Hi Jerry,

Neal Fujita asked me to request for extension for the EBRPD Redwood Site (Case No RO0000246) Pilot Test Workplan that you requested in your letter dated March 24, 2009.

While the EBRPD understands that current bioventing remedy is not doing enough to remedy the site and that limited injection of ORC near MW-2 was designed to see if the ORC could locally mitigate the increasing concentrations at that well, it is clear that in the longer run some more effective remedy must be instituted at the former source area, which the historical data suggests had significant contaminant mass left in place that is continuing to impact the groundwater.

In order to have more time to fully evaluate the options we would like to request a 90 day extension, until August 27, 2009, for the pilot test workplan development.

The monitoring reports will be on the schedule indicated.

This will also allow for another Q-monitoring period to evaluate the effect of the local ORC injection around MW-2.
