Hello Mark, we are scheduled to begin the drilling/sampling at 914 W. Grand tomorrow morning. The field work should be completed by Friday. With respect to the TPH diesel/oil analyses for soil, we would like to propose running all the analyses first without silica gel cleanup. Any sample that has a detection exceeding Tier 1 ESLs would then be analyzed for TPH diesel/oil with silica gel cleanup. Because of the number of samples being analyzed, the cost to run all of the analyses with and without silica gel cleanup is substantial.
