Hi George:

Thank you for meeting with us today at the subject site. As I indicated today, Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) is providing regulatory oversight for soil and groundwater contamination associated with the dry cleaning operations at the site. Based on our discussion of historic and current dry cleaning operations and observations of your facility, ACEH is concerned about the management of hazardous materials at your facility, the lack of requisite record keeping including waste manifests and a current Hazardous Materials Business Plan, and lack of knowledge about whether you permitted or in compliance with the Oakland Fire Department's Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA)/Hazardous Material Management Program requirements. We understand that you discontinued the use of the two PERC machines approximately two years ago, however while no longer in use they have not been properly decommissioned.

As explained to you today, Ron Elvidge, the property owner, is working with ACEH to try to obtain closure of the soil and groundwater contamination issues at the site. To help facilitate this, we need to receive confirmation that your dry cleaning facility is a permitted facility and is in compliance with regulations pertaining to hazardous material management.

Please contact the Leroy Griffith with the Oakland Fire Department CUPA at (510) 238-3927, the administrative agency that coordinates and enforces numerous local, state, and federal hazardous materials management and environmental protection programs within the City of Oakland.
