Please see the email below from the stockpile facility that verifies they are not certified to conduct soil contamination remediation.

Regarding your other questions -

- 2) Does the fill material contain any construction debris, concrete, or asphalt? The soil I sampled was a sandy silt material and free of any debris. I will be onsite during import activities to verify all of the material is consistent.

Were the samples submitted for analysis collected as discrete samples or were they composite samples? The samples were collected as discreet samples.

Lastly, I request that the samples also be analyzed for polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons using EPA Method 8270 in selective ion monitoring mode. I have requested the lab complete this analysis by Friday PM or Monday AM and will forward on the results to you as soon as they come in.
