Hi Scott. District Engineer Bennett Cruz and I were there today for a double check.

The drain in the parking lot area (your 3rd picture down) ties in with the roof drains over the fuel island, on to the box by the light pole and on to the storm drain. I verified it by observing water flow into the drain and then seeing the flow in the storm drain along W. A Street.

The fuel island drain goes to OLSD sewer and was permitted by OLSD. I advised Mr. Khandahri there are certain requirements for catch basin / fossil filter maintenance and I am working with him on the media requirements.
