Dear Mr. Smith:

We are in receipt of your correspondence of 4 November 1990 regarding the subject workplan. This letter addresses your 4 November 1990 comments.

- 1. Metals Analysis As requested, analyses for metals (Cd, Cr, Pb, Zn, and Ni) will be added to the analytical suite for soil samples collected during installation of the monitoring well downgradient of the waste oil tank excavation. If elevated concentrations of metals are measured in the soil, groundwater from the well will also be analyzed for the metals.
- 2. <u>Direction of Groundwater Gradient</u> Your attention is directed to page 3 of the workplan, which describes installation of piezometers and gradient measurement during phase 2 of the work (prior to well installation). On the basis of piezometer measurements, the monitoring wells will be positioned in the downgradient direction from each excavation. The well locations depicted in Figure 3 represent our current estimate, but not final locations.
- 3. Reevaluation of Monitoring at Completion of 1 Year As requested the last quarterly monitoring report will contain an evaluation of the sufficiency of the collected data, and the need/non-need for future monitoring.
- 4. <u>Disposition of Excavated Soil</u> Because excavation is not complete and the quantity of soil and types of contaminants have not been identified, a decision has not been made regarding disposition of contaminated soil. If soil is transported off-site under manifest, copies will be provided to your office as requested.

We hope these explanations and clarifications to the subject workplan address your comments. Cademartori Trucking will await your approval prior to beginning the work. Please contact me if you have any questions.
