# MONTHLY SUMMARY REPORT SHERWIN-WILLIAMS, EMERYVILLE, CALIFORNIA October 2000

#### I. ACTIONS TAKEN – SEPTEMBER 2000

#### A. IRMS

## **Extraction and Treatment System Expansion**

 LFR continued preparing a technical memorandum summarizing the data collected during the various pumping tests and extraction system expansion activities on the former Rifkin Property.

# Storm Water Handling and Environmental Cap

- Monitoring of the on site multi-point storm drain system continued. No rain events
  occurred during September and water was not discharged to Temescal Creek from
  the multi-point system.
- LFR performed the annual purging of the multi-point system in preparation for the upcoming the 2000/2001 rainy season. LFR cleaned the steel slip liners in the 11 on site catch basins and inspected the catch basin sump pumps and all discharge hoses and performed repairs where necessary. Following the inspection, LFR purged the existing pumps and discharge hoses with clean water. All purge water was containerized in portable tanks and treated through the on site groundwater treatment system.

# **B. Site Investigation**

- Access issues with South BGR (Wareham Property) have been resolved and the City
  of Emeryville has agreed to allow access west of UPRR for continuation of the site
  investigation. Drilling crews are scheduled on October 12, 2000 for continuation of
  the investigation activities.
- QA/QC of the data from the site investigation has been completed. The data is being tabulated, posted, and evaluated.

# C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

- Groundwater treatment system operations and monitoring continued in accordance with NPDES requirements.
- The groundwater extraction and treatment system was brought back on line on September 18, 2000 following the treatment and removal of iron bacteria residue in the groundwater treatment system equalization tank. The iron bacteria residue in the tank was inoculated using non-corrosive and non-toxic chemicals. The resulting mixture of inoculated iron bacteria residue and water were pumped to the treatment system filter press to produce a de-watered filter cake sludge. In addition, LFR

- removed sediment and debris from several process transfer tanks that had accumulated during normal treatment system operation.
- LFR continued monitoring the extraction wells for the presence of iron bacteria by visually inspecting well pumps and discharge lines. Iron bacteria buildup has been visually observed in several extraction wells and additional treatment using non-corrosive and non-toxic chemicals will be scheduled.
- LFR collected groundwater level measurements from wells/piezometers associated with the former Rifkin Property.

# D. Community Relations

- Information hotline telephone message updates and coordination with the local residents and businesses were updated monthly to keep the local community informed of current activities.
- A CWG meeting scheduled at the Sherwin-Williams facility on September 20, 2000
  was cancelled at the request of the RWQCB. A CWG meeting will be scheduled at a
  future date.

 LFR will finalize a technical memorandum summarizing the data collected during the various pumping tests and extraction system expansion activities on the former Rifkin Property.

- Access issues with South BGR (Wareham Property) have been resolved and the City
  of Emeryville has agreed to allow access west of UPRR for continuation of the site
  investigation. Drilling crews are scheduled on October 12, 2000 for continuation of
  the investigation activities.
- Entrix will analyze the data from the investigation work completed to date and begin
  applying it to the risk assessment.

## C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

- Groundwater treatment system operations and monitoring will continue in accordance with NPDES requirements. LFR will complete and submit the 3rd quarter NPDES monitoring report to the RWQCB.
- LFR will sample wells and measure water levels in accordance with the quarterly
  monitoring program. LFR will complete and submit the 3rd quarter groundwater
  monitoring report per the Site Cleanup Requirements (SCR) Order 98-009. The
  quarterly groundwater monitoring report will be submitted in compact disk format
  along with the quarterly NPDES monitoring report.
- LFR will collect groundwater level measurements from wells/piezometers associated with the former Rifkin Property.
- LFR will continue to monitor the extraction wells for the presence of iron bacteria by visually inspecting well pumps and discharge lines.

# D. Community Relations

- A CWG meeting is not scheduled for the month of October 2000.
- Information hotline telephone message updates and coordination with the local residents and businesses will be conducted as needed to keep the local community informed of current activities.

# III. PLANNED ACTIVITIES - NOVEMBER 2000

#### A. IRMS

# **Extraction and Treatment System Expansion**

 LFR will schedule a subcontractor to modify the extraction well vaults and associated piping for the groundwater extraction system on the former Rifkin Property.

# Storm Water Handling

Monitoring of the on site multi-point system will continue.

# B. Site Investigation/Risk Assessment

Entrix will analyze the data from the investigation work completed to date and begin
applying it to the risk assessment.

# C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

 Treatment system operations and monitoring will continue in accordance with NPDES requirements.

## D. Community Relations

- A CWG meeting is tentatively scheduled at the Sherwin-Williams' Emeryville plant on November 7, 2000 at 9:30 A.M.
- Information hotline telephone message updates and coordination with the local residents and businesses will be conducted as needed to keep the local community informed of current activities.

# VI. ACTION ITEMS BY OTHERS

A revised schedule for the RI/RA/FS was presented in the January 8, 1999
 Workplan Addendum. The RWQCB has accepted this schedule and the RWQCB should formally revise SCR Order 98-009 to reflect the modified schedule.

# V. COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER

Due to access issues on neighboring properties, several milestones in the current schedule will likely not be met. A revised schedule will be determined once the access issues have been resolved.

In discussions at the June CWG meeting, Sherwin-Williams, Entrix, and the Agencies concluded that due to the access issues, the draft RI report will be submitted in January 2001 and the draft risk assessment will be submitted in March 2001.

The following deliverables for tasks were submitted by the dates noted. The tasks and schedule are in accordance with the SCR Order, and revised dates agreed by the RWQCB. As noted above, the SCR schedule needs to be revised by the RWQCB for future tasks.
