Ms. Shin requested that the well (proposed) be placed closer to the area formerly observed to be contaminated (within 10 feet). Mr. Niebauer stated that the proposed monitoring well, at the corner of the property, is as close to the formerly contaminated area as they could get, due to the canopy. Ms. Shin stated that the proposed location was acceptable, ~~and~~ because of the obstruction of the canopy. Mr. Niebauer stated that the wells were going to be installed tomorrow. The locations at the site are already marked.
