#### TIME LINE OF EVENTS

# Oro Loma Sanitary District Closure Of 1,000 Gallon Tank Site 2600 Grant Avenue, San Lorenzo, California

1978: This 1,000 gallon tank was installed as the replacement for a pre-existing tank installed in 1961. Until 1985 it stored leaded gasoline. Convenied to unleaded gas and used until 1994. No leakage had been noted by records, etc.

1989 OLSD begins project to remediate possible only contamination around its two USTs, the subject gasoline tank and a dissol tank.

1990 Mike Cortez becomes project engineer. RFP issued for remediation of the two

1991(Jan-July)US Navy calls Mike Cortez to active duty and sent to Persian Gulf. No project activity.

1993 Remediation contract awarded to Levine Fricke. Diesel tank removal/remediation proceeds slowly.

8/19/1993 Levine Fricke, drills and samples the parking lot around the gasoline tank. AEN's test results dated 8/31/93. No formal report prepared. [Results included in SG's work plan see below.]

10/26/1994 The Sutton Group joins project submitting Work Plan for Stage II Tank Removal Investigation, 1,000 Gallon Gasoline Tank to Alameda County (Juliet Shin)

Report issued: Stage II Tank Removal Investigation, 1,000 Gallon Gasoline, Tank Site at 2600 Grant Avenue, San Lorenzo, California, prepared by The Sutton Group for Oro Loma Sanitary District, San Lorenzo, California, dated November 23, 1994.

1 to 3/1995 Bids prepared, advertised, reviewed for tank removal. Rains delayed work start.

1/11/1995 Initial contact with State UST Fund (Cheryl Gordon) re cost reimbursement.

5/3/1995 Tank is removed. Amy Leach on site for Alameda County

6/7/1995 Report of Removal of 1,000 Gallon Gasoline Tank Oro Loma Sanitary District Service Center, San Lorenzo, California, dated June 7, 1995 issued to ACEH.

Remedial alternatives were evaluated, especially bulk soil removal. Stability of the District's Engineering Building was evaluated, including performance of a geotechnical investigation to evaluate shoring requirements during the investigation. The report Geotechnical Investigation for 1,000 Gallon Gasoline

Tank Site Closure at 2600 Grant Avenue, San Lorenzo, California, prepared by The Sutton Group, dated August 30, 1995.

10/5/1995 Meeting at the site among Amy Leach, Juliet Shin and Tom Peacock of ACEH and Jim Bissell, Mike Cameron and Mike Cortez of OLSD. Resulted in the 11/9/1995 letter from ACEH requesting a soil and groundwater investigation (SWI). Tom Peacock of ACEH introduced the concept of Non-Attainment Zones from the LLNL study.

The results of the geotechnical study were incorporated into The Sutton Group's Report: of Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study and Proposed Corrective Action Plan for 1.000 Gallen Gasoline Tank Site at 2600 Grant Avenue, San Lorenzo, California, dated December 6, 1995 which was submitted to Alameda County.

12/8/1995 Sutton and Amy Leach: discussion of RWQCB's implementation of Non-Attainment Zones (LLNL study).

1/9/1996 The Sutton Group/OLSD submits its Work Plan for Soil and Ground Water Investigations for both the Gasoline Tank and for a Diesel Tank site to ACEH.

Report of Soil and Ground Water Investigations at the Former Site of a 1,000 Gallon Gasoline Tank at the Oro Loma Sanitary District Service Center, San Lorenzo, California dated May 15, 1996 submitted to Amy Leach at ACEH in draft form. Amy was working on the Thompson Fence site tank investigation across Grant Avenue. 5/21/1996 Amy Leach's comments received.

6/7/1996 The finalized gasoline area investigation report issued to ACEH. The report for the diesel tank area investigation was also dated June 7, 1996.

7/24/1996 John Sutton discusses the SWI report with Madhalla Logan of ACEH

Meeting with \*\*Leach, documented in ACEH's letter to OLSD dated 8/12/1996: Letter states "the extent of the contaminant plume has been adequately defined to the north, northwest, and southeast. \*\*Homeon additional plan is to include a Tier 1 RBCA evaluation of health risk to occupants of the District's Engineering Building, under which the plume extends.

8/29/1996 John Sutton discusses Tier 2 RECA risk assessment parameters with Mindbulla Logan of ACBII.

9/10/1996 Site status meeting among Amy Leach, District staff (Cameron, Bissell, Cortez) and Sutton.

Site meeting among Amy Leach, Kevin Graves (RWQCB), District staff (Cameron, Bissell, Cortez) and Sucton including discussion of (a) the beneficial effects of the rodent-proofing slab beneath the Engineering Building in regard to its preventing vapors migrating from the soil to the work space; and (b) the POTW as ground water plume receiver/bio-reactor, thus no offsite contaminant migration to Grant Avenue, and no other properties to the standard of plume. This would be a satisfactory solution but to be proven by farther the staff gation.

9/15/1997 Letter from Brian Oliva of ACEH, introducing himself as Case Officer, Brian visits the site, extends work plan submittal date.

Submittal of Work Plan for Supplemental Site Evaluation in the vicinity of the former site of the 1,000 Gallon Gasoline Tank, including RBCA health risk assessment for Engineering Building prepared by certified professional risk assessor acceptable to RWQCB and ACEH. Work plan by The Sutton Croup
