Work Plan Amendments Hydrocarbon Contamination Assessment Connell Oldsmobile 3093 Broadway Oakland, California

Dear Mr. Wistar:

Subsurface Consultants, Inc (SCI) has been authorized to implement a hydrocarbon contamination study at the referenced facility. The study will be performed in general accordance with our work plan dated March 19, 1990. However, based on your initial comments and our further review of hydrogeologic information, we believe the following modifications are necessary:

- 1. The field work will include drilling 7 test borings, 2 of which will be completed as groundwater monitoring wells. Previously, the wells were to be installed adjacent to the tank excavation. Based upon gradient information provided by Levine-Fricke for the Broadway Medical Plaza project (across the street from the study site) and in consideration of city restrictions regarding the placement of monitoring wells within the sidewalk areas, we are proposing to install the wells inside the service building at the locations shown on the Site Plan, Plate 1.
- 2. Monitoring wells will be installed in accordance with Regional Water Quality Control Board guidelines. Specific well details will be determined in the field based upon subsurface conditions encountered during drilling. Hydrogeologic information generated by Levine-Fricks indicate that the water bearing zone is situated sould be feet below the sidewalk grade and consists of interbedded layers of said; sandy silt, clayey sands and silty clays with varying quantities of said and gravel. From a preliminary basis we propose that the screen sections of the

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wells only extend 5 feet below the water table to reduce that risk of cross-contamination between the interbedded deposits.

- 3. We will provide the owner with conclusions regarding the following at the completion of our study:
 - a. Soil and groundwater conditions,
 - b. Groundwater gradient and flow direction,
 - c. The presence of TEH, TVH, TOG and BTXE in the water and soil samples analyzed,
 - d. The significance of contaminant levels with respect to state and local regulatory criteria, and
 - e. The scope of future investigation/monitoring, if required.

A report concerning on-site treatment and disposal options for the waste pile on the parking lot which is derived from the excavation pit is currently underway and should be available in about 30 to 45 days.

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

PROCEDURE FOR PERMITS FOR GROUND-WATER MONITORING WELLS LOCATED WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OFTWAY

1.	The following items should be submitted to the Plan Check/Engineering counter, 1330 Broadway, 2nd Floor:
	A letter from the property owner, or tenant with the property owner's written authorization to act on his behalf, requesting an encroachment permit. Address the letter to: Terry E. Roberts Note: Cousulful owner owner.
	A dimensioned scale drawing (on 8 1/2" \times 11" paper) showing the location of the wells. The drawing should show property lines, curbs, and traffic striping on the street.
	No walls are allowed in the sidewalk area. Wells, preferably, should be located in the parking lane, away from traffic lanes, to minimize traffic disruption.
	Fee for minor encroachment permit: \$195:00 450.
	A copy of the owner's Grant Deed with legal description.
П	Detailed denuise of well eaven and meeting

2. The Department of Public Works will review the above items and prepare a Minor Encroachment Permit and Agreement and submit it to the owner. The property owner will then return this Permit with a notarized signature. The Permit will be signed by the appropriate City officials, and recorded with the County Recorder.

Insurance Certificate (see attached description).

- 3. Once the encroachment permit has been recorded, the <u>drilling contractor</u> can apply for an excavation permit at the Development Services permit counter. This permit will cost \$20,000 per excavation. A group of wells along one street is usually counted as a single excavation. If the wells are placed on two streets (eg. around a corner gas station), two excavation permits will be required. If the drilling contractor has all the standard information on file (city business license, contractor's license, proof of worker's compensation insurance) the excavation permit can be issued immediately.
- 4. When the time comes to close the monitoring well, another excavation permit will be required. A copy of the data obtained from the well, along with an as-built drawing of the well location, shall be sent to the City engineer that processed the original encroachment permit.

_SIGNDARD_INSURANCE_BEQUIREMENTS_ ENCROACHMENT PERMITS

The following paragraph is a statement of standard insurance coverage required by the City of Dakland when granting an encroachment permit:

"That the permittee shall maintain in force and effect at all times that said encroachment occupies said public sidewalk area, good and sufficient public liability insurance in the amount of \$300,000 and property damage insurance in the amount of \$50,000, both including contractual liability, insuring the City of Dakland, its officers and employees, against any and all claims arising out of the existence of said encroachment in said sidewalk area; and that a certificate of such insurance, and subsequent notices of the renewal therof, shall be filled with the Director of Public Works of the City of Dakland; and that such certificate shall state that the said insurance coverage shall not be cancelled or be permitted to lapse without thirty (30) days prior written notice to said Director of Public Works.

Please note that it includes:

- 1. Public liability: \$300,000 each occurance.
- 2. Property damage: 50,000 each occurance.
- 3. Contractual liability for 1 & 2 above.
- 4. Thirty (30) days' notice of cancellation.
- 5. Additionly insured: The City of Dakland, its officers & Employees.

The foregoing endorsements and the following endorsement must be specified in the Certificate of Insurance:

"Notwithstanding any other provisions in this policy, the insurance afforded hereunder to the City of Oakland shall be primary as to any other insurance or reinsurance covering or available to the City of Oakland, and such other insurance or reinsurance shall not be required to contribute to any liability or loss until and unless the appropriate limit of liability afforded hereunder is exhausted."
