### Dear Responsible Parties:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file and the recently submitted document entitled Addendum to the Evaluation of Low-Threat Case Closure Criteria and Response to Comments (RFC) prepared by Cardno and dated January 23, 2018. ACDEH is in general concurrence with the RFC and is considering the above referenced site for potential case closure. Closure would be under the existing land use as an active service station property. As you are aware site investigation and groundwater monitoring for underground storage tank leaks has been performed at the subject property to which you are named as the primary or active responsible parties.

## **List of Landowners Form**

Pursuant to Section 25297.15 (a) of the California Health and Safety Code, ACDEH, the local agency, shall not consider cleanup or site closure proposals from the primary or active responsible party, issue a closure letter, or make a determination that no further action is required with respect to a site upon which there was an unauthorized release of hazardous substances from an underground storage tank subject to this chapter unless all current record owners of fee title to the site of the proposed action have been notified of the proposed action by the primary or active responsible party. ACDEH is required to notify the primary or active responsible parties of their requirement to certify in writing to the local agency that the notification requirement in the above-mentioned regulation has been satisfied and to provide the local agency with a complete mailing list of all record fee title owners.

To satisfy this requirement, please complete the enclosed *List of Landowners Form*, and mail it back to ACDEH by the date identified below.

## **Site Management Requirements**

As indicated above, ACDEH staff has evaluated the case file and believes the case may be eligible for closure. Closure would be under the existing land use as an active service station property. As residual soil contamination remains in soil beneath the site, excavation or construction activities require planning and implementation of appropriate health and safety procedures by the responsible party (or current property owner/developer) prior to and during excavation and construction activities.
