Mark,

The City of Emeryville lost our encroachment permit application for the soil borings proposed in our "Additional Site Characterization Workplan Addendum" dated July 31, 2012 for the former McGrath Steel site at 6655 Hollis Street, Emeryville, ACEH Case # RO0000063. Therefore, we need to resubmit the permit application, which will delay our drilling by at least a couple weeks. We are tentatively re-scheduling our drilling for January 17 and 18, 2013 assuming the encroachment permit is approved by then.

According to your letter of November 8, 2012 approving our workplan addendum, you wanted the "Soil and Groundwater Data Packet Submittal and Work Plan Addendum" containing results of the initial Geoprobe soil boring investigation and proposed monitoring well locations to be submitted by January 11, 2013. Because of the delay in obtaining the encroachment permit from City of Emeryville, we request that the deadline for submittal be extended to February 22, 2013.

The 4th Quarter 2012 groundwater monitoring report for this site will still be submitted by January 11, 2013 as requested.
