Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the recently provided documents entitled *Non-Hazardous WAM Approval, 637083CA* (83CA) dated October 26, 2018 and 63686CA (86CA) dated October 11, 2018. Both documents were prepared by Waste Management approving acceptance of the profiled materials to their Altamont Landfill and Recovery (ALR) facility. The documents were included as attachments to an electronic mail sent to ACDEH, Attention: Keith Nowell, dated November 6, 2018.

The 83CA document approves acceptance of approximately 2,000 cubic yards (cu. yds.) of soil profiled by samples EB-1 through EB-4, EB-6 and EB-7, characterizing material beneath the former warehouse/ loading dock structure. Material information contained in the document identifies the common material name as *Soil for ADC* and consisting of 95-100% soil with 0-5% debris including rocks and concrete.

The 86CA document approves acceptance of approximately 500 cu. yds. of petroleum hydrocarbon contaminated soil characterized by sample SP-CENTER. Material information contained in the document identifies the common material name as *High* VOC soil for disposal consisting of 95-100% soil with 0-5% debris including rocks and concrete.

ACDEH is in general agreement with the soil removal and offsite disposal to the ALR receiving facility. Please include a description of the activities surrounding the presence and removal of the off-hauled materials, including their associated disposal manifests, in the Corrective Action Completion Report for Soil Excavation and Construction Groundwater Dewatering following completion of remedial activities associated with this redevelopment project.

ACDEH notes that this case is not in compliance with regulations for the electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCBs) GeoTracker site. Missing submittals include the Tank Removal Report for the underground storage tank (UST) removed along 17<sup>th</sup> Street near Willow Street and its associated supporting documentation (EDF and GEO\_MAP), and the EDF and GEO\_MAP files for the soil gas sampling event conducted on October 1, 2018. Please review the case file and submit missing documents to GeoTracker.

ACDEH requests submittal of the appropriate documents not on the GeoTracker site by the date specified below. Please notify ACDEH of the submittals by providing your list of submittals to our agency, Attention: Keith Nowell, via electronic mail.

#### **REPORT & DELIVERABLE REQUESTS**

**SECTION: ACDEH Procedures** 

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

#### Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

### Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

### **ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS**

A complete report submittal includes the PDF report and all associated electronic data files, including but not limited to GEO\_MAP, GEO\_XY, GEO\_Z, GEO\_BORE, GEO\_WELL, and laboratory analytical data in Electronic Deliverable Format™ (EDF). Additional information on these requirements is available on the State Water Board's website (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water\_issues/programs/ust/electronic\_submittal/)

- Do not upload draft reports to GeoTracker
- Rotate each page in the PDF document in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.

Each report submittal is to include a GeoTracker Upload Summary Table with GeoTracker valid values<sup>1</sup> as illustrated in the example below to facilitate ACDEH review and verify compliance with GeoTracker requirements.

This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

#### PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. #### AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
