On behalf of ConocoPhillips (COP) Delta Consultants (Delta) is submitting this Proposed Borings Addendum Letter to address current issues at the above referenced site that resulted from our August 13, 2009 onsite meeting. This letter is an addendum to the past planned proposal locations.

During our onsite meeting with Terry Grayson (COP), and Tony Garver (Gregg Drilling), we discussed the numerous sub-surface and physical hazards at the site and the difficulty in placing the truck that contains the CPT unit. We proposed to place the borings onsite. The onsite placement would still yield information as to whether petroleum hydrocarbons were migrating offsite.

Delta proposes to perform a minimum of five onsite CPT/Geoprobe/Hydropunch borings to at least 50 feet below grade and install two monitoring wells (Figure 2). One proposed boring (B-20) would be placed onsite on the eastern side of the site along Quigley Street, three proposed borings (B-17, B-18, B-19) placed onsite along 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue, and one proposed boring (B-21) along the southwest property line. Two monitoring wells (MW-4, MW-4A) are proposed to be installed in the vicinity of boring B-21 once the results of the CPT are received and analyzed.
