Re: Arco Gas Station Hazardous Materials Discharge


Dear Sir:

On February 8, 1985, the City of Pleasanton Fire Department responded to the Arco Gas Station at 4191 First Street in Pleasanton for a gasoline spill. As a result of this incident, Five hundred one dollars and seventy-five cents (\$501.75) in City of Pleasanton tax monies were expended to control the situation and abate the hazard. (See attachment.)

Investigation of the incident showed that the cause of the spill was most likely due to the over filling of underground storage tanks. Following the incident, pressure testing of underground tanks and piping was performed with no underground leaks being discovered. The conclusion therefore being that the incident occurred during delivery. Chapter VI, Section VI.02 of the City Ordinance entitled "Hazardous Materials Storage Permit Ordinance" provides for the recovery of those costs incurred by the City in remedying the effects of such unauthorized discharge. (See attachment.)

A warrant may be drawn to the City of Pleasanton and mailed to the Director of Finance, City of Pleasanton, P.O. Box 520, Pleasanton, CA 94566-0802. If full payment is not received within thirty (30) days of this date, a civil action may be initiated to recover these costs.

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While on Alarm #50196, Squad 61 was advised of a possible gasoline leak at the corner of First and Ray Streets. All District One Fire Units were tied up on Alarm #50195, including 6-A3.

Upon arrival, Squad 61, along with 6-A4 determined this gasoline incident to be located at 4191 First Street., Arco Service Station (old Gas N' Save).

I observed heavy rain water run-off mixed with what looked like a petroleum product concentrated in the extreme northwest portion of the property, near the Arco storage shed. Squad 61 staged uphill/upwind and investigated further. Closer examination revealed a distinct gasoline odor in the run-off. I observed the water/petroleum run-off entering two separate City sewer systems.

I advised dispatch of our report on conditions and requested immediate notification of those resources involved with hazardous substances entering waterways.

I requested sand from Public Works be delivered for diking operations at approximately 0915 hours, Public Works arrived with sand. Diking was performed in two areas to prevent further run-off.

At 1010 hours, Department of Fish & Game Warden James Bond, along with Lt. Miles Young arrived on the scene and assumed incident command.

Fish & Game conducted initial investigation and contacted Arco representative Bob Bell (general manager for retail sales, 619/291-1000). Mr. Bell authorized cleanup to be conducted by Postive Incident Control (PIC). Fish & Game took many photos and water samples.

6-A3 arrived on scene approximately 1015 hours and assumed command of fire department operations.


Zone 7 arrived on scene approximately 1100 hours and made cursory examination of Arroyo del Valle. They found no evidence of contamination.

Regional Quality Water Board engineer Robert Samariago arrived approximately 1125 hours. He surveyed scene and collected water samples for testing.

E.P.A. Technical Assistance Team arrived (Karen Greig) approximately 1130 hours. She offered special access to the "Super Fund" for cleanup if no funds were available.

Squad 61 remained on scene to assist in coordination and to assist P.I.C. with wash down.

Squad 61 secured at 1430 hours.

Whenever a material balance or other inventory record, employed as a monitoring technique under the HMP, indicates a loss of hazardous material, and no unauthorized discharge has been confirmed by other means, permittee shall have five (5) working days to determine whether or not there has been an unauthorized discharge. If before the end of such period, it is determined that there has been no unauthorized discharge, an entry explaining the occurrence shall be made in permittee's monitoring records. Where permittee has not been able, within such period, to determine that there has been no unauthorized discharge, an unauthorized discharge is deemed confirmed and permittee shall proceed in accordance with subsection VI.01.A.1b above.

b. Test Results.

Whenever any test results suggest a possible unauthorized discharge, and no unauthorized discharge has been confirmed by other means, the permittee shall have five (5) working days to retest. If second test results obtained within that period establish that there has been no unauthorized discharge, the results of both tests shall be recorded in permittee's monitoring records. If it has not been established within such period that there has been no unauthorized discharge, an unauthorized discharge is deemed confirmed and permittee shall proceed in accordance with subsection VI.01.A.1b above.

B. Gases at STP.

Any person in charge of a storage facility or responsible for emergency response for a storage facility, who has knowledge of any unauthorized discharge of a hazardous material which is a gas at STP, must immediately report such discharge to the city* if such discharge presents a threat of imminent danger to public health and safety.

VI.02 Cleanup Responsibility.

Any person, firm or corporation responsible for storing the

* city shall mean the local entity enacting the model ordinance.
** appropriate local officer

hazardous material shall institute and complete all actions necessary to remedy the effects of any unauthorized discharge, whether sudden or gradual. City* shall undertake actions to remedy the effects of such unauthorized discharge itself, only if it determines that it is reasonably necessary under the circumstances for the city* to do so. The responsible party shall be liable to reimburse city* for all costs incurred by city* in remedying the effects of such unauthorized discharge, including the costs of fighting fires to the extent allowed by law. This responsibility is not conditioned upon evidence of willfulness or negligence of the party storing the hazardous material(s) in causing or allowing such discharge. Any responsible party who undertakes action to remedy the effects of unauthorized discharge(s) shall not be barred by this Chapter from seeking to recover appropriate costs and expenditures from other responsible parties except as provided by VI.03.

VI.03 Indemnification.

The permittee shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the city* against any claim, cause of action, disability, loss, liability, damage, cost or expense, howsoever arising, which occurs by reason of an unauthorized discharge in connection with permittee's operations under this permit, except as arises from city's* sole willful act or sole active negligence.

PART VII

INSPECTIONS AND RECORDS

VII.01 Inspections by City*.

City* may conduct inspections, at its discretion, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with this Chapter and causing to be corrected any conditions which would constitute any violation of this Chapter or of any other statute, code, rule or regulation affecting the storage of hazardous materials.

Permittees are not required to disclose the identity of hazardous materials protected as trade secrets pursuant to Section V.04 to anyone other than the official designated for that purpose pursuant to Section V.04.C.3, except in the case of an emergency response or an unauthorized discharge related to the storage facility in which the trade secret

Gas station leak washes into Arroyo Del Valle

PLEASANTON — Cleanup crews were called in Friday after California Department of Fish and Game wardens discovered that heavy rains had carried gasoline from an Arco station on First and Ray streets into Arroyo Del Valle.

Warden Jim Bond said the petroleum product either leaked from an underground storage tank or overflowed as it was pumped into the tank,

last filled around 3 a.m. Friday.

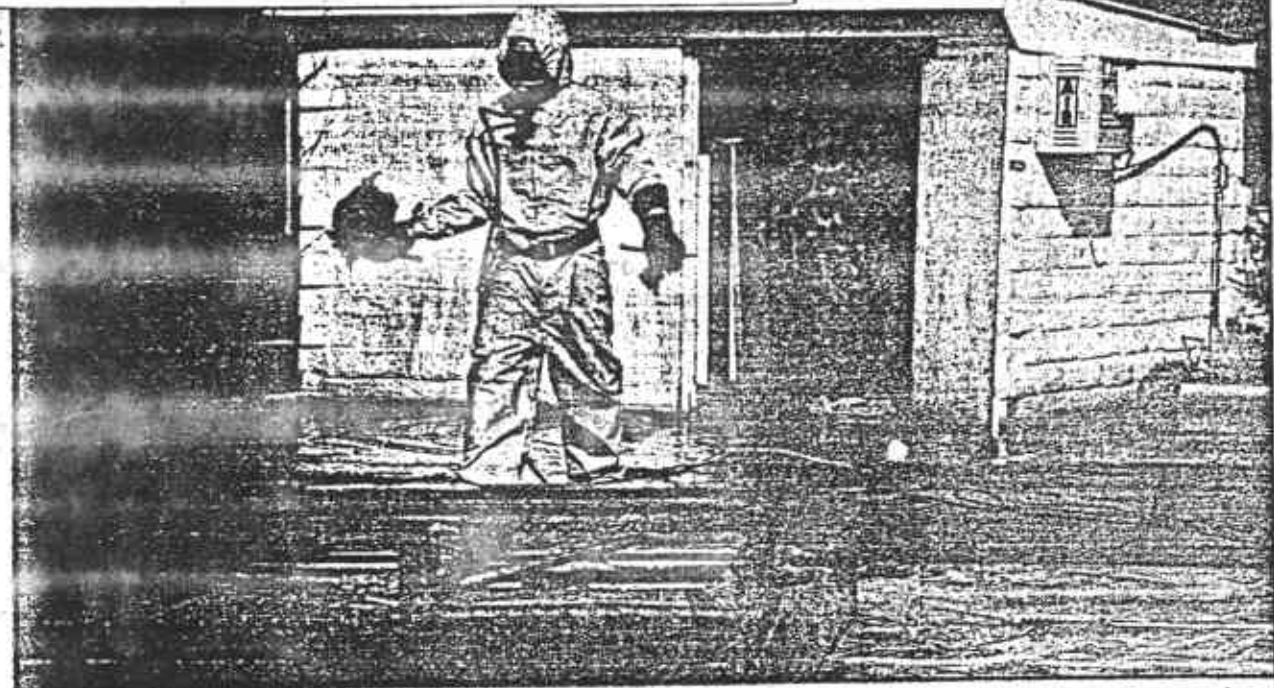
A pressure test will be conducted on the tank, he said, to determine if gasoline is still leaking.

Fish and game officials were alerted to the incident by the Pleasanton Fire Department, which assisted in washing down the area. Workers from the PIC Hazardous Spill Team of Concord, called by Arco, vacuumed up gasoline and rainwater that had. Please see LEAK, Page 2A

formed an eight-foot puddle inside a storage shed.

Heavy rain carried the gasoline to a grassy area along the railroad tracks behind the station and into a storm drain. The drain empties into Arroyo Del Valle which flows into Alameda Creek and the South Bay Area.

The wardens dammed the creek Friday morning, but Bond said he could not tell how much of the petroleum product had already washed down the creek.

The station manager declined to comment on the incident.

In the last four months, Bond said, three or four hazardous spills

had occurred in Arroyo Del Valle.

"The last one took us two weeks to clean up. It was an expensive and extensive pollution," he said.

An oil product used to pave a parking lot at an industrial park at Valley Avenue and Serpentine Lane leaked into the creek. Another oil spill occurred, Bond said, when someone dumped crankcase oil into a storm drain that flows into Arroyo Del Valle.

"There needs to be awareness from the public that the creeks are fragile for fish life," Bond said, adding people commonly dump automobile oil in storm drains not realizing it ends up in creeks.

Petroleum products can affect

said, as well as destroy the micro-organisms fish eat.

The Arco gasoline leak could affect the steelhead trout and salmon in Alameda Creek during spring spawning season, he said.

Spill-team workers removed from the storage shed cans of industrial paint and a 200-pound steel drum that Bond said probably contained mothballs.

Arco personnel had been spreading mothballs on the roof of the station to repel pigeons, Bond said. Mothballs sealed inside the drum had not leaked. With the station manager's consent, they were transported to a hazardous waste disposal site.

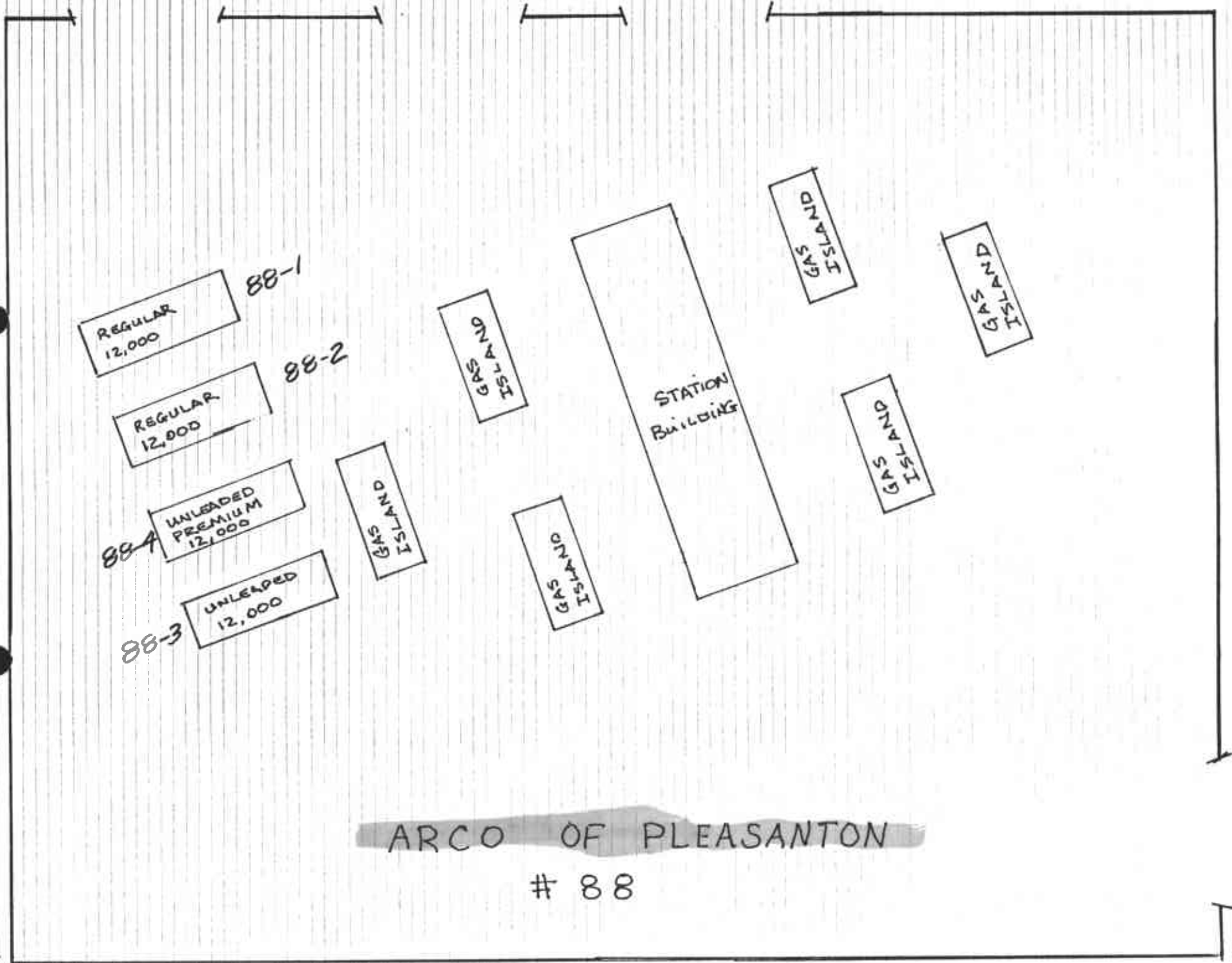
