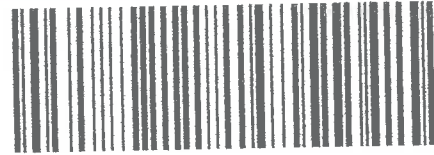

Dear Resident:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) is providing regulatory oversight for the investigation and cleanup of a fuel release from the subject property. Investigation and cleanup activities have been ongoing since 1991. Investigation activities in 2007 revealed the presence of off-site contamination near the property located at 3020 Bartlett Street in Oakland as depicted on Figure 6 (attached).

The subject case may be nearing closure consideration. As part of the closure process ACDEH has requested the Responsible Party to collect additional data to determine whether the contamination still exists at levels that could pose a human health risk. The investigation activities may include the property located at 3020 Bartlett Street in Oakland and would include installation of a boring to collect soil and ground water samples. The soil bore will be advanced using minimally disruptive techniques. A temporary plastic casing will be inserted into the soil boring to allow monitoring and sampling of shallow groundwater over the next several months.

ACDEH requests that you cooperate with the Responsible Party and his consultant by allowing them access to perform the work requested by our agency. The property owners, Joe Lam and Lai Yu, have also been contacted and are included as a cc to this letter. We would like to meet with you and the property owners to discuss this request.
