Dear Mr. Brown, Mr. Spivey, and Mr. Ward:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the fuel leak case file for the above-referenced site including the recently submitted documents entitled, "Down-Gradient Receptor Survey," dated March 30, 2010 (Receptor Survey), "Groundwater Monitoring and Remediation Report - First Quarter 2010," dated March 15, 2010 (Monitoring Report), and "Work Plan for Groundwater Treatment by Insitu Chemical Oxidation No. 2," dated April 22, 2010 (Work Plan),. All reports were prepared on Shell's behalf by Conestoga-Rovers & Associates. The Receptor Survey presents information on potential receptors downgradient from the site. The First Quarter 2010 Monitoring Report presents groundwater monitoring results and an evaluation and recommendations for insitu chemical oxidation (ISCO) injections. The Work Plan presents plans to implement additional groundwater treatment by ISCO.

The scope of work presented in the April 22, 2010 Work Plan is acceptable and may be implemented as proposed. Based on the information presented in the Receptor Survey report, we request that you collect water samples from selected sumps and spigots as discussed in the technical comments below in order to assess whether the plume of petroleum hydrocarbons is discharging to any of the features described in the Receptor Survey. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the reports described below.

#### **TECHNICAL COMMENTS**

1. Discharges to BART Tunnel. Seepage of petroleum hydrocarbons and water was reported to enter the KE BART tunnel and flow into a drain that conveyed the liquid across the tunnel to a sump and pump station located on the southeast corner of 7<sup>th</sup> and Broadway. The sump and pump station reportedly discharged to the storm drain (Considerations on Infiltration of Gasoline into BART KE Line, prepared by Groundwater Technology, Inc., ACEH case files). The Receptor Survey indicates that the sump remains in use and it is unknown as to whether

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petroleum hydrocarbons have been observed recently. We request that you obtain access to the BART tunnel during non-operational hours to collect water samples from the sump and from the two spigots that were reportedly installed in the driven section of the BART tunnel circa 1980. At a minimum, the water samples are to be analyzed for TPH as gasoline, BTEX, and fuel oxygenates using EPA Method 8260B and sulfate using EPA Method 300.0. Please present the results in a Groundwater Monitoring Report no later than September 15, 2010.

2. Sampling of Sumps. All of the buildings on Broadway between 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenues have basements and three of the buildings have sumps. We request that you collect water samples from the sumps in each of the buildings that have sumps including the Oakland Police Department buildings at 455 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 655 Broadway, the commercial building at 704 Broadway, and the condominium building at 423 7<sup>th</sup> Street. At a minimum, the water samples are to be analyzed for TPH as gasoline, BTEX, and fuel oxygenates using EPA Method 8260B and sulfate using EPA Method 300.0. Please present the results in a Groundwater Monitoring Report no later than September 15, 2010.

### Attachment 1 Responsible Party(ies) Legal Requirements/Obligations

#### REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

#### **ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS**

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website for more information on these requirements (http://www.swrcb.ca.gov/ust/electronic\_submittal/report\_rqmts.shtml.

#### **PERJURY STATEMENT**

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

#### PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

#### UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

#### **AGENCY OVERSIGHT**

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

**SUBJECT:** Electronic Report Upload (ftp) Instructions

The Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

#### **REQUIREMENTS**

- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection. (Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.)
- It is **preferable** that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- Do not password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
  document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password.
   Documents with password protection will not be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#\_Report Name\_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555\_WorkPlan\_2005-06-14)

#### **Additional Recommendations**

A separate copy of the tables in the document should be submitted by e-mail to your Caseworker in Excel format.
 These are for use by assigned Caseworker only.

#### **Submission Instructions**

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password:
