Hello Keith:

I want to give you an update on the drilling project at Quik Stop # 51, located at 3130 35th Street in Oakland. Yesterday, we encountered very hard drilling conditions at the site. We did two borings on the west side of the site to 20-22 feet and encountered some dense clayey sand with rocky material that Geoprobe had a hard time getting through. No groundwater was encountered at these depths. There was some petroleum odor in the soil samples collected at 15 feet in each hole. I collected a total of 6 soil samples and will submit those to the laboratory. The driller did a job up the street at the gas mart and had to go to 40 feet for water. I need to upgrade to an auger rig to get to groundwater. Cascade has a rig available on July 5th and 6th. I have rescheduled for those dates. Let me know if you have any questions.
