### Dear Responsible Parties:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH), in our 9 October 2017 directive letter, requested that you submit a Final Record Report of Construction no later than 15 January 2018. To date, the report has not been submitted and is late. In order to move this case towards closure, please submit the report. Failure to submit the report would place you in non-compliance status and may subject you to enforcement actions. The ACDEH requires you respond to this notice in writing within 14 days of the date of this letter and not later than 31 January 2018, informing the ACDEH of your plan to regain compliance.

ACDEH's 29 August 2016 directive letter required that you submit a Record Report of Construction no later than 28 October 2016. Your Construction Progress Report, dated 28 October 2016 and prepared by PES Environmental (PES) on your behalf, states that a Final Report would be submitted upon completion of the foundation for the new structure. The Final Report was not submitted as proposed by PES, so the ACDEH 9 October 2017 directive letter required that you submit the Final Report no later than 15 January 2018.

### REPORT & DELIVERABLE REQUESTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

### Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

### Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

### **ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS**

A complete report submittal includes the PDF report and all associated electronic data files, including but not limited to GEO\_MAP, GEO\_XY, GEO\_Z, GEO\_BORE, GEO\_WELL, and laboratory analytical data in Electronic Deliverable Format™ (EDF). This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

### PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. ### AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
