#### Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

- 1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."
- 2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."
- 3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."
- 4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

ACEH has named the responsible parties for this site as detailed below.

Existence of Unauthorized Release

In October 2000, the underground storage tanks were removed. Holes, odor, stained soil and discolored water were observed during the tank removal. A Phase II site assessment conducted in July 2000 revealed maximum concentrations of 620 micrograms per liter (ug/L) total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHg) in groundwater from boring AEI-3. 380 ug/L TPH as diesel (TPHd) was detected in boring AEI-2.

Responsible Party Identification

Lonnie and Rita Robinson purchased the property in November 1966. They also owned and operated the underground storage tanks. Lonnie and Rita Robinson meets the definition of a responsible party for the site because they had control over an underground storage tank at the time or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4) and they owned the property where an unauthorized release occurred, (Definition 3).
