I spoke today with Ray Friedrichson (Thrifty) regarding the status of the remediation system and their future plans for it. Apparently, Tosco, owners of the site, are pushing to have the system removed to accommodate Tosco's desire to change the station to one where no attendant is on duty, an "unmanned" station, if you will. Tosco desires the space now taken up by the remediation system compound to construct facilities they need to complete the station modification.

However, Thrifty recently submitted HC mass removal data that demonstrate the system's continued and historic efficacy, as they report ~ 450 gals of product have been treated since ~1990. Mr. Friedrichson now indicates his report may be flawed due to a failure to employ the appropriate ~~conversion~~ conversion factor (hexane vs. methane equivalents) when calculating HC mass. He now suspects the total HC removal to be closer to 400 gals, as the factors differ by 10X.

Frankly, that mass removal seems more in line with what one would expect from the type of geology encountered @ the site (i.e., silt, clay, shallow H₂O). Mr. Friedrichson will revise these data along with a performance graph, and a proposal to disban the SVE and T_{BT} sys tems.

I spent 4½ hours at the site yesterday during an attempt to restart the S.A.V.E. system's I.C. motor. Also on-site were Mark Spencer of Remediation Management Services (RMS), and Mike Cosby and Egan Eastman of Earth Management Company (EMC). EMC is a subsidiary of Thrift Oil and is their contractor for well sampling and operation of the Thrift remediation systems. RMS is subcontracted by EMC, and is a "licensed" repair and maintenance contractor to RSI, the builder of the S.A.V.E. system.

After a few short-lived periods where the I.C. motor ran, we left the site. But not until the spark plugs, rotor, dist. cap were replaced, the ignition timing checked and adjusted, and both stages of the LPG regulators rebuilt. The system would simply not continue to run.

I spoke with Karl Kerner ~~to me~~ today, and Mike Cosby of Earth Management, Thrifty's consultant. Mr. Cosby claimed to gauge ~~it~~ on the LPG tank, in addition to the pressure release valve, were broken, and that both were repaired ~ October. I told both Messrs. Kerner and Cosby that I had visited the site twice, once in October and again in December, and that the fuel gauge on the noted LPG tank read 35-88% both times. I even tapped the gauge to ensure it was not just stuck, with no change. Hum...

Mr. Cosby said that the inability to obtain fuel was based on Earth Management's stated difficulty in getting fuel deliveries w/o a "cash on delivery" clause. They have since (apparently) contracted w/ Suburban gas. He went on to state that there was an attempt to start the system recently without any luck. He plans to attempt a start-up next week (Jan. 10-16). I requested I be notified so that I may observe.

I reiterated to Mr. Kerner the need for professional registration on all reports, and that I would reject any future reports lacking such. I also requested a written response from Thrifty within 2 weeks addressing

I called Karl Kerner again today. He has yet to return my previous call of 12/18/92. I left another phone message for him.

I reviewed the 3rd qtr. 1992 monitoring report for the site which arrived today. The report was submitted by Pete DiAni of Thrift. It was not presented under ~~the~~ seal of an appropriate California registered geologist, etc. A letter sent Oct. 22, 1992 from this office requested that all future reports, including this one, be under such seal, among other elements requested. Those other elements were ~~not~~ provided in the noted report as requested (e.g., tabulations of GW elevations, isoccentration maps, etc.).

Also, no written response to the operation of the S.A.V.E. system was provided within the requested 15-days. Only a brief statement indicating the S.A.V.E. would be restarted appeared in the closing paragraph of the letter report. No start-up date was indicated.

I spoke with Karl Kerner of Thrifty Oil today. [(310) 923-9876] I asked whether to his knowledge the SAVe treatment system was operational. He indicated that he didn't believe so because of a desire to changeover to a fuel not readily available (LPG?). I told him that the tank's gauge read ~ 88% full. He told me also that Thrifty is in Chapter 11, and that the O & M costs to keep the system on-line, and the need to pay the current consultant, EARTH MANAGEMENT, for the necessary weekly visits, are (apparently) prohibitory at this time. I told Mr. Kerner that I was concerned that what ^{plume} control might have been afforded by operation of the SAVe system in the past may be soon, if not already, lost. I noted that the downgradient well, RS-8, has begun to show hits recently. I reminded him that in getting approval from this office and RWQCB in the past for installing this system, in lieu of excavation of the impacted underlying soils, was that the system be as effective as excavation at removing the source material. I told Mr. Kerner that I'm ^{not} particularly convinced that the system is so effective, particularly when one considers FP is still present on the on-site wells. I told him the plume control is the minimum objective.

I also advised Mr. Kerner that the RWQCB, applying the Business and Professions Code, requires that all reports be under seal / signature of an RC, CEG or RCE. I also requested that all future reports provide a tabulation of DTW measurements, and both TPH and benzene plume maps.

I spoke w/ Mr. Karl Kerner of Thrifty Oil today (213-923-9876) regarding this site. I confirmed that I had received the Feb. 28, 1991 letter to Ray Large requesting access to his property for well installation and periodic monitoring. This letter is in the form of a consent/encroachment agreement, and has space for Mr. Large's signature should he agree to the terms stated in the letter. Mr. Kerner indicated that the letter had not yet been signed/returned by Mr. Large.

Mr. Kerner said that Mr. Large expressed an interest in saying where this (initial) well~~s~~ should go. Mr. Kerner reportedly told Mr. Large that the well site had been discussed w/ this Dept. and its location determined already.

The other off-site wells planned for C.V. Blvd and Stanton Ave. are still in the works. Apparently Thrifty has had to apply for a bond from ACo before they will give encroachment and, other than some "miscommunication" with members of ACo^{PW}, this task is progressing. Once the bond is secured, about 2 weeks are needed to process permits (according to Mr. Kerner). Each well on ACo property requires \$3000 in bonds.

I met Mr. Karl Kerner, an engineer with the Thrifty Oil Company, at the noted site to discuss the potential locations for off-site wells to the south, west and east of the site. Potential well locations to the east would include one advanced on private property owned by Mr. Ray Lange. This property fronts on Castro Valley Blvd and includes a pet store and a dry cleaners. The dry cleaner, R:J Quick Clean, is both owned and operated by Mr. Lange. The second well to the east would be advanced through the sidewalk in front of the pet store, approximately 30' east of the Thrifty site along C.V. Blvd. Two (2) other locations were also discussed. These locations, across C.V. Blvd. from the site near the entrance to a veterinary hospital parking lot, the other on the west side of Stanton Ave, also across the street from the site, but in an upgradient position, were previously approved by this Dept. in October 1989. Encroachment permits from AlCo P.W. have been "in the works" since that time. No off-site wells have yet been advanced.


Mr. Kerner and I met by chance the adjoining property's owner, Mr. Lorge. We discussed briefly with him that Thrifty has been directed by this Dept. to pursue the installation of wells to the east of the Thrifty site, one or two of which will need to be installed on his property, in the parking lot behind the C.V. Blvd. frontages. I told him that Thrifty would be contacting him regarding access.

During our conversation, Mr. Lorge noted that he was aware of the shallow G.W. condition in the area. He explained that, when the Travel Lodge had been built ~4 years before, G.W. entering the basement ~~near~~ parking area posed a significant problem. Mr. Lorge explained that the water is pumped from a sump constructed below the parking lot grade and used to irrigate landscaping about the site. The Travel Lodge, 2532 C.V.Bld, is owned by Mr. Ray Hansen, and is approx. 80-100 yds from the Thrifty Oil site.

Mr. Kerner and I then proceeded to the basement garage of the Travel Lodge. There we located

the sump referred to by Mr. Longe. The sound of trickling water could be heard. Mr. Kerner and I lifted the grate of the sump and peered inside. Our senses were met by the distinct odor of petroleum compounds, reminiscent of old fuel or kerosene, emanating from inside the sump. The sump was being fed by 9 pipes ~~entering~~^{extending} along 3 of the four walls of the sump. The outlets of these pipes were entering from the west, north, and east, and each was discharging G.W. into the sump. A pump was also located inside the sump which apparently cycles periodically, ~~and~~ and is triggered by a float/switch mechanism. There was a ladder extending into the sump. The sump



was approximately 6' deep from grade.

At this moment we met Mr. Hansen. He indicated that the sump is fed by a network of French drains. We requested to see the drawings illustrating this network. Mr. Hansen led us up stairs to his office where he attempted to locate the plan drawings illustrating the drain network. He was not successful.

I advised Mr. Hansen why we were curious about his ~~s~~ sump/drain, and explained that Thrifty was pursuing the impact to G.W. off-site. I further advised Mr. Hansen not to go into the sump w/o another person standing-by because of the dangers of asphyxiation from the H.C. vapors. He then told us that someone had poured waste oil into the drain in the past.

Mr. Kerner and I pondered whether it was the waste oil remnants that produced the odor we ~~detected~~ detected. To determine that, we decided that sample(s) should be collect from the water discharging into the sump, as it flows out of the pipes protruding into the sump.

We told Mr. Hansen that samples of the water will be collected either by this Dept. or Thrifty in the near future.

I spoke with Karl Kerner of Thrifty Oil this afternoon. He indicated RSI is redeveloping the wells and installing ground water pumps this week. They expect to begin pumping and treating before Oct. 9, 1990. He also indicated that it appears that the off-site wells planned in public-right-of-ways are soon to become a reality. Apparently, AlCo P.W. has forwarded paper-work to Thrifty which, when completed, will clear the way for work to begin.

Wendy Wittl of RSI spoke with me today re: this Castro Valley site. She indicated that Circle K Corp had filed for bankruptcy, turning over operations to Thrifty Oil, owners of the site. Site remediation should not be too impacted by this turn of events.

I reminded Ms. Wittl that the next quarterly report is due November 1, 1990. Sampling during the 3rd quarter should have occurred, the results of which to be reported in the Nov. report. The report is also to discuss other activities at the site since the previous report submitted.

I requested that she strongly recommend to her client that wells be installed to the east, on the adjoining property. This is as a result of the groundwater gradient change noted in the last [July 1990] report which indicated H₂O flowed in that direction.

We also discussed the status of off-site well installations along Stanton and C.U. Blvd.

It did not appear to be operating, although the apparent control box west of the station's equipment and monitoring "shed", located within the fenced enclosure which also houses the carbon canisters, was in the "ON" position. The fuel tank (LPG, propane, etc.) appeared to contain 88% capacity, as indicated by this tank's gauge.

I attempted to contact Karl Kerner of Thrifty Oil yesterday to discuss the status of the SAUE system. He was not available at the time, and so I left a message for him to call me. As of this writing, Mr. Kerner has not returned my call.

Well installation status. No wells installed yet. Trouble getting approval from CalTrans (?); they've indicated that they will be working on both Stanton and Castro Valley Blvd. very soon, and as a result, won't give the O.K. to install wells for fear they will be destroyed. I asked Ms. Witt to pursue this further because it does not seem likely that CalTrans should control what happens on Stanton Ave., a small side road perpendicular to Castro Valley Blvd. Further, Ms. Witt indicated that CalTrans work was to continue on Castro Valley Blvd. It appears that work has already been completed in this area. It's not clear what further need be done. I asked Ms. Witt to again contact AlCo Public Works to get low down on this situation.

Also, permits for discharge of treated ground water have not yet been issued. Apparently there is still some debate over who actually is the issuing agency: Oro Loma or C.V. Sanitary District? I told her that an interim measure for temporary storage of extracted groundwater will need to be devised (ie, tank, drums, etc.) until such time as permanent permits can be issued. She will be talking w/ Pete D'Amico AsstP § getting back to me.

In review of the latest submittal of closure documentation from Thrifty Oil Co., under cover dated August 2, 1989, I noted that samples collected from the stack piled material on January 24, 1989 and analyzed by GTEL on 1-25-89 averaged approx. 854 ppm. However, material from the northern end of the pile, characterized in samples # 1-1B averaged 1224 ppm TPH-C; samples # 1-7 averaged 1881 ppm, with a ~~mode~~ of 5900 ppm TPH-C. This northern portion is clearly hazardous waste, at the time of these analyses.

Approx. four (4) months transpired between these analyses and disposal occurring May 22 and 23, 1989. No record of lab analyses prior to disposal is provided. However, wastes were disposed as "non-hazardous", or designated waste at Liquid Waste Management's McKittrick, CA Class II-I facility.
