Woe is me. The USTCF rejected the Holland app for a second time. They rejected b/c Holland didn't satisfy the criteria for the permit waiver. You probably already know, but I'll jot it here all the same:

As I understand it, the Holland site was visited by the ACDEH back in the spring of 1989. This was around the time of Holland Sr.'s death. The site was in disrepair. ACDEH instructed Holland to remove site debris, and also noted that there was no record of the underground tanks having permits. Ann Marie commissioned an environmental firm to complete facility demo and cleanup work in late '89, but did not file an application for permits until February of 1990.

The Permit Waiver rule says that if an RP knew of a permit requirement before January 1990 they must have complied by this time. The ACDEH letter and Holland's response to what it directed shows Holland knew before 1990. That they got the paperwork in a month later than the January deadline (established, I should note, many years later) complicates matters, as the Fund has determined that in order to comply an RP in the know must come into compliance by January 1990.

Two things I don't know - 1) if this rule by the USTCF is a hard and fast one (under the circumstances it would seem that an exception might be reasonable) and 2) whether the tanks were permitted when they were in operation (in 1989 they were idle and had been for some time). I do not know how complete County files are now/were in 1990 with respect to historic permit documentation. I have experienced mixed success when hunting for historic documents in agency files (or my own files for that matter).

I have a request in to David Charter at the USTCF for clarification. Acceptance into the Fund is a pretty important issue for us. I'm trying to get the answer as quickly as possible so as to be able to get into the field and get the testing underway.

One note of further apparent (though not real) complication. Today is my last day at TPL. I will continue working with Tim Wirth, the TPL project manager, as a consultant, and intend to not miss a beat with regard to what we're doing at Holland. Contact info, though, will change:

Your claim has been found to be ineligible for placement on the Priority List for the following reason:

Section 25284(a)(1) of the H&SC reads, in part:

"...no person shall own or operate an underground storage tank unless a permit for its operation has been issued by the local agency..."

Section 25299.57(d)(3)(A) of the HS&C reads, in part:

"...the claimant has complied with...the permit requirements of the chapter 6.7 (commencing with Section 25280)

Section 25299.579(d)(3)(B) of the H&SC reads, in part:

- "All claimants who file their claim on or after January 1, 1994...and who did not obtain or apply for any permit required by subdivision (a) of Section 25284 by January 1, 1990, shall be subject to subparagraph (A) regardless of the reason or reasons that the permit was not obtained or applied for. However, on and after January 1, 1994, the board may waive the provisions of subparagraph (A) as a condition for payment from the fund if the board finds all of the following:
  - (i) The claimant was unaware of the permit requirement prior to January 1, 1990, and there was no intent to intentionally avoid the permit requirement or the fees associated with the permit.
  - (ii) Prior to submittal of the application to the Fund, the claimant complied with Section 25299.31 and has obtained and paid for all permits currently required by this paragraph.

(iii) Prior to submittal of the application to the Fund, the claimant has paid all fees, interest, and penalties imposed pursuant to Article 5 (commencing with Section 25299.40) and Part 26 (commencing with Section 50101) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code for the underground storage tank that is subject of the claim.

# **Background**

On May 24, 1989, a letter from Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) informed you a site inspection was performed on April 21, 1989. At that time, four split soil samples were taken above two of your diesel USTs (5,000 and 6,000 gallon). Diesel was detected in the soil from both sites with high concentrations of contamination. In addition, your eight UST's were not permitted. Thus you were in violation of Section 25284(a), Chapter 6.7 of the H&SC. ACEH's letter required you to prepare a plan of correction including registering the USTs within thirty (30) days of the receipt of their letter.

On February 1990, you completed the State of California Form A & B to permit the eight USTs. There are no other records of permits until you completed the UST Permit Application to remove the USTs in 1998.

On December 1990, ACEH concurred with your consultant at the time, Crosby and Overton that additional investigation is warranted at the site. ACEH requested you to submit a work plan with in thirty (30) days of the receipt of their letter.

On September 9, 1998, ACEH observed the removal of the USTs. After the removal of the USTs, contamination was present. As stated above, ACEH required additional site investigation.

On June 12, 2006, you submitted a claim application to the Fund. Included as supporting documentation, Clearwater Group provided a narrative of the site investigation. On November 27, 2006, the Fund received a correspondence from ACEH stating that your site was out of compliance. Currently, the Fund has not been informed if you have come back into compliance.

One of the statutory conditions for eligibility to the Fund is compliance with the requirement to obtain the permit specified in Section 25284 of the H&SC. The requirement to obtain this permit has been in effect since January 1, 1984. Under certain circumstances, for a claimant who owned or operated the eligible UST prior to 1990, the State Water Board may waive the permit requirement as a condition for eligibility to the Fund.

With regard to the waiver, Section 25299.57(d)(3)(B) specifically states that all claimants who file their claim after January 1, 1994, and did not apply for a permit by

January 1, 1990, are subject to the permit requirement regardless of the reason why the permit was not obtained. However, the requirement may be waived if the claimant was unaware of the permit requirement prior to January 1, 1990. UST laws, including the permit requirements, became effective January 1, 1984. The waiver criteria can be applied to permit requirements that were applicable prior to January 1, 1990. There was no intent to allow UST owners and operators to be eligible for reimbursement from the Fund where they still had not obtained legally required UST permits several years after the requirement to obtain a permit became law. The waiver is only applicable for permits required prior to January 1, 1990.

Because you did not obtain the required permit until after the compliance date of January 1, 1990, you do not meet the criteria for the Permit Waiver; for that reason, the Permit Waiver will not be granted. Furthermore, it is unknown how long the USTs were unpermitted until their removal in 1998. For these reasons, your claim is ineligible for placement on the Priority List.

NOTE: The following sections cited are excerpted from the Underground Storage of Hazardous Substances, California Health & Safety Code (H&SC), Division 20, Chapter 6.7. or Petroleum Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund Statutes, H&SC, Division 20, Chapter 6.75.

If you disagree with this Staff Decision, you may appeal to the Fund Manager pursuant to Section 2814 of the *Petroleum Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund Regulations*. If you would like review of the decision by the Fund Manager, please submit your request along with any additional documentation to:

If you do not request a review by the Fund Manager within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of this letter, the Staff Decision will then become final and conclusive.



Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has received a request for a time extension for submittal of a report for the above-referenced site provided (please see attached electronic mail message from Jessica Moreno of Clearwater Group, dated February 28, 2006). In correspondence dated October 28, 2005, ACEH provided technical comments on a March 3, 2003 Work Plan, and requested that the technical comments be addressed, the work be implemented, and a Soil and Groundwater Investigation report be submitted by March 23, 2006. The February 28, 2006 electronic mail message requests that, "an extension be granted to this deadline so that funding may be secured for the required corrective action." The February 28, 2006 request also proposes the preparation of a Work Plan Addendum to address ACEH's technical comments.

ACEH finds that the submittal of a Work Plan Addendum is acceptable. Therefore, ACEH has revised the schedule to incorporate a Work Plan Addendum. The incorporation of a Work Plan Addendum also extends the schedule for completion of the site investigation and submittal of a Soil and Groundwater Investigation Report. However, making the submittal of a Work Plan Addendum conditional upon claim acceptance by the Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund is not acceptable. ACEH's October 18, 2005 correspondence provided specific technical comments that can be readily addressed without extensive effort. The Work Plan Addendum is to be submitted by March 23, 2006, as requested below.

I wanted to give you an update to the progress that we have made towards the USTCF application submittal for the Holland Oil project. For the last month Ann Marie and her lawyer Mr. Edward Martins have been trying to piece together the IRS returns that would be needed to support a Priority B claim assignment. There of course have been some issues with the estate taxes. The current CPA working on the project was preparing to go to the IRS to request the tax returns for the estate for the years of record, which is about 19 years. Mr. Martins had me call the Fund yesterday to confirm that they would require all 19 years as stated on the Chart of Required Federal Tax Returns.

I spoke with Ms. Sheri Kneriem, claims reviewer, at the Fund. I relayed to her the road blocks regarding the tax returns and she suggested that we forgo requesting a Priority B assignment for a Priority C, even though Ann Marie has never had either part-time or full time employees. Though the Priority B assignment is more desirable, a Priority C does not require the extensive tax return documentation. I have discussed this option with Mr. Martins and he has agreed, on behalf of Ann Marie, that it would be prudent to submit the application and receive a Priority C assignment now, so that there will be funding to move forward with the required Corrective Action. Per Sheri Kneriem, once they have obtained the required tax documentation they may appeal the Priority C assignment for the more desirable Priority B assignment.

Clearwater Group will be finalizing the application this week based on the Priority Class C requirements. It will then be forwarded to Ann Marie and Mr. Martins for the appropriate signatures. Since Ann Marie has difficulty getting around, we will more than likely hand deliver the application to her and then follow up with her lawyer then Fed-ex it directly to the Fund. Clearwater is ready to move forward with the Corrective Action work on a "wait and pay" basis as soon as we receive documentation from the Fund that the claim has been accepted and is eligible for active reimbursement.

With this being said, I do not think that we are in a position to meet the March 23, 2006 report deadline. We respectfully request that an extension be granted to this deadline so that funding may be secured for the required corrective action. Once Clearwater has been notified of the claim's acceptance by the Fund we will prepare an addendum to the March 13, 2003 EBS Workplan and submit it to your office for review and approval within 45 days. The purpose of the workplan addendum will be to address the technical comments outlined in your October 28, 2005 letter. With your approval of the Workplan Addendum we request that a new deadline be set for the submittal of the Soil and Groundwater Investigation Plan noting that the submittal of the Corrective Action Plan would follow in 60 days.

If you would like, Clearwater is prepared to submit a monthly status report to your office until notice has been received from the Fund. Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the fuel leak case file for the subject site and the document entitled, "Work Plan: Additional Subsurface Investigation Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation," dated March 3, 2003 and prepared by Environmental Bio-systems, Inc. The Work Plan presents plans for an additional subsurface investigation of the above-referenced site to include soil borings and monitoring well installation.

ACEH concurs with the proposed scope of work provided that the technical comments below are fully addressed. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the reports described below.

#### TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Proposed Soil Boring Locations. ACEH concurs with the proposed boring locations but requests that borings be added in the western (downgradient) portion of the site. In order to assess the extent of soil contamination near the western boundary of the site and to assess potential groundwater contamination moving off-site, a transect of direct push borings is to be located near the western property boundary. Please include one additional boring between proposed locations SC54 and SC50, one additional boring between proposed locations SC50 and SC55, and one additional boring south of proposed location SC55. Please submit a revised map of proposed sampling locations for ACEH approval prior to field activities.
- 2. Laboratory Analysis of Soil Samples. The Work Plan indicates, "at least one soil sample will be submitted for laboratory analyses from each borehole just above the soil/groundwater interface." ACEH requests that soil samples collected from depths of 2 feet bgs, 5 feet bgs, and the capillary fringe be submitted for laboratory analyses. In addition, ACEH requests that soil samples be submitted for laboratory analyses for all depth intervals where staining, odor, or elevated PID readings are observed. If staining, odor, or elevated PID readings are observed over an interval of several feet, a sufficient number of soil samples from this interval should be submitted for laboratory analyses to characterize the contamination within this

interval. Please include results in the Soil and Groundwater Investigation Report requested below.

- 3. Grab Groundwater Samples in Direct Push Soil Borings. The Work Plan is not clear regarding the collection of grab groundwater samples from direct push soil borings. Section 5.1 entitled "Drilling" states that "Eleven direct push technology (DPT) soil and groundwater samples will be collected designated SC45 to SC55." However, there is no description of the method for groundwater sampling from DPT borings in the remainder of the Work Plan. ACEH requests that grab groundwater samples be collected within 5 feet of the water table from each direct push soil boring. Please submit a description of the proposed method for grab groundwater sampling for ACEH approval prior to field activities.
- 4. Vertical Delineation. The Work Plan does not include a scope of work to characterize the vertical extent of contamination. ACEH requests that, at a minimum, three borings be extended to a depth of approximately 40 feet below ground surface to characterize the vertical extent of soil and groundwater contamination. Please propose at least two locations within areas of known shallow contamination and one location within the western portion of the site. Soils are to be continuously sampled and logged to assess the vertical extent of contamination. The soil boring logs are to be used to target coarse-grained layers below the water table for depth-discrete groundwater sampling. Each coarse-grained layer that may represent a significant contaminant migration pathway is to be targeted for depth-discrete Depth-discrete groundwater samples are to be collected in a groundwater sampling. boring(s) adjacent to the logged soil boring using techniques that will prevent crosscontamination of separate water-bearing zones and contamination of the depth-discrete groundwater sample by contaminated groundwater from a shallower interval. Please present the proposed locations for vertical delineation on the revised sample location map requested in technical comment 1 and submit a description of the proposed method for depth-discrete groundwater sampling for ACEH approval prior to field activities.
- 5. Monitoring Well Installation. ACEH concurs with the proposed installation of monitoring wells MW-6 and MW-7. However, the screened intervals for these wells are not to exceed 10 feet in length. The need to install monitoring wells MW-8 through MW-10 will be evaluated based upon the results of grab groundwater sampling along the western boundary of the property.
- 6. Laboratory Analyses. Due to potentially higher turbidity, ACEH does not recommend that grab groundwater samples be analyzed for PCBs, SVOCs, or total oil and grease. Please include 1,2-dichloroethane and ethylene dibromide as analytes for soil and groundwater samples. Please include lead as an analyte for soil samples. Please provide a revised summary of planned analytes for soil and groundwater samples for ACEH approval prior to field activities.
- 7. **Groundwater Monitoring.** Following implementation of the proposed subsurface characterization, quarterly groundwater monitoring will be required for this site.

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

Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. (EBS) is please to respond on behalf of Ms. Anne Marie Holland and her attorney, Mr. Edward E. Martins to recent letter dated December 13, 2004 from Ms. Alyce Sanbach, Alameda County District Attorney's Office. EBS has been involved with the technical portion of this project for several years.

#### **ACTIVITY REPORT**

At the written request of the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (DEH), EBS submitted a workplan on March 3, 2004 regarding a request for additional work on the site. EBS concurred that additional investigation and remedial action is required on the property. The workplan was submitted to Mr. Scott Seery at his request on March 3, 2003. EBS has not heard anything from the DEH regarding that submittal. EBS is prepared to perform the tasks described in the workplan as part of a large subsurface investigation to characterize the shallow soil and groundwater so that remedial measures can be evaluated and implemented.

Since the time that EBS submitted the workplan to the DEH, Ms. Anne Marie Holland, as represented by counsel, has been in negotiations with the Hayward Area Recreation District for the purchase of the property to turn the property into a local park. The Trust for Public Land is helping to facilitate the purchase. Although there are public grants that have been applied for, on-going purchase discussions, and options on the property, the actual sale may be off by six months. Sale details should be obtained from Mr. Martins.

Therefore, EBS will be glad to discuss the proposed project with you on January 3, 2004 by telephone. I would appreciate any comments on the submitted workplan, which has still not been approved or rejected by the DEH. I would be glad to make sure that the work proposed meets your requirements to move the project forward. I did have similar discussions and correspondence with the previous regulator. EBS developed the current workplan to meet those technical objectives. Unfortunately, for whatever reason, neither EBS nor the client has ever heard back from the DEH on the status of the submitted workplan.







Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. (EBS) is please to respond to your recent telephone call regarding the EBS Workplan submitted to you in early March 3, 2003. Based on comments from your May 6, 2002 letter, which was not available to me at the time, I have comments or updates as follows:

The EBS Workplan was designed to define the vertical and lateral extent of contamination so that a Corrective Action Plan for remediation can be developed. At this point, the extent of contamination is still uncertain.

#### AREAS OF INVESTIGATION:

As you had requested in the May 6, 2002 letter, future work would encompass, among other areas, investigation into the following areas:

Building A:

EBS proposes to have two borings (SC51 and SC52) in this area, in front of the warehouse area where contaminated soil may overlie a now buried concrete loading area.

Western portion of the site, between building A and area C:

EBS proposes three borings on the western side - one boring on site (SC50) and two borings off-site at the Edendale School property (SC55 and SC 54).

Eastern portion of the site, east of areas A and B:

EBS proposed two borings/wells SC56 and SC57, to be converted into monitoring wells MW6 and MW7, respectively. In addition, 3 borings further east of SC56 and SC57 are planned: SC45, SC46 and SC47. EBS also proposed a boring south of SC7 which is located on the ball park (SC48).

EBS proposed two borings, SC49 and SC53 in the used car lot area.

COMMENTS: The EBS Workplan of March 3, 2003 seems to have addressed the future work as outlined in your letter dated May 6, 2002.

The purpose of this next phase of investigation is to define the vertical and lateral extents of contamination.

#### LABORATORY ANALYSIS:

EBS recommends limiting the analysis to the main hydrocarbons. However, due to the impacts from PCBs in SC9, SC11, SC13 and SC14, EBS concurs with your letter, samples from proposed borings SC45, SC46, SC47, and SC49 should be analyzed for PCBs. In addition, SC51, SC52 and SC55 should also be analyzed for PCBs. MW-4 should also be analyzed for PCBs. Soil samples will be collected at selected depths or composited within each borehole to save funds.

Since the sample from MW5 contained MTBE, EBS concurs that soil samples collected nearby (SC53 and SC54) should also be analyzed for MTBE.

Since VOCs were found in a few soil samples collected from select locations, none appear to exceed the 2001 RWQCB residential RBSLs, therefore, unless EBS finds an exceptional reason to analyze for VOCs, additional analysis will not be recommended.

SVOCs will be analysed in SC45, SC46, SC47, SC51 and SC52 as these seem closest to the former ASTs or near impacted soil left on site.

COMMENTS: EBS concurs with the letter of May 6, 2002 and will add the above mentioned analyses to the Workplan dated March 3, 2003.

#### **UPDATED LOCATIONS:**

EBS proposes to update the locations of borings SC45, and SC46 by moving them to the east-southeast by 20 to 30 feet. At their currently mapped location in the Workplan, it is thought that the zero-contamination line will likely be located further east-southeast of the originally proposed locations.

EBS has designed the program to characterize the soils and groundwater prior to developing a site-wide corrective action plan (CAP). This characterization will allow for a better understanding of the vertical and lateral extent of contamination so that the volume of impacted soil and groundwater can be better quantified.

There are three borings proposed to be drilled off-site. EBS may request your help in securing permission to put one boring on the ball field, and two on the school yard of Edendale School. I request that we drill on the school yard at a time when students are not there, given the noise and distraction of a drilling rig. If your inspection of our work is required, please let me know your availability regarding the drilling at an off-time.





This office is in receipt and has completed review of the May 4, 2001 Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. (EBS) Subsurface Exploration and Monitoring Well Installation report. This report documents the reported installation of 44 continuously-cored soil borings and two monitoring wells, designated MW-4 and MW-5. A reported 131 soil samples were collected during this effort from discrete depths between 2 and 9' below grade (bg). Selected soil samples from various sub-areas of the site, and water samples from the completed and existing wells, were analyzed for a specific range of petroleum hydrocarbon compounds, metals, volatile organic compounds (VOC), and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB), as determined by the sub-area from which the samples were collected. We understand that several of the borings emplaced in the D and E sub-areas were advanced through materials previously removed from the underground storage tank (UST) excavations during the September 1998 tank removals. This material was placed back into the resultant excavations at that time to mitigate safety and soil disposal concerns

## Review of the cited EBS report reveals the following:

- Soil in <u>each</u> sub-area is impacted by a range of petroleum hydrocarbons to depth explored at concentrations that exceed 2001 Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) surface soil (≤3m bg) Risk-Based Screening Levels (RBSL) for residential land use
- PCBs were found in soil samples collected from borings SC-9, -11, -13 and -14, and MW-4 at depths of 2 feet (SC-13), 5 feet (SC-14, MW-4), and 9 feet (SC-9, -11)
- PCBs were found at concentrations that exceed RWQCB residential RBSLs in borings SC-11, -14 and MW-4
- PCBs were not sought in each location where analyses selection criteria were otherwise met
- SVOCs were not sought in any samples where such analysis was warranted, contrary to workplan scope
- VOCs were found in a few soil samples collected from select locations, but none appear to exceed 2001 RWQCB residential RBSLs
- Hydrocarbon "sheen" was noted on water collected from well MW-1
- Methyl tert-butyl ether (MtBE) was tentatively identified (EPA 8020) in water sampled from well MW-5
- Encountered shallow sediments (≤3 m bg) are comprised primarily of silts and clays

The body of work completed to date, up to and including the cited EBS report, has shown the subject site to be significantly impacted in the known source areas by historic activities that have occurred there. Additional assessment work is needed to evaluate the entire site in preparation for site redevelopment. This work would expand the scope of past work to areas outside the presently-known source areas, and to revisit areas of the site previously investigated, but where specific analyses were not performed (e.g., SVOC, PCB).

Such future work would encompass, among others, the following additional areas:

- Building A
- Western portion of the site, between building A and area C
- Eastern portion of the site, east of areas A and B
- Used car lots fronting along East 14th Street

This office understands that the Alameda County Community Development Agency (ACCDA) has identified the subject property as being within a mixed-use (residential/commercial-retail) redevelopment area. Consequently, this office intends to apply residential cleanup standards (i.e., 2001 RWQCB RBSLs) when evaluating cleanup proposals and redevelopment plans. We also understand that ACCDA is in receipt of a grant through the Brownfields Economic Redevelopment Initiative (BERI), administered by Region IX of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. We have been informed that the subject site is eligible to receive BERI funds to help facilitate further assessment and clean-up at this site. However,



In response to a telephone conversation with Mr. Scott Seery of Alameda County regarding the Holland property, located at 16301 E. 14th Street in San Leandro, Alameda County, California, Compliance & Closure, Inc. (CCI) proposes to prepare a work plan to that addresses resampling some of the "Hot Spots" reported in Environmental Bio-Systems May 2001 Subsurface Investigation and Monitoring Well Installation report. CCI's proposal will include resampling of the areas located just east of Building A, the area southwest of building C and the area southwest and northwest of Building B to verify the contaminant levels previously reported in these areas. These three areas were reported to contain high concentrations of soil contamination to depths of 12 feet. CCI will propose to use a Geoprobe direct push rig to collect soil samples from depth intervals of 2, 5 and between 8 to 12 feet. Grab water samples will also be collected.

The Alameda County Redevelopment Agency is in receipt of a grant through the Brownfields Economic Redevelopment Initiative administered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Region IX. Brownfields being defined as, "abandoned or underutilized industrial or commercial areas where redevelopment of such property is complicated by real or perceived environmental contamination." Allowable activities under this grant include conducting Phase II environmental assessments on privately owned potential brownfields properties and creating clean-up plans for such sites. We can also utilize the funds to provide initial site evaluation by private environmental consultants, legal consulting and market analysis consulting services.

The five properties which make up what the Redevelopment Agency has called the "Holland Oil" site are eligible properties for this type of assistance. The Redevelopment Agency would prioritize these properties for utilization of the remaining funds available for Phase II assessments. There is approximately \$80,000.00 available for these services and the Agency has offered to your client, Ann Marie Holland, and Barbara Holland to use these funds to pay for the additional Well Boring and testing which the Alameda County Department of Public Health is requiring. According to our contract with the Environmental Protection Agency, we need to spend the remaining grant funds by September 2002.

It is my understanding that Scott Seery with the Department of Public Health will submit a memorandum to the real property owners of the Holland Oil site outlining the additional testing which needs to be completed. The Redevelopment Agency will need this scope of work from Mr. Seery in order to determine the cost of the work and contract with a consulting firm to complete it.

We will need written approval from the current property owner in order for us to proceed. This written approval should be obtained in a Memorandum of Understanding between both owners and the Redevelopment Agency with a final scope of work attached. Accepting the grant funds does not waive any of their rights as property owners, however, the intent of the grant is to use the funds on sites that have development potential and where the ultimate goal is clean-up and development of the site. We would impress upon the owners that once the studies are completed, that they make a best faith effort to either sell or develop the property to a use that

is consistent with the Specific Plan for the area.



This is to memorialize our meeting of May 10th, which was attended by Ms. Crisp, Ms. Ana Marie Holland Tiers, Mr. Martins, Mr. Reiland, and the undersigned.

At the meeting, Mr. Martins indicated that the Estate would be unable to provide the report requested by the County by the close of business on May 10, 2001. In a letter dated April 19, 2001, the County, through Mr. Seery, had directed that, by May 10, 2001, the Estate submit a technical report pursuant to California Water Code section 132167(b) regarding the proposed remediation of the above-referenced site. This office is concerned by the failure of the Estate to provide the requested reports.

In order to assist the remediation process and to keep the Estate from falling out of compliance with U.S.T. cleanup requirements, Ms. Crisp said that her client would be willing to execute a stipulation allowing the release of some Estate monies for the purpose of paying the contractor for the report. Mr. Martins indicated that if these monies were released, the report would probably be available by May 21st, when this matter is next on calendar in Department 705.

Given Mr. Martins' indication, this office is willing to forbear from enforcing the May 10th deadline until May 24, 2001. We request that the Executrix keep both Mr. Seery and the undersigned informed of the status of the report. If the report does not reach Mr. Seery by the 24th, this office will consider taking formal enforcement action against the Estate.

I have reviewed your request, received on July 21, 2000, for pre-approval of corrective action costs. I have included a copy of the "Cost Pre-Approval Request" form; please use this form in the future for requesting pre-approval of corrective action costs.

With the following provisions, the total cost pre-approved as eligible for reimbursement for completing the November 18, 1999, Environmental Bio-Systems (EBS) work plan approved by the Alameda County EHD (County) in their March 1, 2000 letter, is \$18,595; see the table below for a breakdown of costs.

Be aware that this pre-approval does not necessarily constitute a decision on reimbursement: reasonable and necessary (as determined by the Fund) corrective action costs for work directed and approved by the County will be eligible for reimbursement at costs consistent with those pre-approved in this letter. However, depending on what happens in the field, some costs may not actually be necessary. If the Fund agrees that they were in fact necessary, the Fund will reimburse at reasonable rates (consistent with those pre-approved.)

In an effort to expedite future reimbursement requests associated with the implementation of the corrective action tasks pre-approved in this letter, we ask that the attached 'Pre-Approval Specific Reimbursement Request Form' be completed, updated and submitted with each reimbursement request. All relevant supporting documentation must also be included with each reimbursement request.

In order for future corrective action costs to be part of the expedited reimbursement process, they must be pre-approved in writing by Fund staff.

All corrective action costs must meet the requirements of Article 11, Chapter 16, Underground Storage Tank Regulations in order to be eligible for reimbursement.

I am in receipt of your correspondence to me dated May 15, 2000. I would like to respond to your queries, and add some comments.

You state "the scope of work appears excessive (44 borings?)...". The scope of work was precisely tailored to the mandate of the lead oversight program (Alameda County Health Care Services Agency). I have attached a copy of their March 15, 1999 directive. On page 2 of this document, the County states that a sample points shall be placed using a grid system with approximate 20' centers are less, in each of 5 target areas. This equates to approximately 44 borings.

The number of soil samples (three from each boring) and the target compounds are also stipulated in the County's March 15, 1999 and March 1, 2000 letters (copy attached). The use of a mobile lab would not decrease the number of soil samples to be analyzed.

I request a waiver of the 3-bid requirement for pre-approval. I am very satisfied with the performance to date by Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. I believe their pricing to be reasonable. In fact, they successfully negotiated with the county for a potential decrease in analytical costs by screening PCB samples using another stipulated analysis. I have attached a copy of their 5 April 2000 letter to the County, and a copy of the County's response letter dated April 7, 2000.

This letter is sent in follow-up to your inquiry into the current status of this Department's oversight of environmental investigations and cleanup of the referenced site. I understand that Scott Seery of my staff provided you with some information during your telephone conversations in the last couple of weeks, but that you also wished to receive a letter memorializing the history of the project.

The Jack Holland Sr. Oil Company (Holland Oil) operated a petroleum bulk plant from this location for many years. The site is comprised of several linked parcels. Both above-ground and underground storage tanks (AST and UST, respectively) were used to store a variety of petroleum products, including gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, and Stoddard solvent. A small oil canning business was also in operation for a short period of time, storing virgin lubricating oil products in a number of ASTs. Other ASTs were used by Holland Oil to store waste oil. In addition, several tenants operated (or still operate) businesses at the site, including used car lots, truck and auto repair, and an overhead crane contractor. This office was informed that Holland Oil ceased day-to-day operations in the late 1980s following the death of Jack Holland Sr.

This Department first became aware of the Holland Oil facility in 1989 during an inspection of the property, apparently after Holland Oil had effectively terminated its operations. The USTs and ASTs were still in place at that time, although they may have been void of product. Soil samples were collected by the inspector in the vicinity of several USTs and ASTs because the bare ground appeared stained. Laboratory analyses of these samples confirmed the presence of petroleum in the shallow soil at that location. In response to this discovery, a limited assessment of the property followed in 1990, confirming the presence of petroleum products in soil.

In the years following the completion of the initial limited site assessment, little substantial progress was made in the case, an apparent result of estate financial troubles and those associated with probate actions. This apparent lack of progress was not due to an absence of effort exerted by this office and that of the District Attorney's during those years. Numerous joint meetings and administrative hearings were convened over the course of several years with the involved parties and their attorneys.

These efforts resulted in the installation of an array of monitoring wells in late 1996, which were regularly sampled through April 1998. Further, site security, a primary concern early on in this project, was improved by repairing fences and placement of signs in an attempt to preclude unauthorized entry by those hoping to gain access to, and from, the adjoining Little League field and elementary school. This work was funded by a responsible party other than the estate that was identified during the course of our efforts with the District Attorney's Office in the preceding years.

During August and September 1998, all ASTs and USTs were removed from the property under guidance and oversight from this office and that of the Alameda County Fire Department, after first profiling the chemical makeup of any residual materials that such tanks may have contained. In addition, all other containers (e.g., drums) were assembled on-site and their contents also profiled. All containers and collected materials were eventually transported to licensed disposal facilities. This work was funded by the sale of other, unrelated estate assets, and redirection of sale proceeds towards this project, the result of the tireless efforts by the District Attorney's Office in their dealings with the Probate Court on this matter.

Presently, a workplan for an additional, comprehensive assessment of the property has been approved by this office, and we are awaiting its implementation. The pending work, which includes the installation of additional wells and numerous soil borings, is expected to provide the data necessary to determine an appropriate correction action plan for the site, and to assess potential risks, if any, to both on- and off-site receptor populations.

Additionally, the site falls within a joint San Leandro/Alameda County redevelopment project area to be managed by the Alameda County Community Development Agency (ACCDA). We understand that the Holland Oil site is envisioned by ACCDA for residential, commercial or mixed-use (commercial/residential) redevelopment. ACCDA has recently applied for a \$25,000 California Center for Land Recycling grant to fund the development of a reuse strategy and economic feasibility study for the Holland Oil site. I understand that preliminary feedback has been favorable.

PRE-APPROVAL OF CORRECTIVE ACTION COSTS, CLAIM NO. 3905, SITE ADDRESS: 16301 E. 14<sup>TH</sup> STREET, SAN LEANDRO

I have reviewed your request, received on April 17, 2000, for pre-approval of corrective action costs; I will place these documents in your file for future reference. I have included a copy of the "Cost Pre-Approval Request" form; please use this form in the future for requesting pre-approval of corrective action costs.

Your pre-approval request submittal is incomplete and cannot be processed. The following marked items were not included in your submittal and must be submitted before review and determination will be made by Fund staff. The scope of work appears excessive (44 borings?). Only a minimum number of borings necessary for plume delineation should initially be drilled. Additional step-out borings must be justified based on the contamination detected during the initial borings. Finally, you may want to consider usage of a mobile lab for more efficient lab testing, considering the potential number of borings.

	A completed cost pre-approval request form; signed by the claimant or an authorized representative. A consulting engineer or contractor performing, or proposing to conduct corrective action work at your site, cannot act as an authorized representative due to a potential conflict of interest. An authorized representative form must be on file or submitted with your request.
	A complete and signed copy of the proposed work plan, corrective action plan, or any other work plan; plan(s) must describe in sufficient and appropriate detail the proposed corrective action work, per the requirements of Article 11, Chapter 16 of the California Underground Storage Tank Regulations.
	A signed copy of the appropriate lead regulatory oversight agency approval letter for the proposed plan.
X	A complete copy of the Request for Bids (RFB), of all firms invited to bid. The RFB should include a blank cost proposal breakdown, which reflects the major tasks of the proposed work and breakdowns of staff classification, labor rate and number of hours perotask.
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.b&OLECTION EMATEORICHENTY

- Complete copies of all bids and other correspondence submitted in response to the RFB.
- If a minimum of 3 qualified/responsive bids are not submitted, then a cover letter requesting and justifying a waiver of the three-bid minimum requirement for the specific proposed work. The Fund's regulations require that you obtain at least three bids from qualified firms for all necessary corrective action work. A waiver of the 3 bid requirement may be granted by the Fund if you request a waiver, provide reasonable justification as to why 3 bids are unnecessary, unreasonable or impossible to comply with, and the Fund staff agrees that it is not necessary to obtain additional bids.
- The selected detailed cost proposal in the format specified in the RFB. All cost proposals should include the *completed* cost proposal breakdown, with task subtotals and a grand total cost for the entire scope of work.

The legislation governing the Fund requires that the Fund assist you in procuring contractor and consultant services for corrective action. If you need assistance to procure corrective action services or if you have any questions, don't hesitate to call me. I can be reached at (916) 227-7883.



Dear Ms. Holland:

I am in receipt of the April 5, 2000 Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. (EBS) letter requesting revision to the prescribed analyses plan for the pending assessment work at the subject site. Attached to the EBS letter is another from Mark Valentini, Ph.D., of Analytical Services, the contract laboratory that I understand EBS will be using for this phase of the project. EBS proposes, with support presented in Dr. Valentini's discussion, that analyses for semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOC) and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB) only be performed where a given sample has shown evidence of diesel-range hydrocarbons (TPH-D). Dr. Valentini further recommends the use of a particular analysis method (EPA Method 8080) when seeking PCBs.

This approach appears sound, but with one addition: SVOC/PCB shall only be sought in those samples where diesel-, kerosene-, Stoddard solvent-, or petroleum oil-range hydrocarbons are identified. This methodology would apply to those samples collected from Areas A, B, and C.

On behalf of the Estate of Jack Holland Sr., EBS wishes to respond to your correspondence to Ann Marie Holland dated March 1, 2000. Specifically, we request an alteration to the analyses schedule.

Based upon past site analytical data, sufficient positive TPHd sample results are anticipated to warrant significant SVOC analysis.

I recently spoke with Mark Valentini, owner of Analytical Sciences, an ELAP certified laboratory in Petaluma, regarding EPA 8015 and EPA 8270 analyses. According to Mr. Valentini, if semi-volatile organic compounds are present in a sample, they will elute on a TPHd (EPA 8015) chromatogram. Therefore, subjecting a sample which shows below reportable concentrations of TPHd to the 8270 analysis would result in significantly increased expense without useful data accumulation. A copy of Mr. Valentini's letter regarding this issue is attached. Copies of diesel, phthalates, and polynuclear aromatic standard chromatograms are also included. These chromatograms show the overlap of these target compounds elution times.

Dear Dave,

In an effort to improve the data quality while reducing the analytical costs for your Holland Oil site, I would suggest adjustments to your proposed workscope. It is my understanding from our discussions and the data obtained during the tank removal phase that the Holland site was fundamentally a bulk fuel transfer facility. Given this, and the significant number of samples to be taken, I would suggest you utilize the TPH Diesel analysis to screen for the presence of semi-volatile hydrocarbons prior to selecting which samples are to be analyzed by EPA 8270. The EPA 8015 protocol uses a very similar GC column and GC temperature program and is able to detect both phthalates and polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons at comparable detection limits to the EPA 8270 (see attached reference chromatograms; the PNA and Phthalate standards are compared directly with a diesel standard in separate chromatographic runs that have identical chromatographic conditions). The TPH Diesel chromatograms will provide a pattern that permits samples to be grouped together permitting a focus on the samples most able to answer questions related to the presence or absence of PNA. phthalates and other specific chemical semi-volatile targets. The samples identified or found positive from the TPH Diesel analysis could then be analyzed by EPA 8270 to both quantitate and conclusively identify the specific semi-volatile targets of concern. The net effect is to provide a broad, informative screening, given the numbers of TPH Diesel analysis, while allowing for a specific, cost effective, utilization of the GC/MS EPA 8270 method for identifying and quantitating specific semi-volatile targets.

In addition I would <u>strongly</u> recommend that EPA 8080 (sulfuric acid cleanup) be used for investigating the presence of Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCB's) instead of EPA 8270. The EPA 8080 (sulfuric acid cleanup) method provides orders of magnitudes better detection limits with interference free, unambiguous identification. High levels of other organics inhibit or prevent the EPA 8270 method from correctly identifying and quantitating PCB's. Most laboratories will not even test for PCB's by EPA 8270 because of the difficulties when other contaminants exist and the poor detection limits.

It should also be noted that the GC/MS detection limits for PCB's are typically above the threshold for human health risk. The EPA 8270 protocol for PCB's is simply technically inferior to the more sensitive, interference free EPA 8080 when the concentrated sulfuric acid cleanup is utilized. If PCB's are of concern, selecting EPA 8270 for PCB investigation is, in my opinion, a significant technical error. In addition, the very low detection limits for PCB's available when EPA 8080 is performed opens up the possibility of compositing samples for PCB's thereby retaining acceptably low detection limits for individual discrete samples being blended in a composite.



I have completed my review of the November 18, 1999 Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. (EBS) work plan as well as their January 7, 2000 work plan addendum. As you are aware, the primary goal of this phase of the project is to collect additional soil and groundwater samples from five (5) areas of the site where above-and below-ground storage tanks were previously located (designated Areas A - D in the EBS work plan).

EBS proposes that a series of soil borings will be advanced within each target area using a Geoprobe® or similar push-tool sampling device. Soil samples will be collected from three discrete depth zones during boring advancement. Each soil sample will be analyzed for the chemical constituents that are consistent with the products and/or wastes that the subject tanks in each area once stored. In addition, two monitoring wells (MW-4 and -5) will be installed using a hollow stem auger drill rig. Both the new wells and existing wells will be sampled during this phase of work.

The cited EBS work plan, as amended, has been accepted for this phase of work at the site, with the following modifications:

1. In those instances where a range of products or wastes may have been stored in one or more tanks in a particular tank area, the target compounds sought from each sample must reflect the full suite of potential constituents, as follows:

Area A and C - Total oil and grease (O&G), total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPH-G), diesel (TPH-D), Stoddard solvent (TPH-SS), and kerosene (TPH-K); benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylene isomers (BTEX), and methyl tert-butyl ether (MtBE); halogenated volatile organic compounds (HVOC); semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOC), including polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB); and metals (Zn, Pb, Ni, Cd, Cr)

Area D and E - TPH-G, TPH-D, TPH-SS, TPH-K, BTEX, MtBE

Area B - O&G, SVOC (including PCB)

- 2. Target compounds sought in groundwater samples collected from the monitoring wells should mirror those that were detected at elevated concentrations in the soil samples collected from the various tank areas. Final determination of target compounds, consequently, should only occur after the consultant's receipt of the soil analyses report from the contracted laboratory, and following consultation with this office.
- 3. An additional Geoprobe<sup>®</sup> boring shall be emplaced in an <u>unimpacted</u> area of the site, upgradient of the known source areas, from which additional soil samples are to be collected. Sample depths shall be the same as with all other borings. Soil samples collected from this boring shall be analyzed for the anticipated physical parameters necessary to complete a Risk-Based Corrective Action (RBCA) evaluation. Sample parameters shall include, among others possible: fraction organic carbon (f<sub>OC</sub>), total soil porosity (θ<sub>T</sub>), soil bulk density (ρ<sub>S</sub>), and volumetric water content in vadose zone and capillary fringe soils (θ<sub>WS</sub> and θ<sub>WCap</sub>, respectively).

The referenced EBS workplan, as amended and modified herein, shall be implemented within 90 days of the date of this letter.

The Alameda County Community Development Agency (Agency) is pleased to respond to your Request for Proposals for a \$25,000 grant to assist us with our brownfields redevelopment program.

Our proposed project involves the redevelopment of a 2.3 acre brownfield site located in the heart of Ashland; a low-income unincorporated community of approximately 17,000 residents. Ashland is located between the Cities of San Leandro and Hayward and is bisected by East 14<sup>th</sup> Street. The site, know by the local residents as the Holland Oil property, is located on East 14<sup>th</sup> Street and is a former oil company that now is the home to two used car lots, an uninhabitable single family residence, a crane company and a dismantler. Under the auspices of the Alameda County District Attorney's Office and the Alameda County Environmental Health Department, the property owners finally removed sixteen above and below ground storage tanks. However, the property has not yet been completely assessed or remediated. The site lies immediately adjacent to a public middle school and Little League ball fields. The property's blighted condition contributed to the adoption of a redevelopment plan for the East 14<sup>th</sup> street corridor and in September of 1999, the Board of Supervisors and Redevelopment Agency authorized the Agency to designate the site as one the Agency may acquire under eminent domain.

The project site is owned jointly by two family members who are not on good terms with each other. One owner would like to sell the property as soon as possible, even under eminent domain, while the other is less eager to reveal her plans. Due to the ownership conflicts, the eminent domain authority granted to the Redevelopment Agency was seen as a method to encourage the reuse of the site. The property has been the subject of several zoning enforcement complaints lodged by the neighboring residents and is perceived by the community as a blight on the community. Many of the older residents are concerned that the redevelopment of the site will divert all the Redevelopment agency funds earmarked for street beatification.

The East 14<sup>th</sup> Street corridor was designated as an EPA Brownfields Assessment Pilot in 1998 and the Agency is currently completing Phase II environmental testing along East 14<sup>th</sup> Street

using the EPA Pilot grant funds. The testing is in conjunction with the implementation of the recently adopted East 14<sup>th</sup> Street Streetscape Master Plan and Underground Utility District slated to begin in June, 2000. The Master Plan improvements will include utility undergrounding, pedestrian and transit access improvement such as widened sidewalks, intersection "bulb-outs" with enhanced bus stops, a planted median, street trees and new street lighting. The adoption of the Master Plan is the result of many years of planning and collaboration with the local residents and merchants. The Agency staffs a Redevelopment Citizens Advisory Committee that is made up of representatives of the two local homeowners associations as well as residents and merchants. In addition, Agency staff has played an active role in the formation of a local merchants association as well as forming a new neighborhood organization focused on safety and improvements of the Ashland community.

As the Agency's Redevelopment Manager, I will be managing the proposed project. I have 12 years experience in managing redevelopment projects including managing consultant contracts, constructing public improvements, operating a façade improvement loan program and administering large grants. Although our redevelopment budget is approximately \$500,000 per year, it funds two staff positions, a graffiti abatement program, a façade improvement loan program and our capital improvement program on East 14<sup>th</sup> Street. There is no funding in our current year budget for the preparation of an economic feasibility study for the Holland Oil site.

The Holland Oil property has been identified by the Agency as a development opportunity site and the Agency has been coordinating redevelopment efforts with the property owners and the involved County agencies. Unfortunately, as with most brownfield sites, most potential developers are concerned about liability and are not willing to study the property for development potential.

Therefore, the Agency would like to use the \$25,000 grant funds to develop a reuse strategy that would include a economic feasibility study for the development of residential, commercial or mixed use project as well as site design services. A professional market study and development plan would allow the Agency to better market the property to urban infill developers.

Thank you for the opportunity to present our project for funding consideration. Our Agency looks forward to the redevelopment of this environmentally challenged property into an asset for the Ashland community. I have prepared the following work plan addendum regarding the referenced site per your request. This addendum addresses three issues raised during our phone conversation on 16 December 1999.

#### AST Contents

Please refer to Figure 2 in the work plan for the AST numbering scheme. I spoke with Ann Marie Holland Tiers and Steve Hancock regarding contents of the above ground storage tanks previously located at the site. They said that tanks 1 through 7 were used to contain waste oil. In addition, tank 5 was intermittently used to contain kerosene.

Tanks 9 through 14 were used to contain virgin motor oil, automatic transmission fluid, and "pale stock". According to Anne Marie Holland Tiers, pale stock is a virgin petroleum product used in blending procedures.

Tanks 15, 16, and 18 were used to contain waste oil. According to Mr. Hancock, waste oil in these tanks may have contained up to 3 ppm PCBs based upon his knowledge of sampling conducted during previous tank cleaning activities. Tank 17 was used to contain kerosene. Tank 19 was used to contain virgin motor oil and automatic transmission fluid. Tank 20 was used to contain virgin gasoline, diesel and kerosene.

#### Soil Sample Depths

Soil samples will be collected from 2 and 5 feet bgs, and from the zone of ground water first encounter (estimated between 8 and 12 feet bgs).

#### **Ground Water Sample Analytes**

Ground water samples will be analyzed for the following:

- TOG using Standard Method 5520E, F.
- TPHd, TPHk and TPHss using EPA Method 8015M.
- TPHg using EPA Method 8015M.



All work will be conducted using standard methodologies, and will be in accordance with ACHCSA, RWQCB and DWR regulations and guidelines. A workplan will be submitted to the ACHCSA for approval prior to project commencement.

EBS anticipates the installation and sampling of soil collected from approximately 44 exploratory borings in addition to the installation, development and sampling of two ground water monitoring wells at the site. Borings will be concentrated in 5 impacted areas identified during previous site mitigation conducted by EBS in 1998 (designated as areas A-E). All borings will be drilled to first water encounter, which is estimated at approximately 10 feet below ground surface (bgs).

Area A encompasses the former locations of aboveground tanks (AGTs) 1 through 7. Area B includes the former locations of AGTs 8 through 14 as well as the former drum storage area adjacent to and west of the former location of AGT 8. Area C includes the former locations of AGTs 15 through 20. Area D will encompass the former locations of underground storage tanks (USTs) T1, T2, T5, T6, T7 and T8. Area E will include former locations of USTs T3 and T4.

Soil samples will be collected from 2, 5 and 10 feet bgs within each boring. All soil samples from Areas A, B and C (60 total) will be analyzed for TOG, TPHd/k, and TPHg+BTEX. All 2 foot bgs samples from Areas A, B and C (20 total) will be additionally analyzed for PCBs. All soil samples from Areas D and E (66 total) will be analyzed for TPHd/k and TPHg+BTEX. 





The December 9, 1998 Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. Site Mitigation Report has been reviewed. This report documents the activities associated with underground storage tank (UST) and above-ground storage tank (AST) removals, and the collection and disposal of various other hazardous materials containers and their contents that were accumulated at the site. Approximately 200 containers in a range of sizes, 20 ASTs and 8 USTs were reportedly removed and/or accounted for during the course of this two-phase project.

To facilitate container removal activities, all contents were profiled. A reported total of approximately 4636 gallons of "oily water", 650 gallons of "oily water with halogens", 100 gallons of "oily water with PCBs", and 50 gallons of sodium hypochlorite were removed from assembled drums and other containers. To facilitate both AST and UST removals, approximately 2700 gallons of liquids were reportedly removed from the USTs and 5200 gallons were removed from the ASTs. The ASTs were cut-up on site and reportedly transported to Shnitzer Steel (Oakland, CA) as scrap. The USTs were removed from the site intact and transported to ECI (Richmond, CA) for decommissioning.

Laboratory results for soil and water samples collected during UST closures, as well as observations made at the time of these activities, confirm that there have been releases of a variety of petroleum products at the site. All gasoline USTs showed advanced stages of galvanic corrosion. All gasoline USTs were severely pitted; two exhibited large throughgoing holes. Observations made of the bare ground where various ASTs and drums were clustered indicate substantial spillage or leaks have occurred in those areas. All soil material excavated during the course of UST closures was placed back into the excavations due to safety considerations. All such soil material was clearly contaminated.

Further assessment of the above- and belowground releases at this site is required before an appropriate corrective action plan (CAP) may be developed.

At this time, please have your "lead" consultant submit a soil and water investigation (SWI) work plan for review. This work plan shall present a comprehensive approach and include, among other elements, the following:

- □ Plans to assess the various source areas (e.g., UST, AST, drum accumulation area, piping and dispenser areas, etc.). This equates to about 5 target areas.
- Sample points within each target area shall be placed using a grid system with approximate 20' centers or less, dependent upon the specific area in question
- Include both shallow, intermediate, and deep soil sampling intervals (e.g. 2, 5, 10') to facilitate the appropriate Risk-Based Corrective Action (RBCA) evaluation following the ASTM RBCA E1739-95 framework
- □ Target compounds shall include diesel and gasoline fuel components, oil and grease, Stoddard solvent, and PCBs. Samples for determination of physical soil characteristics necessary for completion of the RBCA evaluation shall also be collected
- Placement of additional permanent down-gradient monitoring wells

This work plan is due for submittal within 45 days of the date of this letter.





Yesterday I learned from Scott Seery that no workplan for the removal of the tanks has been received. He had called Mr. Sadow and learned that no workplan has been produced because there has been no contract entered into between the parties.

I believe this turn of events, which is part of a seemingly deliberate pattern of delay and recalcitrance, violates 1) California law, 2) the schedule agreed upon at our meeting, and 3) the Court's order.

I believe we have been more than patient with your client's unwillingness or inability to move forward on this investigation.

It is our position that this most recent and completely unnecessary difficulty must be resolved satisfactorily by July 31. If not I will be filing an Order to Show Cause and possibly a motion to relieve Ms. Holland of her position.



Dear Ann Marie and Barbara:

I have received and reviewed the July 1, 1998 Drum Removal Work Plan, prepared by Environmental Bio-Systems, Inc. This work plan presents proposed steps for the removal of hazardous materials and wastes from all containers at the site. Following are concerns or issues requiring clarification:

Item 11states that emptied drums exhibiting a "Lower Explosive Limit (LEL) of 0" will be crushed on site. I am concerned that activities associated with drum crushing or during transfer to the rolloff bin may generate some spillage. Please ensure that this activity be conducted within the lined drum staging/inventory and containment area and not out on the dirt yard. (Also see comments in item 12 below regarding contaminated containers). Item 11 also states that crushed drums and other wastes will be hauled under special waste manifest.

I discussed this matter with your consultant, Dave Sadoff of Environmental Bio-Systems. He explained that the "special waste" designation he referred to in the work plan was one Forward Landfill uses not the one specified in Section 66261 124 CA Code of Regulations (CCR) which requires, among other things, prior written approval from the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) before transport of such waste. Please be advised that all unknown wastes associated with work performed during all phases of site remediation at this site must be profiled to determine whether they exceed hazardous waste criteria specified in Section 662610 CCR. Only then may transportation, treatment or disposal options be determined.

Item 12 indicates that drums exhibiting an LEL > 0 will be inerted and cold cut during later demolition of above ground tanks. If such drums or other vessels contain significant amount of sludge or other residue then they are considered

hazardous waste and must either be manifested to an authorized hazardous waste facility or rinsed out on-site (via an on-site Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) permitted waste treatment unit). Section 66261.7(b)2, Title 22, (CCR) states that: "Following material removal, the top, bottom and sidewalls of such a container shall not contain remaining adhered or crusted materials resulting from buildup of successive layers of material or a mass of solidified material. A thin uniform layer of dried material or powder is considered acceptable." Drums and other containers with significant residue as discussed above are required to be managed as hazardous waste.

Item 13 states that drums which are not accepted by Evergreen Environmental Services will be additionally profiled as necessary. You are required to perform hazardous waste characterization particularly for non petroleum wastes, as per Sections 66260.20 through 66261.24 CCR. Please also include copies of all waste profile results with waste disposal manifests/bill of lading invoices.

Item 16 states that a security guard will be present on-site during "all inactive periods (nights)" while the above scope of work is being conducted on-site. Inactive periods shall include weekends and all non-work periods (i.e. after hours) for all aspects of work specified in the Drum Removal Work Plan.

This scope of work does not include removal of visible and non visible soil contamination at the site. I understand that this work will be conducted in the next (phase 2) work plan which will be overseen by Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division. Environmental Health has been apprised of Public Work's interest in ensuring that all surface and subsurface contamination or associated clean up debris does not pose a threat to stormwater. Please continue to include my Agency in future correspondence relating to clean up of surface contamination at the subject site or any other issues regarding storm water exposure associated with current or future activities.

The work plan as specified is hereby approved under the condition that each of the above concerns are implemented or clarified prior to initiating the work at the site. Work plan approval assumes that you are in compliance with all applicable regulations, statutes and local ordinances.



Dear Ed:

This is to memorialize what occurred at yesterday's meeting with the agencies and other parties.

Because each of the agencies involved feel that the leaking drums of apparent hazardous waste are an immediate concern, a workplan for their removal will be submitted to Paul Smith of Alameda County Public Works (with copies to Scott Seery and Jim Ferdinand) by July 1, with work to commence as soon as possible following the approval of the plan. Mr. Smith also indicated a desire that the liquids within the above ground tanks be profiled at the same time, if feasible.

It was further agreed that the workplan for the removal of the above ground storage tanks and underground storage tanks and initial soil sampling will be submitted to Mr. Ferdinand and Mr. Seery by July 15. They have indicated that they will be able to review the plan within the following two weeks and suggest any necessary changes, allowing the work to commence during the month of August.

The private issues which need to be discussed between you and Mr. Heiland include 1) whether to use one consultant or more than one; and if more than one are used, how to divide up the work or work jointly on the project, and 2) how the expense of the project might be shared.

Once the drums and tanks are removed, the next phase of the assessment will be to determine the full extent of the contamination, bearing in mind that a preliminary investigation has already been done.



RE: Summary of Environmental Investigation Conducted at Jack Holland Sr. Oil Company Property, East 14th Street, San Leandro, California

Dear Ms. Holland:

At your request, Compliance & Closure, Inc. (CCI) is hereby providing you with a summary of the environmental work CCI has performed at the above-referenced site since you retained our firm in October 1995, as well as some background information about the site.

#### BACKGROUND

The Jack Holland Sr. Oil Company property is comprised of approximately 3.0 acres and was formerly a bulk fuel storage and retail facility. There are at least 18 above-ground storage tanks and eight known underground fuel storage tanks currently on the site. The site is located in a commercial area of San Leandro, bound on the south and west sides by a park and recreation facility and an elementary school and by used car lots on the north and east sides. The facility was in operation from approximately 1960 to the mid-1980s.

In 1990, the firm of Crosby and Overton conducted a limited site investigation around the underground fuel tanks located toward the southwest side of the property. The investigation involved drilling 5 soil borings. Total petroleum hydrocarbons as diesel (TPHD) were reported in soil samples collected from the fuel tank area. TPHD concentrations were reported as high as 25,000 parts-per-million (ppm). Groundwater was encountered at approximately 15 feet below the ground surface. Due to the close proximity of the groundwater to the contaminated soil, the Alameda County Health Care Agency (County) had requested that further investigation of the contamination be conducted. No further work was conducted at the site. In late October 1995, Ms. Barbara Holland retained Compliance & Closure, Inc. to assist her with certain additional environmental investigation required by the County. On November 14, 1995, CCI prepared a Work Plan for Preliminary Site Assessment for the subject site. The County approved the Work Plan in December 1995, and CCI began field work in February 1996.

Holland Summary Page 2

#### Field Work Conducted by Compliance & Closure, Inc.

The purpose of the Preliminary Site Assessment was to determine the location of all underground storage tanks on the property. In addition, CCI installed 3 groundwater monitoring wells to a) determine the groundwater flow direction at the site by surveying them to a common datum, and b) determine whether groundwater had been impacted and, if it had, the extent to which it had been impacted.

On February 6, 1996, CCI subcontracted Subdynamic Locating Services (Subdynamic) of San Jose, California to search the former Jack Holland Sr. Oil Company property for underground storage tanks. Maps of the site provided by Ms. Barbara Holland indicated there were at least eighteen aboveground fuel tanks and possibly three underground tanks located at the subject site.

The locating equipment Subdynamic used was a T-W6 M-Scope by Fisher Industries, which sends a radio signal into the subsurface to search for the tanks. When metal is encountered, the radio signal is reflected back to the surface where it is picked up by the instrument in the form of an audible sound. The perimeter of the underground tank is located by working in a specific area and recording the sound, then marking the tank location on the surface with paint. The Fisher instrument is capable of detecting metal to a depth of 9 feet.

Subdynamic began its search of the property near Building C (west side of the property) in the vicinity of two known (or suspected) underground tanks. (See attached map). The search of that area revealed the existence of two additional 10,000 gallon tanks located at approximately a 90-degree angle to the known tanks. The loading dock area was also searched. Two, 10,000-gallon storage tanks, positioned end to end, and parallel to Building A, were located in this area. Another underground fuel tank was located next to the aboveground fuel pump in the vicinity of Building B. The size of this tank is estimated to be approximately 5,000 gallons. A total of five additional underground storage tanks were located during this phase of work. There appear to be a total of eight underground and at least eighteen aboveground storage tanks at the site.

### **Exploratory Drilling and Soil Sampling**

CCI conducted exploratory drilling for the site assessment on April 1, 1996. The field work included drilling three exploratory borings, installing groundwater monitoring wells in each of the borings, and developing and sampling the wells.

Soil samples collected were found to be generally composed of silty-clay near the surface, with thin layers of silty-sand and sand at depths ranging from 2 feet to 18 feet in MW-2. These soil conditions were encountered in all three monitoring wells.

Holland Summary Page 3

Five of six soil samples submitted for laboratory analysis were found to have hydrocarbon contamination. Soil sample MW-2-1, collected from a depth of five feet, was reported by the laboratory to contain the highest levels of petroleum hydrocarbons contamination, at 4,400 ppm TPHG and 8,200 ppm TPHD. In general, petroleum hydrocarbon contamination was found in the upper ten feet of the soil column, with the exception of MW-1-1, which was reported to be free of petroleum hydrocarbon contamination at a depth of five feet. The contamination reported in the soil samples from a depth of 10 feet is most likely the result of the contaminated groundwater table rising and falling during seasonal changes. The shallow soil in the vicinity of MW-3 is contaminated with oil. During drilling of that well, visible oil was noted on the soil cuttings in the upper five feet. This oil may be the result of spillage from oil canning operations that reportedly formerly took place in Building A. Very small quantities of chlorinated solvents were reported in the soil samples collected from the three borings. Soil sample MW-3-2 was reported to contain 1,4-dichlorobenzene, at a concentration of 0.024 ppm. Methylene chloride was reported in all six soil samples, at concentrations ranging from 0.014 to 0.4 ppm. No other chlorinated solvent compounds were reported in soil samples collected.

Laboratory analyses of the groundwater samples collected during the investigation revealed petroleum hydrocarbon contamination in the groundwater in all three monitoring wells. During sampling of the wells, a sheen was noted on the surface of the purge water collected from monitoring well MW-1. Monitoring well MW-1 was reported to contain 33,000 ppb TPHG and 9,700 ppb TPHD in the water. Monitoring well MW-2 also contained high levels of TPHG and TPHD at 6,900 ppb and 8,900 ppb, respectively. Monitoring well MW-3 was found to be free of detectable TPHG/BTEX compounds. However, this well was reported to contain 1,100 ppb TPHD and 41,000 ppb TRPH.

Since April 1996, CCI has conducted quarterly groundwater monitoring of the three groundwater monitoring wells. The quarterly monitoring of the site indicates that two of the three wells (MW-2 and MW-3) have been predominantly free of detectable hydrocarbon contamination for nearly four quarters. Monitoring well MW-1 (the down-gradient well) continues to have detectable concentrations of petroleum hydrocarbon, although at much lower levels since the well was installed in April 1996.

#### CCI's Opinions and Recommendations:

It appears there exists some petroleum hydrocarbon contaminated soil in the upper ten feet of the soil column in the vicinity of the fuel tanks. Much of this contamination may be from the rising and lowering of the water table during the year. Quarterly groundwater monitoring indicates the contamination near the fuel tanks is not migrating far from the source areas. Natural biodegradation of the petroleum contaminated groundwater appears to be taking place at the subject site. Groundwater contamination levels have decreased significantly since April 1996.

Based on this information, it is CCI opinion that the next course of action for the subject site is to remove all drums (some of which appear to contain waste oil) and all aboveground and underground located at the site. The removal of the drums and tanks should be completed as soon as possible. Once these activities are completed, CCI recommends that a Soil and Water Investigation (SWI) be conducted (as outlined in CCI's Work Plan of August 1996). Additional activities for the site would be determined by the results of the SWI.

CCI obtained two bids to remove the drums off the site since the removal of those was the most pressing issue 4 to 6 weeks ago, when the Alameda County Public Works Agency and the Alameda County Community Development Agency issued Notices of Nuisance and Violation of certain Alameda County ordinances. Since that time CCI has been informed that Anne Marie Holland has retained another consultant to assist her with performing certain tasks outlined in a letter dated May 1, 1998 from Mr. Larry Blazer of the Alameda County District Attorney's Office to Ms. Holland's attorney, Mr. Ed Martins. Mr. Blazer suggested a meeting with all the agencies and parties involved with the subject site. To date no such meeting has taken place, therefore this summary may be helpful in providing the respective parties with current site information and activities so that no duplication of effort takes place. We certainly intend to cooperate with any other consultant retained to work at the Holland site.

We hope this addresses and answers the issues abut which you've raised questions and/or concerns. If you do have additional questions or have comments, please don't hesitate to call us.



This is to memorialize our conversation of yesterday morning.

Now that your client, Ann Marie Holland Tiers, has been ordered by the court to conduct an environmental investigation and commence any necessary cleanup at the above site, we wish this process to begin as soon as possible.

There are three issues which need to be dealt with:

- 1) The tank closure and investigation associated with the underground tanks;
- 2) The removal and cleanup associated with the dilapidated drums apparently containing hazardous waste (i.e. waste oil) on the property, and;
- The proper removal of the above ground tanks.

Three agencies are involved:

- The County Department of Environmental Health will oversee the underground tank closure and investigation (Scott Seery).
- 2) The drums fall within the jurisdiction of the County Department of Public Works (Paul Smith), and;
- The above ground tank closure requires a permit from the Alameda County Fire Marshall (James Ferdinand), who will then stand by as the removal occurs.

All of these matters can be attended to by an environmental consultant or contractor acceptable to the County Department of Environmental Health. As we discussed, a good first step towards finding the consultant would be to speak with Mr. Seery about who would be appropriate.

In our conversation we agreed to try and set up a meeting with all the agencies and parties involved, to go over what must be done and perhaps arrive at a set of priorities.

We further agreed that this meeting should occur on or shortly after May 20, giving you the opportunity to consult with your client, contact potential consultants and employ one to start preparing a workplan. This will allow your chosen consultant to attend the meeting and productively extract necessary information from the regulatory officials present. The contractors you speak with should perhaps be made aware that a preliminary investigation has already been done and what is now required is further investigation, expanding upon what has been done.

Dear Ms. Holland:

Recent site visits to San Leandro Crane Service, Jesus Salvage and Dan's Automotive have revealed over 100 fifty five gallon drums containing hazardous waste, hazardous materials and rainwater at the subject location. These drums were noted around several areas of the property. Rain has leaked through untightened or improperly fitting bung plugs or open drums. Rainwater which is heavier than oil/solvent has then seeped or directly entered full, partial or contaminated empty drums causing significant visible soil contamination around several drum storage areas. Some drums are stacked on top of other drums in such a was that they are likely to fall. Please see the attached photos. This site backs up to a grade school. The potential for impact to stormwater or groundwater associated with the above requires that you take immediate measures to secure, cover and properly store and dispose all materials, wastes and containers at your site.

I am aware that the property has joint ownership. Attached is a site map indicating the approximate location of many of the drums so that you can determine who is responsible for them. You are required to cover each drum, above ground tank and other container currently stored on the property to prevent accumulation of rainwater and further contamination to soil, or to store them in a covered, secured and preferably secondarily contained area, or to remove them from the site within 14 days. You should be aware that the maximum legal hold times for storage of hazardous waste have likely been exceeded for wastes stored onsite. You are also required to remove and properly manage all visible contaminated soil around the drum storage where leakage from the drums has occurred. Contaminated soil associated with any clean up activity should be managed as hazardous waste.

You are required to provide a written response to me regarding the above issues by April 15, 1998.

Based upon the past use of the site as a petroleum storage/ refinery plant, the high potential for exposure from materials, wastes and equipment currently on site to spill onto soil and groundwater or to runoff the site with rainfall this site would likely fall into a conditional facility required to obtain a General Industrial Activities Stormwater Permit (General Permit) from the CA; State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB). The requirements of a General Permit involve the preparation of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) identifying your sources of pollution, receiving water bodies of storm water runoff and best management practices (BMP's) for minimizing the impact to stormwater from activities associated with your operation, a Monitoring Plan; identifying proposed sampling locations and sampling constituents, analytical results and also documents both wet and dry season self monitoring.

I am advising you that if the above noted stormwater exposure/cleanup issues are not addressed within the time frames specified, or a time frame which you indicate to me would be feasible for you to rectify the above conditions, I will refer this site to the SWRCB and Regional Water Quality Control Board to require your facility to comply with the requirements of a General Permit and other necessary enforcement actions.

Storm water pollution is specifically prohibited in Section 3-351.3, Article 2, of the Alameda County Ordinance No. 0-92-51. Stormwater pollution is also regulated in the CA Water Code, Section 13304 and in the Federal Clean Water Act, Section 402(p). Failure to comply with the above requirements will result in enforcement actions.

Enclosed are photos of drums and visible contamination associated with storage, a site map indicating the approximate locations of drums on the property, a General Permit application packet and a stormwater pollution brochure. Your claim has been found to be <u>ineligible</u> for placement on the Priority List for the following reason(s):

According to the information provided in your claim application, the property consists of 3.5 acres. You have indicated that you have 50% ownership of a parcel which contains an underground storage tank which stored stoddard solvents. Most stoddard solvents are considered an ineligible substance unless they are petroleum based. Moreover, this tank was not identified on the claim as being the source of the contamination. Three 10,000-gallon diesel tanks have been identified as the source of the contamination problem. According to information submitted with your claim, the parcel housing these tanks are owned entirely by the Jack Holland Sr. Estate.

One of the requirements for filing a claim with the Fund is that you either owned or operated the USTs that caused the contamination. Because you were neither owner nor operator, you are not eligible to recover corrective action costs resulting from the diesel tanks.

NOTE: Sections cited are found in the Petroleum Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 18, of the California Code of Regulations.

If you disagree with this Staff Decision, you may either request review and reconsideration by the Program Manager or you may formally appeal the decision and request a Final Division Decision from the Chief of the Division. #### SURVEYING

A licensed land surveyor will be retained to survey the monitoring wells accurately and will determine the elevation of each well casing. In addition, the underground fuel tanks will also be surveyed to show their location. The survey ensures accuracy so that the plot plans will portray the data in a manner useful for determining groundwater flow direction. The survey will include both horizontal and vertical measurements. Elevation readings will be to the nearest 0.01 feet and corrected to mean sea level.

#### Laboratory Analysis

It is anticipated that up to twenty four soil and twelve water samples will be analyzed. All samples will be analyzed for total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHG) and benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene and total xylenes (BTEX) using GCFID 5030 and 8020 for soil and GCFID 5030 and 602 for water. Total petroleum hydrocarbons as diesel (TPHD) will be analyzed using EPA Method 8015 Mod. for diesel range compounds. CCI will also analyze soil and groundwater samples collected during this Soil and Groundwater Investigation for chlorinated solvent compounds using EPA Method 8010. The samples will be analyzed on a normal (10 working day) turnaround time frame.

#### REPORT PREPARATION

Here are my general comments regarding the technical scope of the 8/21/96 Compliance & Closure, Inc. (CCI) work plan for tank removal and further site assessment.

#### 1. UST REMOVAL

The CCI work plan indicates Barbara Holland will pay for 50% of the costs associated with the closure of one (1) of the USTs which partially underlies property in which she has some ownership interest. The plan indicates Ann Marie Holland and the Jack Holland Sr. Estate will pay the remaining 50% of the costs for closure of that tank <u>plus</u> finance the closures of the remaining seven (7) tanks.

Although both B. Holland and A.M. Holland have indicated their agreement to this apportionment of financial responsibility, it is still unclear how, based on the (unsubstantiated) financial accountings presented to date by the A.M. Holland and Estate camps, the closure of 7½ tanks will be financed. If we were to believe what information has been shared with us, I'm not convinced that the Estate can even finance the remaining 50% of the single B. Holland UST.

As it only makes logistical and financial sense to coordinate <u>all</u> tank closures so that they are completed as a single task by the same contractor, therefore gaining the greatest advantage economically, we should make sure all monies necessary to complete this work are encumbered first.

The CCI plan indicates an application will be submitted to ACDEH, a H&S plan prepared, and bids solicited from at least 3 contractors. Sounds fine. CCI mentions that the UST closure permit will be acquired from ACDEH and San Leandro Fire Department; however, as this site is located in an unincorporated area of the county, the Alameda County Fire Department is the correct fire agency.

#### 2. ABOVEGROUND TANKS

The aboveground tanks are not specifically addressed in the CCI plan. However, the 8/20/91 cover to the CCI work plan indicates they "... will be removed at a later date." This task needs to be better defined, scoped and firmly scheduled.

#### 3. SOIL AND WATER INVESTIGATION

The CCI work plan proposes intrusive "reconnaissance" work initially using GeoProbe sampling hardware, followed by the installations of two wells.\* More wells may be needed and, hence, requested, depending on the results of the GeoProbe work. The work plan indicates permanent wells will be installed on parcels in which B. Holland has ownership interest. This approach is acceptable when it appears such well placement will provide the best "bang-for-the-buck" information. However, the scope of both the GeoProbe investigation and eventual well coverage must be based on the data, and not on the convenience of placing wells/probes in preconceived locations based on property ownership unless such locations are as good as any other.

The GeoProbe study should proceed in a "step-out" fashion as the need dictates, until the plume is reasonably defined, both on- and off-site. This may require several additional rounds of work beyond what has been proposed in the CCI work plan as presented. However, total plume definition does not have to be completed before permanent well locations on-site can be determined, and wells installed. Of course, the final scope will be significantly based on the nature of the contaminants found (i.e., gas or diesel compounds).

\* Note: scrutiny of the attached project timeline indicates a reverse order for the GeoProbe/well sequence. This, according to CCI's Gary Mulkey, was at the request of B. Holland in the hope that should the wells show "no problem," the GeoProbe study would not become a necessity. However, the GeoProbe study, in my view, is a preliminary step necessary to best locate the permanent wells in strategic locations. Hence, the investigation sequence will be GeoProbe first, wells second, subsequent GeoProbe and well points as needed, last.

Sample analyses for both soil and water samples will be for TPH-G, -D, BTEX and HVOC (as revised 9/26/96 following a telephone conversation with CCI's Gary Mulkey on that date). Water samples from GeoProbes should be collected using a bailer (as opposed to a peristaltic pump) or other comparable method so as to minimize the potential loss of volatile constituents.

This is in response to your letter dated July 25, 1996, addressed to, among others, Ms. Barbara Holland, in which you requested a proposed compliance schedule for the completion of certain environmental tasks at the above-referenced site.

Ms. Barbara Holland has retained Compliance & Closure, Inc. (CCI) to assist her with the environmental issues related to the subject property.

Attached is a Work Plan for Soil and Groundwater Investigation at the subject site and a proposed schedule for the tasks The Work Plan addresses the removal of the underground storage tanks. The aboveground tanks, which currently pose a minimal threat to the environment, will be removed at a later date. The monitoring and reporting activities are continuing and will continue on a quarterly basis until further notice. A copy of the July 1996 Quarterly Report is also attached herewith.

As you know, Ms. Barbara Holland has expended considerable funds (over \$45,000.00) for environmental investigations at the site, despite the fact that she has limited finances. Although she acquired portions of the property through a divorce settlement and at no time was involved with the site activities that contributed to the contamination at the site, Ms. Barbara Holland has been the only party who has been and is acting reasonably and responsibly and is attempting to clean up the site. CCI submitted to your office certain documentation that substantiated Ms. Barbara Holland's position that her sons, Jay and Guy Holland, have no property interest in or to the subject property and are not and should not be considered responsible parties with respect to the environmental investigation and remediation at the subject site. Please remove the names of John M. Holland IV and Guy Holland from the list of responsible parties for this site.

In addition, two other issues were briefly discussed with the Pre-Enforcement Review Panel on July 24, 1996. One issue dealt with the UST Cleanup Fund (Fund) application and whether Ms. Holland intended to apply to the Fund. Please be advised that CCI is continuing to assist Ms. Barbara Holland with the application The second issue dealt with the whereabouts of the Gull Wing car and/or its proceeds. The Gull Wing car belonged to Mr. Jack Holland Jr. and was not the part of the estate of Mr. John M. Holland Sr. (Sr.). The car was a gift to Jack Holland Jr. from his wife, Jeanne. It was merely being stored in Sr.'s garage by Jack Apparently, Jack Sr. was confused about the ownership of the The current car and mistakenly included it in his will. whereabouts of the car and/or any proceeds from the sale of the car are irrelevant to the issues concerning Sr.'s estate and its assets. We hope this lays to rest the recurring questions about the Gull Wing car.

As required by Mr. Scott Seery of the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH), a Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA) was conducted by CCI to locate all aboveground and underground storage tanks on the parcels that comprise the site. The next step that is required of the property owners is to determine the lateral and vertical extent of any soil and groundwater contamination and prepare a Decommissioning/Closure Plan for the tanks at the site. Since the Estate of Jack M. Holland Sr. is at least part-owner of the parcels in question, the above-mentioned Hollands once again are putting Anne Marie Holland and the Estate of Jack M. Thank you for arranging for our recent receipt of the June 9, 1994 Cambria Environmental Technology, Inc. (CETI) preliminary site assessment work plan for the referenced site. This work plan was submitted in response to an amended request for technical reports as outlined in the April 21, 1994 San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) letter.

The June 9, 1994 CETI work plan addresses the first three of four tasks outlined in the cited April 21, 1994 RWQCB letter. A summary of the proposed scope of work is as follows:

- o Identify the locations and orientations of each underground storage tank (UST) on all parcels
- o Contract for a licensed surveyor to survey (the location of) each tank and boundaries for all four parcels, and prepare a map depicting the tanks with respect to the parcel boundaries
- Assess the horizontal and vertical extent of soil and ground water contamination originating from parcels (in part) owned by Barbara Holland
- o Remove the above- and below-ground tanks from parcels owned (in part) by Barbara Holland in accordance with Title 23, California Code of Regulations, the Alameda County Fire Code and ACDEH requirements

The cited CETI work plan has been accepted as proposed. We are aware that during implementation of the assessment phase of this work plan, borings and wells will be required on parcels in which you may or may not have an ownership interest for proper characterization. Hence, in light of the long commercial history of this site as a petroleum bulk plant, and the 25<sup>+</sup> potential individual contaminant point sources (read: tanks), clear demarcation of contaminant plumes from specific sources will be difficult.

Once UST locations are clearly identified, this office will provide the appropriate tank closure application forms for your completion. Once approved, tank closure(s) may then be scheduled. Additionally, we understand that proposed well/boring locations will be finalized once all tanks are identified and locations surveyed, and before field work associated with the assessment phase begins.

Please call me when field work associated with tank locating and site assessment is scheduled. Although we have recently moved to new offices (1131 Harbor Bay Parkway, 2nd Floor, Alameda 94502) and our permanent phone system is still not in place, you may reach me during the interim by calling 510/271-4320. Cambria Environmental Technology, Inc. recently submitted a work plan for addressing the requirements imposed by the April 21, 1994 RWQCB directive following the initial and reset Pre-Enforcement Review Panel (PERP) meetings. The reset PERP was held April 20, 1994.

In summary, information presented at the April PERP on behalf of Barbara Holland, owner of 1/2 interest in three of the four parcels comprising this contiguous commercial property, indicated that at least one of the (unknown) number of USTs at this site was located partially on one of the parcels in which B. Holland has interest. Further, several of the 20<sup>+</sup> above-ground tanks also appeared to be located on more than one of the several parcels in which B. Holland has interest. The PERP reasoned that this new information tied the parcels more closely together than ever:

Cambria, contracted by B. Holland, submitted a work plan proposing the following scope of work:

- o Identify all USTs on each parcel
- o Once UST locations are identified, a determination will be made as to which (if any) are located on parcel(s) in which B. Holland has interest
- o Horizontal and vertical extent of contamination released from UST(s) located on parcels in which B. Holland has interest will be assessed
- o All above- and below-ground tanks will be removed from those parcels in which B. Holland has interest

Ground penetrating radar (GPR) is recommended by Cambria for identifying the locations of each of the USTs on all parcels. Should GPR's effectiveness be limited at this site (e.g., instrument interference from above-ground tanks, etc.), Cambria proposes to

uncover each (probable) UST site
will be contracted to survey all
locations relative to parcel bour

uncover each (probable) UST site using a backhoe. A licensed surveyor will be contracted to survey all above- and below-ground tank locations relative to parcel boundaries.

Once tanks are clearly identified and locations surveyed, Cambria will conduct an initial subsurface investigation to assess whether tanks extending onto parcels in which B. Holland has interest have released contaminants. Several borings will be advanced and "grab" water samples collected. "Step-out" borings will continue until the apparent extent of soil/water contamination is subjectively defined. Once defined, permanent well locations will be proposed under separate cover. Maps depicting both initial proposed boring and permanent well locations will be submitted for approval before commencing each phase of work.

Cambria will subcontract for the removal of all above- and belowground tanks located entirely or partially on parcels in which B. Holland has interest.

I recommend approving the proposed scope of work at the site, even though there is a clear indication that <u>only</u> parcels in which B. Holland has interest will be addressed, at least in principle. The advantages of allowing the work to proceed as proposed are:

- 1) All indications are that a majority of the above-ground tanks appear to be located on those parcels in which B. Holland has interest;
- 2) Contaminants are not constrained by parcel lines. Specific sources for released contaminants will be difficult to determine at a site which has seen so many years of use as a bulk plant, with upwards of 30 individual potential point sources (Read: tanks). If during the initial phase of the investigation soil and ground water contamination is found, the RP will be hard pressed to prove that contaminants did not stem from the specific tank being investigated by that particular borehole in which contamination is initially found. In the course of evaluating whether or not contaminants originated from one tank or another, the entire site would likely require evaluation. This is precisely what is desired;
- 3) Language can be inserted into the letter approving Cambria's work plan which essentially accepts the scope of work (for the sake of getting this project going and abating future releases), but which also sidesteps any acknowledgement of the notion that B. Holland is only responsible for the problems directly stemming from B. Holland's parcels.

Please advise me on this matter.

It has been brought to my attention by Regional Board staff that a condition of soil and ground water pollution exists on the property located at 16301 East 14th Street, San Leandro, from an underground storage tank release. The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACHD) staff have requested technical reports from one or more of you to fulfill your obligations per California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Waters, Chapter 16, Underground Storage Tank Regulations, Article 11, Corrective Action Reguirements.

Pre-Enforcement Review Panel Page 2 of 4

A Reset Pre-Enforcement Review Panel (PERP) meeting was held at the ACHD Offices on April 20, 1994, attended by Mr. Sum Arigala of my staff. It is my understanding that the panel were presented new information which more closely ties the parcels on this contiguous commercial site together. Specifically, a recent site survey, and the account of one of the named parties, identified that some number of the above-ground tanks at this site are located on parcels owned in part by Barbara Holland. The remaining above-ground tanks are located on parcels owned completely, or in part, by the Estate of John Holland Sr. Further, at least one of the abandoned underground storage tanks (UST), a 12,000 gallon solvent tank, appears to be located significantly on parcels owned by both mentioned parties.

Pursuant to the Regional Board's authority under Section 13267(b) of the California Water Code, you are hereby found to be a responsible party as defined by Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 11, Section 2720. This same determination was reached at the September 29, 1993 PERP.

A Responsible Party is "any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use" and "any person who had or has control over an UST at the time of or following an unauthorized release of petroleum occurred." A responsible party also includes any owner of property from which an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred, among others.

As a Responsible Party, you are required to conduct both soil and ground water investigations to determine the extent of environmental contamination resulting from the release, among other tasks outlined below. You are also required to perform a minimum of monitoring and sampling of any wells presently (or to be) located at the site, and submit summary reports documenting the results of this work.

- 2) As a result of widespread contamination, determine the <u>exact</u> location and orientation of all above- and below-ground tanks on <u>all</u> parcels comprising this contiguous site. The specific parcels affected by this requirement are: 80C-479-6-3, 80C-479-6-4, 80C-479-6-11, and 80C-479-6-13.

Submit a licensed surveyor's map depicting the <u>exact</u> locations of each tank relative to each parcel (<u>Note</u>: Due to current site conditions and the perceived limited effectiveness of remote sensing methods, uncovering each tank was proposed at the recent PERP meeting as the best method for determining exact UST locations and orientations relative to parcel boundaries);

- 3) The above- and below-ground tanks must be properly decommissioned / closed in accordance with Title 23, California Code of Regulations, the Alameda County Fire Code, and any other requirements of the ACHD;
- 4) Investigation summary reports must be submitted quarterly.

All proposed assessment work should adhere to the requirements articulated in <u>The Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendations for the Preliminary Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Storage Tank Sites - 8/10/90 and Article 11 of Title 23, Waters, California Code of Regulations.</u>

I am hereby transmitting this request for technical reports to ACHD for service and continued case handling. You should be aware that failure on your part to submit the requested technical reports, or a submittal received after the date specified in this request, may result in fines up to \$1,000 per day of delinquency. Your response to this technical report request should be sent to Mr. Scott Seery, at ACHD. Please inform Mr. Seery at least three working days in advance of all field activities.

Your attention is directed towards the November 2, 1993 San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) letter presenting the legal designation of responsible party and request for technical reports issued following the September 29, 1993 Pre-Enforcement Review Panel (PERP) meeting held at the offices of the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH).

The referenced RWQCB letter requests the submittal of technical reports and the performance of tasks specifically addressing the following: 1) a Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA) work plan; 2) a report presenting the results of a site survey intended to identify parcel boundaries and the locations of both above— and below—ground storage tanks; 3) summary reports presenting the results of the ongoing environmental investigation; 4) the appropriate closure/decommissioning of the above— and below—ground storage tanks; and 5) provide appropriate site security, and document such in a status report.

The original deadline for completion of these tasks was extended an additional 90 days at the request of Mr. Bernard Rose, council for Barbara Holland. Thank you for the recent submittal of a copy of your letter appeal to the State Water Resources Control Board. This letter appeal was submitted in the wake of the November 2, 1993 San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) letter detailing the decision of the September 29, 1993 Pre-Enforcement Review Panel in naming several responsible parties (RP) for site assessment, among other tasks.

As we discussed previously, the county is anxious to resolve the multiple environmental and compliance problems at this site. If more time is needed to resolve some of the underlying issues, then more time will be granted. You mentioned that a 90 day extension would seem reasonable, and I agree. Therefore, to the extent possible, this office will expect an update and resolution of the issues outlined in the referenced November 2, 1993 RWQCB letter by March 17, 1994.

Please bear in mind that, to productively move this case forward towards final resolution, several fundamental issues must first be resolved: 1) clearly identifying the locations of lot lines, and, hence, ownership of the each lot, and 2) identifying the exact locations of each of the many above— and underground storage tanks (UST). This task will necessitate that the locations of each lot and tank be surveyed by a California-licensed surveyor, and that such locations are depicted on a certified surveyor's map. Further, an improvement in site security is of paramount importance.

Bernie Rose called yesterday, December 1st. He said that he had spoken with the SWRCB's Tedd Cobb regarding the due date extension for submittal of the requisite technical reports, and the time limitations for him to file an appeal to the Board. He indicated that, according to Mr. Cobb, there was no way to put the appeal on "hold." Mr. Rose said he then filed a document called a "Letter of Appeal." In the cover letter submitted with the appeal, Mr. Rose said he wrote that the DA, ACDEH, and RP want to resolve the issues, but that more time is simply needed.

Mr. Rose said that the appeal asks that the Board hold any enforcement action in abeyance until they "hear back from him." He said that this appeal was made only to uphold the statute of limitations placed on such actions, and, according to him, is a fairly common procedure. This way, he goes on to say, the appellate is allowed to meet statute requirements. He also said that the county doesn't need to respond to anything at this point.

He reportedly asked Mr. Cobb to contact me if there were any questions.

I spoke with Bernard Rose on Tuesday, November 23, in reference to his letter to the RWQCB and yourself dated November 10, 1993. Mr. Rose's letter argues that Barbara Holland was inappropriately named as one of several RPs in the November 28, 1993 RWQCB letter requesting the submittal of a PSA work plan and site survey, among other tasks. Mr. Rose contends that Barbara Holland is in no way connected with the 16301 E. 14th Street site.

I explained to Mr. Rose that he is <u>literally</u> correct in stating Barbara Holland has no ownership interest in that specific address. The street address 16301 E. 14th Street is assigned to ASN 80C-479-6-4 in the Alameda County Assessor's records, owned 100% by the heirs of the estate of John M. Holland. Nonetheless, Ms. Holland is at least a 50% owner in the remaining three (3) parcels comprising this contiguous, industrial site. The 16301 E. 14th Street address is that which has been used historically to catalog this site at ACDEH, as well as by those associated with Jack Holland Sr. Oil Company and all other parties who have previously referred to this site. I asked him to note that under point 2 of the cited November 29, 1993 RWQCB letter, the parcels of concern are specifically identified. He acknowledged that he now understood.

I gave him a condensed version of the history of the site, from first discovery of the environmental problems in 1989, ACDEH's subsequent request for site assessment, our attempts to cooperatively work with Ann Marie Holland over the course of the last several years to resolve these issues, and the July 1, 1993 on-site meeting with Barbara Holland and her attorney Archie Mull, Murray Kalish, reportedly the court-appointed accountant now handling the affairs of the estate, Rich Hiett (RWQCB), and Rob Weston and I (ACDEH). I told Mr. Rose that one of the crucial elements of this case, now that ACDEH realized that there was at least one other PRP, was to identify on which parcel, or parcels, the environmental and compliance problems were found. I explained further that Mr. Mull agreed to have a site survey conducted to resolve this basic issue. Further, Barbara Holland volunteered to begin the removal of extraneous "junk" from the site, and to explore the need for better security at the site. Mr. Rose said that whatever Ms. Holland had agreed to was not binding.

I told Mr. Rose that, on September 27, 1993, I drove by the site to note whether any changes to the site had occurred so that I would be well informed at the Pre-Enforcement Review Panel (PERP) meeting slated two days later on September 29. As I drove past the site, northbound on E.14th, I saw a survey crew at the site actively

performing an apparent survey of the site. I told Mr. Rose that I was "tickled" that this was occurring, and that I was hopeful that this new information would be presented at the September 29 PERP. As you are aware, it was not. I told Mr. Rose that I can only conclude that, by not presenting the results of the survey, whether at the PERP or some later time, the results of this survey were likely not favorable to whomever paid for it to be performed.

I described the security problems with kids using the site as a shortcut to and from E. 14th Street, proximity of the elementary school and Little League fields, and my perception of the liability issues should someone be injured while crossing the site. I described the fact that there are approximately 8-10 USTs and 18 above-ground tanks abandoned at the site. I discussed the noteworthy contamination, and the habit of contaminants to ignore property boundaries as they make their way through the subsurface.

Mr. Rose said he'd really like to get to the meat of this case and the RP issues, too, but there is simply not enough time now, particularly with the Holidays upon us, to complete these tasks within the deadline contained in the November 29 RWQCB letter. He feared the \$1000/day penalties. I tried to impress upon Mr. Rose that it is not our intent to levy fines for the sake of levying fines. Our intent is to simply get the needed work done and to get this case moving, and to tap into whomever and whatever resources are needed to realize this goal. The fine is merely the bat held over the parties' heads.

Mr. Rose said that he now understood our intent, but because of the time frame requirements of such RWQCB "orders," he was up against the wall to file a pettition, or lose the opportunity to do so in the future. I said that I would grant whatever additional time he needed to get these issues resolved. He suggested an additional 90 days. I said "fine." However, he said that some official protocol had to be followed to "rescind" the "order" or something to that affect. I said that it sounded like he should speak to you about the language to be drafted into whatever letter I need to write to affect a deadline extension. I requested he contact you.

Please advise me in this matter.

Additionally, I provided Mr. Rose with a copy of the Assessor's map I have showing the subject site and parcels comprising it. In exchange, Mr. Rose said he would send me map he acquired which shows the locations of the tanks (!) with an overlay of some sort. I sent my map via facsimile yesterday afternoon.

Dear Ms. Holland, Mr. Kalish, and Heirs:

It has been brought to my attention by Regional Board staff that a condition of soil and groundwater pollution exists on the property located at 16301 East 14th Street, San Leandro, from an underground storage tank release. The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACHD) staff have requested technical reports from you to fulfill your obligations per California Code of Regulations, Title 23 Waters, Chapter 16, Underground Storage Tank Regulations, Article 11, Corrective Action Requirements. It is my understanding that ACHD staff have been provided conflicting reports as to the accountability of one or more of the parties to which the letter is addressed.

Enforcement Review Panel Page 2 of 3

A Pre-Enforcement Review Panel was held at the ACHD offices on September 29, 1993, attended by Mr. Richard Hiett of my staff. Pursuant to the Regional Board's authority under Section 13267 (b) of the California Water Code, you are hereby found to be a responsible party as defined by Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 11, Section 2720. A Responsible Party is "any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use." A responsible party also includes any owner of property from which an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred.

As a responsible party, you are required to conduct both soil and groundwater investigations to determine the extent of the environmental pollution resulting from the release. You are also required to perform a minimum of monitoring and sampling of the wells presently located at the site, and submit summary reports documenting the results of this work.

Therefore, within 45 days of the date of this letter, you are requested to submit technical reports specifically addressing the following numbered items:

- A Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA) work plan to define the lateral and vertical extent of pollution in soil and groundwater;
  - As a result of widespread pollution, determine the whereabouts of all above-ground and below-ground tanks on <u>all</u> parcels comprising this contiguous site. The specific parcels affected by this requirement are: 80C-479-6-3, 80C-479-6-4, 80C-479-6-11, and 80C-479-6-11 and 80C-479-13. Survey and clearly mark each parcel in the field using standard survey methods. Report the results. This report must, among other elements, include a copy of a licensed land surveyor's map depicting locations of each tank relative to each parcel;
- The above-ground and below-ground tanks must be properly decommissioned/closed in accordance with Title 23, California Code of Regulations, the Alameda County Fire Code, and other requirements of the ACHD;
  - Appropriate security from trespassers must be provided. Submit a status report describing the means used to provide security at the site, particularly those portions of the perimeter adjacent to the elementary school and baseball field;
  - 5) Investigation summary reports must be submitted quarterly.

All work should adhere to the requirements of the <u>Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendations for the Preliminary Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Storage Tank Sites - August 10, 1990 and Article 11 of Title 23, Waters, California Code of Regulations.</u>

I am hereby transmitting this request for a technical report to ACHD for service and continued case handling. You should be aware that failure on your part to submit the requested technical report, or late submittal may result in fines up to \$1000 per day of delinquency. Your response to this technical report request should be sent to the attention of Mr. Scott Seery at ACHD. Please inform Mr. Seery at least three working days in advance of all field activities.

Please be advised that this is a formal request for a technical reports pursuant to California Water Code Section 13267 (b). Any extensions of the stated deadlines, or modifications of the required tasks, must be confirmed in writing by either this agency or the ACHD.

Dear Ms. Holland:

As you are aware, this Department is concerned about the significant environmental contamination and compliance problems associated with the referenced site. A report documenting the results of a soil investigation performed by Crosby and Overton in September 1990, and previous work conducted by this Department in April 1989, indicates the presence of severe surface and subsurface soil contamination in proximity to two (2) of eight (8) underground storage tanks (UST) at this site. Ground water contamination is highly suspected. An Underground Storage Tank Unauthorized Release Report was issued on October 31, 1990 as a result of these findings. The subject USTs are currently unpermitted, unmonitored, and are essentially abandoned in place, direct violations of requirements set forth in Chapter 6.7 of the California Health and Safety Code, and Title 23, California Code of Regulations.

You were advised in correspondence from this Department dated December 4, 1990 that additional environmental site characterization was required, the scope of which was to include the installation of ground water monitoring wells, among other elements. A work plan addressing these tasks was due within 30 days. To date, no work plan has been submitted.

Further, severe surface soil contamination is evident in areas proximal to the 15<sup>th</sup> above ground storage tanks. These tanks previously held a variety of petroleum products, and are also presently abandoned.

You are hereby directed to submit a Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA) work plan detailing actions to assess the extent of both soil and ground water contamination associated with the subject site. You are also directed to submit application to properly close all eight (8) USTs, and to remove and decommission the aboveground tanks. The referenced PSA work plan, UST closure application, and aboveground tank removal plans are to be submitted forthwith.

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

I have reviewed your subsurface soil investigation report that was prepared by Crosby and Overton for the above site. The report revealed elevated levels of TPH as diesel (up to 25,000 ppm) and benzene, toluene, xylene and ethylbenzene in all of the exploratory boreholes from the surface to total depth of testing.

I concur with your consultant that additional investigative work at the above site is warranted, including the drilling and sampling of additional exploratory boreholes and groundwater monitoring wells to fully characterize the contamination plume.

Please submit this plan within thirty (30) days of the receipt of this letter.

In addition, please submit another deposit/refund check for \$558.00, made payable to the County of Alameda.





Jack Holland, Sr. Oil Corp. proposes to initiate a sampling program to determine the vertical and lateral extent of diesel-contaminated soil at their facility located at 16301 E. 14th Street in San Leandro, California.

Five exploratory boreholes will be drilled in and about the area of contaminated soil (see site plan). All of the boreholes will be sampled at 5 feet below ground surface (bgs) and 10 feet bgs. Each sample will be discreetly analyzed for TPH as diesel. Should obvious contaminated exceed 10 feet in depth, the borehole will be advanced until either no more obvious contamination is encountered, or groundwater is encountered. An additional sample will be obtained at that depth.

Standard DOHS and SFBRWQCB methodologies will be utilized during every facet of the project. Drill cuttings will be drummed, labeled and left on site pending analytical results.

The project will commence within 30 days from the date of this letter. A complete report, detailing methodology and including borehole lithologic logs, analytical data, chain of custody documentation, conclusions and recommendations, will be submitted to your office upon the projects conclusion.

A plan for remediation will be drafted and submitted to your office immediately following the report.



An inspection of the above site was performed on April 21, 1989, by Larry Seto from our office, in your presence. At that time, four split soil samples were taken above two of your underground diesel tanks (5,000 and 6,000 gallon). Diesel was detected in the soil from both sites with concentrations of 20,6000 ppm and 20,100 ppm. In addition, your eight underground tanks are not registered.

Please be aware, you are in violation of the following sections of the Hazardous Waste Control Law.

Section 25189.5, Chapter 6.95, California Health and Safety Code for the disposal of a hazardous waste at an unauthorized point.
