MONTHLY SUMMARY REPORT SHERWIN-WILLIAMS, EMERYVILLE, CALIFORNIA November 2002

ACTIONS TAKEN –OCTOBER 2002

A. IRMS

Storm Water Handling

• LFR completed annual maintenance of the multipoint system in preparation for the rainy season.

B. Site Investigation/Risk Assessment/Feasibility Study

- EarthRisk completed the draft of the Human Health Risk Assessment (HHRA)
 for future conditions and submitted it to Chiron on September 17, 2002, for
 preliminary review. This document is currently scheduled for a November
 submittal to the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB). This
 document identifies risk-based target concentrations for soil and groundwater
 protective of several different potential exposure scenarios and associated land
 uses.
- A work plan prepared by CDM for additional sampling on the Rifkin property
 was submitted to Chiron and the RWQCB in July. The work was conducted in
 early September. The completed report was submitted to Chiron for review in
 November.
- CDM continued to evaluate potential alternatives for the Feasibility Study (FS).
 A FS roundtable discussion was held on September 24 to review and evaluate possible FS alternatives.
- A workshop comprising of CDM and Sherwin-Williams as well as other consultants familiar with both the site and arsenic remediation was held to test the FS assumptions and rationale.

C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

- GWETS operations and monitoring continued in accordance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements.
- LFR conducted quarterly groundwater monitoring for the fourth quarter, 2002.

D. Community Relations

- Information hotline telephone message update for coordination with the local residents and businesses was not modified in October.
- A CWG meeting was held at 1450 Sherwin on October 23.

II. ACTIONS EXPECTED –NOVEMBER 2002

A. IRMS

Storm Water Handling

 The season's first storm began on November 7. The multipoint system operated adequately.

B. Site Investigation/Risk Assessment/Feasibility Study

- CDM will continue the screening of potential remedial alternatives.
- EarthRisk will continue the development of the HHRA with a Draft going to the CWG and RWQCB on November 18, 2002.

C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

- GWETS operations and monitoring will continue in accordance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements.
- LFR will conduct monthly groundwater level measurements this month.

D. Community Relations

- Information hotline telephone message update for coordination with the local residents and businesses will be conducted as needed to keep the local community informed of current activities.
- A CWG Meeting is not scheduled for November.

III. PLANNED ACTIVITIES -DECEMBER 2002

A. IRMS

 Monitoring of the on site multi-point system will be continued as rain events occur.

B. Site Investigation/Risk Assessment/Feasibility Study

 CDM continues to refine remedial options under the FS outline in order to focus on pilot tests of potential remedies.

C. NPDES and Groundwater Monitoring

GWETS operations and monitoring will continue in accordance with NPDES requirements.

 LFR will collect monthly groundwater level measurements from wells/piezometers this month.

D. Community Relations

- A CWG Meeting is tentatively scheduled for 10:00 a.m. December 4 at 1450
 Sherwin Ave.
- Information hotline telephone message update for coordination with the local residents and businesses will be conducted as needed to keep the local community informed of current activities.

IV. ACTION ITEMS BY OTHERS

- The RWQCB should formally revise the SCR Order 98-009 to reflect the modified schedule as discussed with the CWG.
- The HHRA will be discussed in detail at the Dec 4,2002 CWG meeting. All
 interested parties from the CWG should be familiar with the written document so
 that it may be finalized within three weeks of the meeting.
- The RWQCB has requested Shell to complete a historical background review of
 activities on the former Shell Development property, currently leased by Chiron
 from the Wareham Group. It is anticipated that this work plan will be reviewed by
 the CWG.

The following deliverables for tasks were submitted by the dates noted. The tasks and schedule are in accordance with the SCR Order, and revised dates agreed by the RWQCB. The SCR schedule needs to be revised by the RWQCB for future tasks.
