Dear Mr. Detterman:

Stratus Environmental, Inc. (Stratus), on behalf of Mr. Seung Lee, has prepared this document for the German Autocraft Facility located at 301 East 14th Street, San Leandro, California. During the quarterly groundwater monitoring and sampling event on September 8, 2011, the Stratus technician noted that off-site monitoring well MW-6 had been damaged by the subsidence of its well box and surrounding pavement, caused by vehicle traffic over the box. Following receipt of Alameda County Environmental Health Services (ACEHS) email correspondence dated October 6, 2011, in which ACEHS concurred with Stratus's plan to destroy the well without replacement, Stratus proceeded with the proper destruction of the monitoring well. A site plan depicting the location of the well is attached.

Prior to initiating the well abandonment, a well abandonment permit (attached) was obtained from Alameda County Public Works Agency (ACPWA). A licensed drilling contractor (RSI Drilling, recently merged with Cascade Drilling, LLP, C-57 #938110) performed the well destruction activities. All work was completed under the direction of a California Professional Geologist.

On November 21, 2011, monitoring well MW-6 was destroyed by over-drilling. First, the wellbox and surrounding concrete collar were removed using hand tools. The well was then destroyed by over-drilling the entire length of the well, to a total depth of 37 feet below ground surface (bgs). The remaining borehole was backfilled using neat Portland cement grout, using a tremmie pipe to insert the grout from the bottom of the borehole. All soil cuttings and groundwater produced during the over-drilling and grouting process were collected and placed in DOT-rated 55-gallon drums and stored onsite pending disposal. Finally, the borehole was capped with a concrete patch at surface grade.

Following completion of the well destruction, Stratus submitted a *Well Completion Report* to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) and to ACPWA under separate cover.

Specific Work Permit Conditions

- 1. Drilling Permit(s) can be voided/ cancelled only in writing. It is the applicant's responsibility to notify Alameda County Public Works Agency, Water Resources Section in writing for an extension or to cancel the drilling permit application. No drilling permit application(s) shall be extended beyond ninety (90) days from the original start date. Applicants may not cancel a drilling permit application after the completion date of the permit issued has passed.
- 2. Prior to any drilling activities, it shall be the applicant's responsibility to contact and coordinate an Underground Service Alert (USA), obtain encroachment permit(s), excavation permit(s) or any other permits or agreements required for that Federal, State, County or City, and follow all City or County Ordinances. No work shall begin until all the permits and requirements have been approved or obtained. It shall also be the applicants responsibilities to provide to the Cities or to Alameda County an Traffic Safety Plan for any lane closures or detours planned. No work shall begin until all the permits and requirements have been approved or obtained.
- 3. Compliance with the well-sealing specifications shall not exempt the well-sealing contractor from complying with appropriate State reporting-requirements related to well construction or destruction (Sections 13750 through 13755 (Division 7, Chapter 10, Article 3) of the California Water Code). Contractor must complete State DWR Form 188 and mail original to the Alameda County Public Works Agency, Water Resources Section, within 60 days. Including permit number and site map.
- 4. Applicant shall submit the copies of the approved encroachment permit to this office within 60 days.
- 5. Permittee shall assume entire responsibility for all activities and uses under this permit and shall indemnify, defend and save the Alameda County Public Works Agency, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any and

all expense, cost and liability in connection with or resulting from the exercise of this Permit including, but not limited to, property damage, personal injury and wrongful death.

- 6. Applicant shall contact Vicky Hamlin for an inspection time at 510-670-5443 or email to vickyh@acpwa.org at least five (5) working days prior to starting, once the permit has been approved. Confirm the scheduled date(s) at least 24 hours prior to drilling.
- 7. Permittee, permittee's contractors, consultants or agents shall be responsible to assure that all material or waters generated during drilling, boring destruction, and/or other activities associated with this Permit will be safely handled, properly managed, and disposed of according to all applicable federal, state, and local statutes regulating such. In no case shall these materials and/or waters be allowed to enter, or potentially enter, on or off-site storm sewers, dry wells, or waterways or be allowed to move off the property where work is being completed.
- 8. Remove the Christy box or similar structure. Destroy well by overdrilling & Tremie Grouting with Cement. After the seal has set, backfill the remaining hole with concrete or compacted material to match existing.
- 9. Copy of approved drilling permit must be on site at all times. Failure to present or show proof of the approved permit application on site shall result in a fine of \$500.00.
