Barry Swenson Builders would like to construct a mixed residential and retail development on the 4-acre Groth Brothers property. Development would be high density with 4 floor tower and involve a below ground parking structure; they anticipate excavating throughout site to about 12 feet bgs. There are multiple sellers of the site; deal is supposed to close next Monday. They want to break ground in 16 months.

Bureau Veritas is in the process of conducting a Phase II investigation. Historic uses include two service stations, one machine shop, Groth USTs. Potential for pipelines from the former bulk storage facility at Mill Springs Apartments to extend to Groth Brothers property were discussed. Northern half of the property was a railyard. Fill material to about 4 feet. They have detected lead at up to 800 ppm.

ACEH indicated that source area remediation was required for the Valley Gas site. Source area is not rigidly defined but includes an area within the Groth property. Jon Rosso of Bureau Veritas indicated that soil vapor intrusion issues can be dealt with by engineering controls such as a vapor barrier but issue of access for groundwater remediation is problematic. The concept of providing access for groundwater remediation in the development was discussed. Swenson questioned whether the County could require access. ACEH indicated that we can take steps to require access for remediation.

AB389 agreement was discussed for Swenson and potential to use Water Board or DTSC was discussed. Would be faster to go through a Prospective Purchaser Agreement but PPA now go through the Board and take more than two months.

In correspondence dated December 22, 1997 and November 30, 1999, ACEH requested that you decommission the monitoring well at the site. In order for your case to be closed and a remedial action completion certificate issued, the monitoring well at the site must be properly decommissioned. SECOND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Groth:

On June 13, 1994, the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division, sent you a letter (attached) requesting that a quarterly monitoring schedule be implemented for 59 South L Street, Livermore. As of the date of this letter, however, we have not received any communication from you on this matter, nor have we received any quarterly monitoring reports. Therefore, this letter constitutes a <u>Second Notice</u> that you are in violation of specific laws and that the technical report is due.

According to Section 25298 of the California Health and Safety Code, underground storage tank closure is incomplete until the responsible party characterizes and remediates the contamination resulting from product discharge. Therefore, you, as the responsible party are in violation of this section of the Code, for which Section 25299 specifies civil penalties of up to \$5,000, for each day of violation, upon conviction. Also, failure to furnish technical reports regarding documented or potential groundwater contamination violates Section 13267(b) of the California Water Code. The Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) can impose civil penalties of up to \$1,000 per day that such a violation continues.

You are required to reinstate a quarterly schedule of well sampling and monitoring. Technical summary reports documenting each well sampling and monitoring episode are also due quarterly. This schedule shall continue until further notice.

Failure to respond may result in referral of this case to the RWQCB or Alameda County District Attorney to consider for enforcement action. Modification of required tasks or extensions of stated deadlines must be confirmed in writing by either this agency or the RWQCB.

As per our phone conversation on April 27, 1994, four (4) soil samples, one sample per boring, were collected for laboratory analyses during the limited subsurface investigation performed by GeoStrategies Inc. (GSI) on April 26, 1994 at the subject site. These soil samples included three from the bottom of borings B-1 through B-3 (collected at sixteen feet below grade [fbg]), and a fourth collected from within the capillary fringe in boring B-4 at 35.5 fbg.

As requested by you, these four samples were submitted for laboratory analyses, and analyzed for total petroleum hydrocarbons reported as gasoline (TPH-G), as diesel (TPH-D), and as motor oil (TPH-MO) using modified Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Method 8015; volatile organic compounds (VOCs), including benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and total xylenes (BTEX), using EPA Method 8240; total oil and grease (TOG) using EPA Method 418.1; and metals cadmium (Cd), chromium (Cr), nickel (Ni), lead (Pb), and zinc (Zn) using EPA Methods 6000/7000 series. Analysis for polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and base/acid neutrals (BNAs) is not required for this investigation.

The 4 soil samples were submitted under Chain-of-Custody Documentation to a State-certified hazardous waste testing laboratory on April 28, 1994.

Boring B-4 was converted into groundwater monitoring well MW-1, which was developed and sampled on May 2, 1994. The water samples collected

from well MW-1 were submitted for laboratory analysis and analyzed for TPH-G, TPH-D, and TPH-MO using modified EPA Method 8015; VOCs (including BTEX) using EPA Method 8240; TOG using EPA 418.1; and metals Cd, Cr, Ni, Pb, and Zn using EPA Methods 6000/7000 series.

Upon receipt of the laboratory results of the soil and water samples, a report detailing field methods, findings, and results of the investigation will be prepared and submitted to you for your files.

I have completed review of GeoStrategies' March 1994 Work Plan for a Subsurface Investigation Relating to Waste Oil Hydrocarbons for the above referenced site. The proposal to advance four borings around the former waste oil tank and converting one of the borings into a monitoring well to determine the extent of hydrocarbon contamination in soil and groundwater is acceptable. Field activities should commence within 45 days of the date of this letter. Please notify this office at least 72 hours prior to the start of field work.

When two underground storage tanks were closed in place beneath the service bays, soil samples were collected from beneath the southern tank only. Due to the existing building structure, the advancement of another angle boring beneath the northern tank would not be feasible and will not be required at this time.

SECOND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Groth:

On June 15, 1993, the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division, sent you a letter requesting a workplan in the form of a Preliminary Site Assessment detailing the work intended to determine the extent of soil and water contamination on-site due to the unauthorized release of fuel products at 59 South L Street, Livermore. As of the date of this letter, however, we have not received a Workplan for the investigation. Therefore, this letter constitutes a Second Notice that you are in violation of specific laws and that the technical report is due.

According to Section 25298 of the California Health and Safety Code, underground storage tank closure is incomplete until the responsible party characterizes and remediates the contamination resulting from product discharge. Therefore, you, as the responsible party are in violation of this section of the Code, for which Section 25299 specifies civil penalties of up to \$5,000, for each day of violation, upon conviction. Also, failure to furnish technical reports regarding documented or potential groundwater contamination violates Section 13267(b) of the California Water Code. The Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) can impose civil penalties of up to \$1,000 per day that such a violation continues.

You are required to submit a workplan to this office within 45 days from the date of this letter. Failure to respond will result in referral of this case to the RWQCB or Alameda County District Attorney to consider for enforcement action. Modification of required tasks or extensions of stated deadlines must be confirmed in writing by either this agency or the RWQCB.

With the extensive Federal, State, County and City taxes that we already pay plus all the necessary health benefits to our people, I find I cannot take on another financial burden at this time.

We have tried to abide by all rules and regulations governing the hazardous waste removing five (5) underground storage tanks (UST) in October, 1990, and taking care of our daily waste in a safe manner.

The additional work you want done on our leased property would create a major financial burden and I cannot reasonably justify any type of expenditures at this time.

We are asking for a continuance because as you are well aware of how "good" the automotive market has been to us in the past few years, we must put our employees and their families first.

Thank you in advance for your consideration in this matter.



Dear Mr. Groth:

This office has completed review of the case file for the above referenced site. When five (5) underground storage tanks (UST) were removed in October 1990, elevated levels of petroleum products (870 parts per million total petroleum hydrocarbons, ppm TPH, as motor oil, and 1,100 ppm total oil and grease), was detected from soil samples taken from beneath the waste oil tank.

In March 1991 two (2) USTs beneath the service building was closed in place. An angle boring was advanced beneath the USTs, where soil samples collected exhibited up to 260 ppm TPH as motor oil.

Elevated levels of contaminants resulting from the release due to the USTs at this site has required additional investigative actions, as requested in a letter dated June 5, 1991, from Mr. Gil Wistar of this office.

To date we are not in receipt of a workplan for the determination of the extent of contamination at this site. At this time, you are required to initiate this site assessment. Such an investigation shall be in the form of a **Preliminary Site**Assessment, or PSA. The information gathered by the PSA will be used to determine an appropriate course of action to remediate the site, if deemed necessary. The PSA must be conducted in accordance with the RWQCB Staff Recommendations for the Initial Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tanks, and Article 11 of Title 23, California Code of Regulations. The major elements of such an investigation are summarized in the attached Appendix A.

The PSA proposal is due within 45 days of the date of this letter. Once the proposal is approved, field work should commence within 60 days. A report must be submitted within 45 days after the completion of this phase of work at the site. Subsequent reports are to be submitted <u>quarterly</u> until this site qualifies for RWQCB "sign off." All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist, Certified Engineering Geologist, or Registered Civil Engineer.



NOTICE OF VIOLATION, 59 South L St., Livermore

Dear Mr. Groth:

In a March 11, 1991 letter, this office requested a work plan from Groth Brothers Oldsmobile as a result of contamination found in soil beneath a waste oil tank that was removed in October 1990. In this letter, we established a due date of April 19 for submission of the work plan. As of the date of this letter, we have not received such a document; this constitutes improper closure of an underground tank, a violation of Sec. 25298 of the California Health and Safety Code (CH&SC).

As indicated, analytical results from the waste oil tank showed hydrocarbon levels well above regulatory thresholds for oil & grease and motor oil. These thresholds establish contaminant levels above which the RWQCB requires a site-specific preliminary contaminant assessment. As stated, Groth Brothers Oldsmobile is required to initiate further investigative actions in the vicinity of the former waste oil tank. In addition, new information from the soil boring drilled under the two motor oil tanks to be abandoned in place indicates further soil contamination above regulatory thresholds.

As stated previously, this office will be the lead agency overseeing environmental investigation and cleanup activities at the site. The RWQCB is currently unable to manage the large number of fuel leak cases within Alameda County, and has delegated this authority to our office. However, you must keep the Water Board apprised of all actions taken to characterize and remediate contamination at this site, because the Board retains the ultimate responsibility for ensuring protection of waters of the state and for site signoff.

Groth Brothers Oldsmobile must initiate a preliminary assessment of the extent of soil and groundwater contamination resulting from use of the waste oil and motor oil tanks. The information gathered by

this investigation will be used to assess the need for additional actions at the site. The preliminary assessment should be designed to provide all of the information in the attachment sent to you in the March 11 letter, which is based on RWQCB guidelines. Groth Brothers Oldsmobile shall install at least one monitoring well, if you can verify the direction of groundwater flow in the immediate vicinity of the contaminated pit and abandoned motor oil tanks, and at least three wells otherwise.

Until cleanup is complete, you will need to submit reports to this office and to the RWQCB every three months (or at a more frequent interval, if specified at any time by either agency). These reports must include information pertaining to further investigative results; the methods and costs of cleanup actions implemented to date; and the method and location of disposal of any contaminated material.

Soils contaminated at hazardous waste concentrations (defined specifically as above 1,000 ppm hydrocarbons) should be transported by a licensed hazardous waste hauler and disposed of or treated at a facility approved by the California Department of Health Services. Soils contaminated below the hazardous waste threshold may be managed as nonhazardous, but are still subject to the RWQCB's waste discharge requirements. Copies of manifests for such disposal must be sent to this office. Following the tanks' removal and overexcavation last October, contaminated soil was transported to the Railroad Ave. lot for storage. Please supply this office with detailed information on how this soil, which contains dichlorobenzenes as well as petroleum hydrocarbons, will be treated or disposed of.

Your work plan is to be submitted to this office no later than June 26, 1991. Copies of the proposal should also be sent to the RWQCB (attention: Lester Feldman). Because we are overseeing this site under the designated authority of the Water Board, this letter constitutes a formal request for technical reports, per Sec. 13267(b) of the California Water Code. Failure to respond in a timely manner could result in civil liabilities under the Water Code of up to \$1,000 per day. Other violations of California law, such as Sec. 25299, CH&SC, may also be cited.

Regarding the results of rinsate from the two motor oil tanks that Groth Brothers Oldsmobile intends to close in place, they are too high to permit grouting or filling of the tanks at this time. At 2,000 ppm and 1,300 ppm oil & grease respectively, these rinsate samples suggest that the tanks still have residual hydrocarbons in them that require more thorough cleaning. We will not permit the tanks to be grouted or filled until rinsate samples from both tanks are below 100 ppm oil & grease using method 5520 B.



Dear Mr. Groth:

In October 1990, Scott Co. removed five underground storage tanks from the above location. According to Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) rules, sample results from beneath four of the five tanks indicate no further work need be done at this time at these four tanks. This includes the three tanks from Railroad Ave., and the gasoline tank adjacent to the showroom floor. However, in the case of the former waste oil tank, analytical results indicated hydrocarbon levels well above regulatory thresholds for oil & grease and motor oil. These thresholds establish contaminant levels above which the RWQCB requires a site-specific preliminary contaminant assessment. Therefore, Groth Brothers Oldsmobile must now initiate further investigative actions in the vicinity of the former waste oil tank; this will initially require a work plan to be submitted, according to the points raised in this letter and its attachment.

This office will be the lead agency overseeing environmental investigation and cleanup activities at the site. The RWQCB is currently unable to manage the large number of fuel leak cases within Alameda County, and has therefore delegated this authority to our office. However, you must keep the Water Board apprised of all actions taken to characterize and remediate contamination at this site, because the Board retains the ultimate responsibility for ensuring protection of waters of the state.

As mentioned above, Groth Brothers Oldsmobile must conduct a preliminary assessment to determine the extent of soil and groundwater contamination that resulted from use of the waste oil tank. The information gathered by this investigation will be used to assess the need for additional actions at the site. The preliminary assessment should be designed to provide all of the information in the format shown in the attachment at the end of this letter, which is based on RWQCB guidelines. Your firm should be prepared to install one monitoring well, if you can verify the direction of groundwater flow in the immediate vicinity of the contaminated pit, and three wells if you cannot.

Until cleanup is complete, you will need to submit reports to this office and to the RWQCB every three months (or at a more frequent interval, if specified at any time by either agency). These reports must include information pertaining to further investigative results; the methods and costs of cleanup actions implemented to date; and the method and location of disposal of any contaminated material.

Soils contaminated at hazardous waste concentrations (defined specifically as above 1,000 ppm hydrocarbons) should be transported by a licensed hazardous waste hauler and disposed of or treated at a facility approved by the California Department of Health Services. Soils contaminated below the hazardous waste threshold may be managed as nonhazardous, but are still subject to the RWQCB's waste discharge requirements. Copies of manifests for such disposal must be sent to this office. Following the tanks' removal and overexcavation last October, contaminated soil was transported to the Railroad Ave. lot for storage. Please supply this office with detailed information on how this soil, which contains dichlorobenzenes as well as petroleum hydrocarbons, will be treated or disposed of.

Your work plan is to be submitted to this office no later than April 19, 1991. Copies of the proposal should also be sent to the RWQCB (attention: Lester Feldman). Because we are overseeing this site under the designated authority of the Water Board, this letter constitutes a formal request for technical reports, per Sec. 13267(b) of the California Water Code. Failure to respond in a timely manner could result in civil liabilities under the Water Code of up to \$1,000 per day. Other violations of California law may also be cited.







Mr. Rodda will have in his possession two A:B:C: rated fire extinguishers and Type C protective clothing. Also, he will have a first aid kit and telephone numbers of nearest medical facilities. Scott Co. personnel will have respirators on site should an emergency occur.

Upon arrival at the site, Scott Co. personnel will set up physical barriers around the trench. Fire extinguishers and first aid kit will be set out in an appropriate, accessible spot.

The explosive meter that can detect the level of oxygen and hydrocarbon will be supplied by the contractor and operated by Mr. Rodda. After the tank has been triple rinsed, 15 pounds of dry ice per 1,000 gallons of tank capacity will be applied.

All Scott Co. Environmental personnel have received 40 hours of OSHA Training, thus providing them with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform hazardous waste operations with minimal risk to their safety and health.


Scott Co. has a policy in which all State certified Environmental personnel are required to have annual physicals to certify them for use of respirators. These records are maintained in our office.

The site will be controlled to reduce the possibility of environmental incidents involving hazardous substances by:

- Setting up security and physical barriers to exclude unnecessary personnel from the general area, and
- minimizing the number or personnel and equipment on-site consistent with effective operations.

All tools used at the underground storage tank removal are cleaned on site by tapping and/or scrapping excess dirt and/or petroleum product onto the spoils pile.

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



MECHANICAL HAZARDS

- Verify that all equipment is in good condition.
- Do not stand or walk under elevated loads of ladders.
- Do not stand near unguarded excavation and trenches.
- Do not enter excavation or trenches over 5 feet deep that are not properly guarded, shored, or sloped.

TEMPERATURE HAZARDS

Heat Stress

o When temperature exceeds 70°F, take frequent breaks in shaded area. Unzip or remove coveralls during breaks. Have cool water or electrolyte replenishment solution available. Drink small amounts frequently to avoid dehydration. Count the pulse rate for 30 seconds as early as possible in the rest period. If the pulse rate exceeds 110 beats per minute at the beginning of the rest period, shorten the work cycle by one-third.

Cold Stress

- Wear multilayer cold weather outfits. The outer layer should be of wind resistant fabric.
- o 0° to -30°F total work time is 4 hours. Alternate 1 hour in and 1 hour out of the low-temperature area. Below -30°F, consult industrial hygienist.
- Drink warm fluid. Provide warm shelter for resting. Use buddy system.
 Avoid heavy sweating.

ACOUSTICAL HAZARDS

 Use earplugs or earmuffs when noise level prevents conversation in normal voice at distance of three feet.

02 DEFICIENCY - CONFINED SPACE HAZARDS

Confined spaces include trenches, pits, sumps, elevator shafts, tunnels, or any other area where circulation of fresh air is restricted or ability to readily escape from the area is restricted. Consult DHSO and Corporate Health and Safety Policy prior to entering confined space.

- Obtain permit for confined space entry.
- At least one person must be on standby outside the confined space who
 is capable of pulling workers from confined space in an emergency.
- Work involving the use of flame, arc, spark, or other source of ignition is prohibited within a confined space.
