Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

- 1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."
- 2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."
- 3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."
- 4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

ACEH has named the responsible parties for this site as detailed below.

Responsible Party Identification

Existence of Unauthorized Release

During the installation of new dispensers at the Shell station in September 1982, a leak from damaged fiberglass piping connected to an underground storage tank (UST) at the site was reported. The release was reported as approximately 3,200 gallons of super unleaded gasoline. An Unauthorized Release Report was submitted on September 10, 1982. In response to the release, five tank backfill wells (S-1 through S-4, and S-11) and six groundwater monitoring wells (S-5 through S-10) were installed at the site sometime prior to August 1983. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected during product piping and dispenser upgrade activities in 2004. Shell submitted an Unauthorized Release Report on October 15, 2004. Site investigation activities and groundwater monitoring conducted since 1983 have detected petroleum hydrocarbons in soil and groundwater, confirming that an unauthorized release has occurred at the site.

Responsible Party Identification

Shell Oil Company was identified as a responsible party for the site in a Notice of Responsibility dated January 2, 1992. Shell Oil Products US is a responsible party for the fuel leak case because they or their corporate predecessors owned and operated the USTs (Definition 1), owned property where an unauthorized release from a UST occurred (Definition 3), and had control of the USTs at the time of an unauthorized release (Definition 4).

Au Energy LLC purchased the property in March 2010 and is the current property owner. Au Energy LLC is a responsible party because they are the current owners of a property where an unauthorized release from a UST has occurred (Definition 3).
