Jerry,

It's been awhile, hasn't it? I'm at Locus Technologies now.

I've heard there's a problem with PCE at Call Mac. As you know, we started out taking baby steps at that site, and aside from some soil samples in the former AST areas and a sample from the water well, we didn't have any 8260 data. Knowing what I do now, I'm wondering about what exposure I may have had to PCE. From what I can tell, the DO3 excavation was in or near the PCE area, but there were also all those little oil stain excavations that were less than 4 feet deep, where I'd step in and grab a soil sample for PID screening. With a 1 ppm detection limit on the PID, I wouldn't necessarily have picked up on anything and the PCE concentrations may have been significant.

Given what you know of the site, is potential exposure to PCE something I might want to think about?
