On behalf of Atlantic Richfield Company (ARC), Broadbent & Associates, Inc. (Broadbent) submitted to the Alameda County Environmental Health Services (ACEHS) a *Case Evaluation & Justification for No Further Action* (November 21, 2011) concerning the Former Richfield Oil Company Station #472 at 6415 International Boulevard in Oakland (ACEHS Case #RO2982). Based on Broadbent's review presented within the document, the above referenced case does not appear to pose a significant threat to human health, environmental receptors, or the reasonably anticipated beneficial uses of water, and appears to meet the criteria of the State's Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy.
