether additional underground storage tanks (USTs) are present on the 1616-1618-1620 Doolittle properties. In addition, the work plan proposes to install four (4) groundwater monitoring wells after results of the geophysical survey are reported. Please be advised that if additional UST(s) are found, additional groundwater monitoring wells may be required by this office.

The Earth Engineers work plan is approved. It is my understanding that the geophysical investigation is scheduled for October 3 and 4, 1996.

Please be advised that this letter constitutes a formal request for technical reports pursuant to California Water Code Section 13267(b) and Health and Safety Code Sections 25299.37 and 25299.78.

Dear Ms. Gallinatti:

This letter follows our telephone conversation of May 6, 1996 pertaining to the above referenced site. Enclosed you will find the information I obtained through a cursory review of the San Leandro Fire Department files. In addition, information from selected Harding-Lawson Associates (HLA) reports are enclosed for you review. As you will note on Plate 1 of the HLA site plan, I have included approximate locations of ten (10) USTs which may or may not have been removed.

The following information is required to obtain site closure from the Regional Water Quality Control Board:

(SND 3563)1616 Doolittle Drive - Soil contamination present warrants further soil/groundwater assessment for both the north and south UST locations (Tanks 5 & 6).

groundwater to an unknown extent. San Leandro Fire Department (SLFD) files contain a facility map showing the locations of three previously unknown USTs. These tanks consist of a 2000-gallon waste oil tank located near the oil storage shed, and two oil tanks, one unknown size and one 800-gallon located east of Sullair Pacific Company Building 1.

1620 Doolittle Drive - Site has five apparent vent pipes whereas only one tank was removed. San Leandro Fire Department (SLFD) files contain a diagram showing the proposed locations of four proposed UST's located east of the building. A geophysical survey may be used to confirm that these four tanks have or have not been removed, if adequate access can be provided for the survey. In addition, this SLFD diagram shows three 6000-gallon USTs already in operation at this time which are located in the eastern part of the facility under a concrete apron.
