

Dear Mr. Boust:

Enviros, Inc. has prepared this letter report to document the findings of the modified Phase I Site Assessment conducted at the above referenced location. The objectives of the assessment were to evaluate historical occupants and land-use at the subject site. Historical land-use in the immediate vicinity of the subject site was also evaluated to identify potential off-site sources of petroleum contamination.

Executive Summary

- The property is presently occupied by an operating Unocal Service Station.
- As early as 1907 until approximately 1969, the subject property was occupied by a warehouse facility (barn-like structure). Sanborn Maps indicate that the warehouse was used for grain storage and machinery. An underground oil tank is identified on the warehouse property.
- A service station was constructed on the property in 1976. The locations of the dispenser islands, underground storage tanks, and station building on the original construction drawings are consistent with the present site configuration.
- The service station was initially constructed as a Gas-N-Save self service gasoline station by Mr. Vernon Dickman of Salt Lake City, Utah.
- A grant deed transferring the property from Mr. Dickman to Armour Oil Company of San Diego, California was executed on June 19, 1980.
- A product release was identified by the Pleasanton Fire Department in November 1982.

- Armour Oil Company entered into a Contract Dealer Gasoline Agreement with ARCO Products Company on October 17, 1983. This agreement was extended several times to run through February 18, 1988.
- A product release from the underground piping was identified in February 1984.
- Product spills and/or surface run-off were reported in January and February 1985.
- A soil investigation was conducted in June 1987 to assess site conditions prior to the transfer of the service station from Armour Oil Company to Unocal. Petroleum hydrocarbon contamination was identified in soil near the underground storage tanks.
- The underground storage tanks were removed in December 1987. An unknown volume of contaminated was reportedly removed to a Class I disposal facility. Costs associated with the soil sampling, transport and disposal appear to have been paid through an insurance policy issued to Armour Oil Company.
- Unocal began operation of the service station in February 1988.
- Soil contamination was encountered during piping modifications at the site in October 1994.
- Balboa Associates, located in San Diego, California, was identified by Alameda County as a possible successor to Armour Oil Company.

Site Description

The subject property is located on the northwest corner of the intersection of First Street and Ray Street in Pleasanton, California. The site is bordered by Ray Street to the south, First Street to the east, a retail/office building to the north and a former railroad track right-of-way to the west. The property is occupied by an operating Unocal Service Station.

Property use in the immediate site vicinity can be described as residential to the west, retail (Pleasant Plaza Shopping Center) to the south, office space to the north, and commercial/light industrial to the east.

Within the immediate vicinity of the subject property, a Shell Service Station located on the southeast corner of First Street and Ray Street was identified as a potential off-site source of petroleum hydrocarbon contamination. Based on available information (soil samples collected at the Shell site and depth to groundwater), the potential for the Shell site to have impacted Unocal is low.

Chain of Title

A Chain of Title report prepared by Fidelity National Title Insurance Company established the following record of ownership for the subject property:

- George G. and Elsie M. Prytz conveyed the parcel to B.H. Hall by deed dated June 1, 1943.
- Beuford H. and Blanche A. Hall conveyed the parcel to Vernon G. Dickman by deed dated July 2, 1975.
- Vernon G. Dickman transferred the property to San Diego Armour Oil Company by deed dated June 19, 1980.
- San Diego Armour Oil Company conveyed the property to Lawyers Title Insurance Corporation by deed dated January 22, 1988.
- Lawyers Title Insurance Corporation granted the property to Unocal by deed dated January 21, 1988.

A copy of the Chain of Title report is included in Appendix A.

Aerial Photographs

Aerial photographs for the site vicinity were reviewed at Pacific Aerial in Oakland, California. Aerial photographs taken in 1957, 1963, 1969, 1973, 1978, 1984, 1988, and 1992 were available for review.

In the 1978, 1984, 1988, and 1992 photographs, the structures on the subject property are consistent with the current building and canopy lay-out. In the 1973 photograph, the site is an undeveloped vacant property. In the 1957, 1963, and 1969 photographs, the site is occupied by a "barn-like" structure.

The Shell Service Station was present on the southeast corner of First Street and Ray Street in the 1969, 1973, 1978, 1984, 1988, and 1992 photographs. This site appears to have been occupied by a residential building in the 1957 and 1963 photographs.

City Directories

Haines Criss-Cross Directories for the City of Pleasanton were available for the period of 1973 to 1991. The subject property was not listed in the directory for the period of 1973 to 1976. From 1977 to 1988, the directories identify Gas N Save at the subject address of 4191 First Street. From 1989 to 1991, the directories list Epoch Unocal 76 at the subject address. The Shell Service Station, located at 4226 First Street, was listed in the directories from 1973 to 1991. The directories did not list any other facilities which may store petroleum hydrocarbons in the immediate vicinity of the site.

Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps

Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps were requested from the Sanborn Company to evaluate historical land-use at and near the subject property. Sanborn Maps for the years 1903, 1907, 1943, and 1953 were provided by the Sanborn Company. The subject property was not within the coverage boundaries for the 1903 map. On the 1907, 1943 and 1953 maps, the site is occupied by what appears to be a warehouse. This warehouse is identified as "Hall W. Ho. Co. No. 1 - Grain". Several other warehouses identified as "Hall W. Ho. Co." are shown in the site vicinity on the maps. The 1907 and 1943 map identify an "oil tank in ground" adjacent to the warehouse structure on the subject property.

Copies of the Sanborn Maps are included in Appendix B.

Public Agency Records

Files and records pertaining to the subject property were reviewed by the following public agencies:

City of Pleasanton Building Department

The building department had a number of applications, supporting documents, and permits archived on microfiche. There were no records pertaining to property-use prior to development of the site as a service station.

A site plan submitted with the initial building permit application shows the same general station layout as the current configuration. Mr. Vernon Dickman was the applicant identified on the permit application (April 1975).

Atlantic Richfield (ARCO) was named as the site owner on building permit applications dated January 16, 1984 and January 10, 1985. Copies of these permit applications are included in Appendix C.

City of Pleasanton Fire Department

The Pleasanton Fire Department files contained information documenting several gasoline releases which occurred at the site between November 1982 and February 1985.

The fire department conducted an inspection at the Gas N Save service station on November 8, 1982. The inspector found a damaged fuel filter with approximately nine gallons of gasoline pooled beneath the dispenser. There was no estimate on the quantity of the release.

On November 23, 1982, a 100 gallons of gasoline "upwelled from underground tank farm".

On February 20, 1984, the fire department responded to a gasoline spill at the ARCO station. A fire department Inter-Office Memorandum indicated that approximately 30 gallons of gasoline was spilled from pump #12 due to a possible break in the underground piping next to the pump. (Note: A RWQCB document references a 500-1,000 gallon subsurface spill at the site on February 20, 1984.)

On January 7, 1985, an occupant of the adjacent property (4183 First Street) complained of a strong gasoline odor around a storm drain. The odor was suspected to be the result of runoff from a possible spill during maintenance work on two of the USTs on that date.

On February 8, 1985 the fire department responded to a gasoline spill at the site. Other agencies responding to the spill included the RWQCB, Fish and Game, and EPA. The spill was suspected to have been the result of overfilling the USTs.

Information copied from the fire department files to document these releases is included in Appendix D.

Reports documenting previous site investigations were contained in the fire department files.

In June 1987, Applied GeoSystems (AGS) drilled three soil borings to evaluate site conditions prior to possible sale of the property. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in the vicinity of the USTs. The results of this investigation are summarized in an AGS report dated July 14, 1987.

In August 1987, an additional soil boring was drilled to a depth of 66.5 feet. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in soil samples collected from this boring. The results of this investigation are summarized in an AGS report dated September 9, 1987.

A work plan related to replacement of the USTs and installation of 3 monitoring wells was issued by AGS on October 22, 1987. The fire department file did not contain any information pertaining to the UST replacement or well installations (see Alameda County Environmental Health section of this report).

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) files contained many of the same documents found at the Pleasanton Fire Department documenting the leak history and previous environmental investigations at the site.

ACDEH files also contained information pertaining to the UST replacement and well installations referenced in the AGS work plan dated October 22, 1987. A report was retrieved from Resna (AGS) computer archives. Resna did indicate that the report provided was retrieved from computer archives and may not represent the final report. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in groundwater samples collected by AGS for Armour Oil Company at concentrations up to 24,000 ppb for TPH-gasoline and 2,600 ppb for benzene. Contaminated soil, excavated during the UST removal in December 1987, was transported to a Class I facility by IT Corporation. The costs associated with the soil disposal and monitoring well installations appear to have been paid through an insurance policy held by Armour Oil Company.

ACDEH files contained correspondence between ACDEH and Unocal, ARCO, and/or Armour Oil Company regarding identification of responsibility for site environmental issues. Unocal was copied on all of these correspondences except for a letter from ARCO to ACDEH dated January 23, 1995. In the letter ARCO denies responsibility for the site. The contract between ARCO and Armour Oil Company is attached to the letter. A copy of the ARCO letter is included in Appendix E.

ACDEH personnel indicated that an Armour Oil Company was listed in the San Diego directory assistance in December 1994. ACDEH also indicated that a relationship exists between Balboa Associates of San Diego, California and Armour Oil Company.

California Regional Water Quality Control Board

The Unocal Service Station at 4191 First Street and the Shell Service Station at 4226 First Street were the only sites within a 1/4-mile radius on the RWQCB's fuel leak list.

Documents in the RWQCB file for the subject property duplicated those found at either the Pleasanton Fire Department and/or ACDEH.

Site investigations conducted at the Shell Service Station have identified petroleum hydrocarbons in shallow soil samples. The vertical extent of contamination appears to have been delineated. There is no evidence to indicate that groundwater has been impacted by activities at the Shell site. The probability for the Shell site to have impacted the Unocal property seems low.

Cal-EPA Facility Inventory Database

The Facility Inventory Data Base (FID) listing for the subject properties zip code area was requested from the California EPA. In addition to the Shell Service Station and Unocal Service Station, an active underground storage tank is listed for the Pacific Bell facility at 120 Ray Street. This facility is located approximately 0.1 mile southwest of the subject property.

The FID listing is included in Appendix F.

Summary

Petroleum hydrocarbon contamination has been identified at the subject property. Several product releases were documented to have occurred between November 1982 and February 1985. During this period, the service station was owned and operated by Armour Oil Company of San Diego. Between October 1983 and February 1988, Armour Oil Company and ARCO Products Company entered into a Contract Dealer Gasoline Agreement(s).

Environmental investigations were conducted beginning in June 1987 to assess site conditions prior to the possible sale of the property. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in soil samples collected in the vicinity of the USTs. Three groundwater monitoring wells were installed as described in a work plan dated October 22, 1987. Petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in groundwater samples collected from these wells. A document in the ACDEH files indicates that the report for monitoring well installations was never submitted to the regulatory agencies.

ACDEH personnel indicated that an Armour Oil Company was listed in the San Diego directory assistance in December 1994. ACDEH also indicated that a relationship exists between Balboa Associates of San Diego, California and Armour Oil Company.

While on Alarm #50196, Squad 61 was advised of a possible gasoline leak at the corner of First and Ray Streets. All District One Fire Units were tied up on Alarm #50195, including 6-A3.

Upon arrival, Squad 61, along with 6-A4 determined this gasoline incident to be located at 4191 First Street., Arco Service Station (old Gas N' Save).

I observed heavy rain water run-off mixed with what looked like a petroleum product concentrated in the extreme northwest portion of the property, near the Arco storage shed. Squad 61 staged uphill/upwind and investigated further. Closer examintation revealed a distinct gasoline odor in the run-off. I observed the water/petroleum run-off entering two separate City sewer systems.

I advised dispatch of our report on conditions and requested immediate notification of those resources involved with hazardous substances entering waterways.

I requested sand from Public Works be delivered for diking operations at approximately 0915 hours, Public Works arrived with sand. Diking was performed in two areas to prevent further run-off.

At 1010 hours, Department of Fish & Game Warden James Bond, along with Lt. Miles Young arrived on the scene and assumed incident command.

Fish & Game conducted initial investigation and contacted Arco representative Bob Bell (general manager for retail sales, 619/291-1000). Mr. Bell authorized cleanup to be conducted by Postive Incident Control (PIC). Fish & Game took many photos and water samples.

6-A3 arrived on scene approximately 1015 hours and assumed command of fire department operations.

Zone 7 arrived on scene approximately 1100 hours and made cursory examination of Arroyo del Valle. They found no evidence of contamination.

Regional Quality Water Board engineer Robert Samariego arrived approximately 1125 hours. He surveyed scene and collected water samples for testing.

E.P.A. Technical Assistance Team arrived (Karen Greig) approximately 1130 hours. She offered special access to the "Super Fund" for cleanup if no funds were available.

Squad 61 reamined on scene to assist in coordination and to assist P.I.C. with wash down.

Squad 61 secured at 1430 hours.

Gas tank rupture forces evacuation

~ PLEASANTON — A gasoline spill and questionable dumping policies which could result in extensive pollution to a local creek kept firefighters and state Fish and Game investigators busy in separate incidents Monday.

The Gas N Save service station, 4191 First St., was closed Monday afternoon after Pleasanton firerighters found 100 gallons of gasoline welling from an underground storage tank and collecting in a nearby parking lot.

The pooling gasoline, which Fire Marshal Ted Klenk said could have meant major disaster it it had been touched off by sparks from a passing car or by a casually tossed cigarette, was still being collected by a Martinez-based hazardous chemical company Monday night.

Cleanup costs, which Klenk and Fire Chief Joe Hill said would be substantial, will be forwarded to Gas. N Save. An inspection of the company's underground tanks will also be ordered, according to Hill.

None of the seeping gasoline, which forced the evacuation of four neighboring businesses, eached the nearby Arroyo Del Valle. The arroyo feeds a network of streams that ultimately provides water to residents in Fremont, Newark and Union City.

State Fish and Game inspectors reported that a large amount of diesel fuel did reach the arroyo in an unrelated incident that could mean

litigation as well as cleanup costs for a Pleasanton-based trucking

Investigators looking into the accidental hischarge of 40 to 100 gallons of kerosene oil by workers at the Utility Vault Co., 800 Valley Ave., discovered that the firm's neighbor may also have been dumping petroleum products into the stream.

B & G Trucking, which shares the 800 Valley Ave. address, appeared to have been using the arroyo as a dump site for oil, truck filters and other items ultimately harmful to the ecology of the area, according to Hill

"It seems they were changing the oil on their trucks, dumping it near the creek and when these rains came it was collected and washed down tream," Hill said, adding that traces of the oil had been found some distance away from where it had been discharged originally.

Fish and Game wardens visited the company, Hill said, Taking pictures and samples of the pointed area Monday

"I would guess there would definitely be some kind of legal action taken against the company," Hill said. "And they may have to pay for cleauup. It's all up to the Fish and Game as to what action is taken against them."

Fish and Game officials and owners of the trucking company could not be reached for comment Monday night.

formed an ankle-deep puddle inside a storage shed.

Heavy rain carried the gasoline to a grassy area along the railroad tracks behind the station and into a storm drain. The drain empties into Arroyo Dei Valle which flows into-Alameda Creek and the South Bay cial the energy in tax and Area.

The wardens dammed the creek Friday morning, but Bond said he could not tell how much of the petroleum product had aiready washed down the creek.

The station manager declined to comment on the incident.

In the last four months, Bond said, three or four hazardous spills

occurred in Arroyo Del Valle. The last one took us two weeks to clean up. It was an expensive

and extensive pollution," he said. "An oil product used to pave a 🖟 parking lot at an industrial park at Valley Avenue and Serpentine Lane leaked into the creek. Another oil spill occurred, Bond said, when someone dumped crankcase oil into a storm drain that flows into Arroyo Del Valle.

"There needs to be awareness from the public that the creeks are fragile for fish life," Bond said, adding people commonly dump automobile oil in storm drains not realizing it ends up in creeks.

Petroleum products can affect. the reproduction cycle of fish, Bond

said, as well as destroy the microorganisms fish eat.

The Arco gasoline leak could affect the steelhead trout and salmon in Alameda Creek during spring spawning season, be said.

Spill-team workers removed from the storage shed cans of industrial paint and a 200-pound steel drum that Bond said probably contained mothballs.

Arco personnel had been spreading mothballs on the roof of the station to repel pigeons, Bond said. Mothballs sealed inside the drum had not leaked. With the station manager's consent, they were transported to a hazardous waste disposal site.

This letter contains the information requested in your letter dated November 11, 1994 to Michael Whelan of ARCO. Pursuant to your suggestion in our earlier phone conversation, we are providing this information at the January 44 Review Panel Hearing, rather than in a prior mailing.

ARCO never had any ownership interest in the site, nor any responsibility for or control over operation of the gasoline service station on the site. ARCO's records show that that station was operated by Armour Oil Company, an independent dealer, between October 1983 and December 1987. Armour Oil Company received product supply during this period under a franchise supply contract with ARCO Products Company (the "Contract"). A copy of the Contract is enclosed. The terms of the Contract is strictly governed by the Petroleum Marketing Practices Act, 15 USC § 2801 et seq. (the "PMPA").

Under the Contract, Armour Oil owned or leased from a third party the real property and improvements at this location. ARCO had no proprietary interest in these assets nor did ARCO own, operate or in any way control the underground storage tank system ("UST"). The independent dealer had sole responsibility for maintaining and monitoring the UST. The independent dealer also had sole responsibility for complying with all laws and regulations, including those pertaining to water and air pollution, vapor recovery, inventory control, leak detection, handling, use, storage and sale. In fact, neither the PMPA nor the Contract gave ARCO the right, let alone the obligation, to enter the site to monitor for leaks or to make any repairs or replacements to the UST. Only the dealer could do so.

Moreover, under the Contract's express terms, ARCO was related to Armour Oil only as a franchisor and supplier. Armour Oil, as a contract dealer, did not function as ARCO's agent. See Paragraph 23 of the Contract; Cislaw v. Southland Corp., 4 Cal. App. 4th 1284, 6 Cal. Rptr. 2d 386 (1992) (holding that selling the oil company's products and displaying its signs do not create an agency relationship).

Federal courts generally have jurisdiction over such contracts due to the PMPA. They regularly hold that a franchisor cannot be held liable for the contract dealer's failure to comply with environmental laws or the retailer's negligence. See, e.g., General Electric Co., 962 F.2d 281; Amoco Qil Co. v. EPA, 543 F.2d 270, 275 (D.C. Cir. 1976); Amoco Qil Co. v. U.S., 450 F. Supp. 195 (W.D. Mo. 1978).

ARCO's initial response, indicating the supply period began in 1984, was based on a summary report with a typo. Documents supporting the earlier October 1983 date referenced in this letter are enclosed.

The State Water Resources Control Board has concurred. It has refused to find suppliers and distributors of gasoline liable as responsible parties. In the enclosed document entitled "State Board Orders: Who Should be Named in Ground Water Cleanup Orders," the State Board advises:

"There must be a reasonable basis for naming a responsible party (i.e., substantial evidence). It is inappropriate to name persons who are only remotely related to the suppliers and distributors of gasoline."

See also WQ 85-7.

In addition to the Contract, you have asked for copies of any operations manual or other, similar procedural guidelines issued during the Contract period. ARCO did not publish a manual which could be enforced outside of the Contract or the PMPA; the Contract and PMPA contained all rights and obligations relevant to the issue of control. For your general information, however, we have enclosed a copy of a guidance document sharing information on leaking underground tanks that ARCO provided to Contract Dealers.² We also have enclosed some informative letters on regulatory developments that ARCO provided its contract dealers during this time period.

You also have asked whether ARCO allowed its credit card to be used at the site. During the period in question, ARCO did not have a credit card system; it had been discontinued.

² You may note that, in the Summary Section, the contract dealer is specifically instructed to have the necessary repairs made immediately. This lies in sharp contrast to the procedure ARCO outlines in a similar pamphlet for its regular retailers who lease stations owned by ARCO and who are not independent contractors. The pamphlet addressed to such lessee dealers instructs them not to make the repairs themselves, but to call ARCO maintenance to have ARCO make the repairs.

STATE BOARD ORDERS: WHO SHOULD BE NAMED IN GROUED WATER CLEANUP ORDERS

Summary of Principles

- In general, name all persons who have caused or permitted a discharge (Orders Nos. WQ 85-7 and 86-16).
- "Discharge" is to be construed broadly to include both active discharges and continuing discharges (Order No. WQ 86-2).
- There must be reasonable basis for naming a responsible party (i.e., substantial evidence). It is inappropriate to name persons who are only remotely related to the problem such as suppliers and distributors of gasoline (WQ 85-7, 86-16, 87-1, 89-13, and 90-2).
- Persons who are in current possession, ownership or control of the property should be named, including current landowners and lessees (numerous orders, including WQ 84-6, 86-11, 86-18, 89-1, 89-8, 89-13 and 90-3).
 Lessees/sublessors may be responsible (WQ 86-15).
- Generally, Regional Water Boards should not try to apportion responsibility between parties (WQ 86-2 and 88-2).
- However, in some cases, current landowners should only be named as secondarily liable. Factors: landowner did not cause or know of actual discharge; tenant, lessee or prior owner is responsible; cleanup is proceeding; and lease is long-term (WQ 86-11, 86-18, 87-6, and 92-13). Secondary responsibility is also appropriate where landowner is trustee-type governmental agency such as Forest Service (WQ 87-5).
- Prior landowners and lessees should be named if they owned or were in possession of the site at the time of discharge, had knowledge of the activities which resulted in the discharge, and had the legal ability to prevent the discharge (numerous orders, including WQ 85-7, 86-15, 91-7 and 92-13). Narrow exceptions based on such factors as: site owned or leased for short time, person did not cause actual discharge, are other responsible parties, person did not use property, no or minimal knowledge of problem (WQ 92-4 and 92-13).
- Government agencies may be named (WQ 88-2, 89-12, and 90-3).
- Corporations should be named even where a dissolved corporation (WQ 89-14) or a successor in interest (WQ 89-8).

No such sale of excess quantities shall constitute a waiver of the maximum quantity provisions set forth above. For any part of the term hereof covering less than a full calendar month, the parties' respective rights and obligations hereunder to purchase and sell specified volumes of Product shall bear the same proportion as that portion of the month bears to a full thirty-day month.

Volumes provided herein are further subject to the terms and conditions of Paragraphs 9 and 13 hereof.

Prices

4. Buyer shall pay for Product sold and delivered hereunder at the prices, established for such Product from time to time by ARCO for purchasers in the same classification as Buyer, in effect at the time and place of delivery to Buyer. Prices shall be subject to change at any time, at the election of ARCO, without notice.

Taxes

5. Any tax, excise, fee or other charge or any increase in any such tax, excise, fee or charge now or hereafter imposed by law upon the Product sold and delivered to **Buyer** hereunder or on the production, manufacture, storage, consumption, sale, use, transfer, transportation, delivery, or other handling thereof, or on this Agreement, which **ARCO** is required to pay or collect, shall be added to the price herein stated, and paid by **Buyer**.

Payment

6. Buyer shall pay ARCO at the time of delivery for all Product delivered hereunder unless otherwise mutually agreed upon from time to time. No allowance of credit by ARCO shall prevent ARCO from terminating the extension of credit and requiring at any time, at ARCO's election, payment at the time of delivery. Title to and risk of loss for such Product shall pass to Buyer at the time Product passes from ARCO's delivery equipment to Buyer's storage equipment. Should Buyer fail to make payment when due, ARCO may discontinue deliveries hereunder until payment is made. Should such failure continue for a period of five (5) days after demand, ARCO may, at its option, terminate this Agreement. All claims of Buyer with respect to the quality or quantity of any Product sold and delivered hereunder or the prices therefor payable or paid shall be deemed waived and forever barred unless Buyer notifies ARCO in writing of the nature and detail of the claim within thirty (30) days after delivery to Buyer.

Credit Card Privilege

7. Buyer may take part in Atlantic Richfield's credit card program and Atlantic Richfield agrees to accept credit card charge tickets, representing authorized credit card sales made at Buyer's premises, and presented by Buyer to Atlantic Richfield subject to Atlantic Richfield's terms and conditions in effect on the date authorized products or services are purchased by credit card holders. The privilege of taking part in Atlantic Richfield's credit card program will continue until terminated by either party giving to the other not less than forty-eight (48) hours prior written notice thereof. Any such termination shall not otherwise affect any other provision of this Agreement.

Trademarks

8. Buyer may display Atlantic Richfield Company's trademarks, trade names, advertising, signs, devices, symbols, slogans and other trade indicia (all of which are hereinafter collectively referred to as "marks") adopted and used by Atlantic Richfield in its business related to Product, provided that all marks are displayed in the manner as specified by Atlantic Richfield. Atlantic Richfield reserves the right without prior notice to Buyer, to change, alter, or modify any of its marks. Buyer agrees that it will not: adulterate, mislabel or misbrand Product or commit other trademark violations; contaminate Product; add any ingredient to Product without Atlantic Richfield's prior written consent; use any mark except in connection with genuine Atlantic Richfield Product; claim any rightitle or interest in or to said marks; directly or indirectly deny or assail or assist in denying or assailing the sole and exclusive ownership of Atlantic Richfield in and to the marks; adopt as its own property or use any trademarks, trade names, advertising, signs, devices, symbols, slogans or

Allocation

9. Buyer hereby enters into this Agreement with the understanding and agreement that ARCO's obligation to sell and deliver Product hereunder is subject to modification and reduction in accordance with any program governing the allocation of Product by ARCO which may be in effect on the date hereof and any allocation program hereafter adopted by ARCO or imposed by governmental law or regulation at any time during the term hereof.

Unleaded Regulations

- 10. a) ARCO agrees that all unleaded gasoline, as defined in regulations promulgated by the Environmental Protection Agency (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations") sold to **Buyer** by ARCO shall, at the point of delivery to **Buyer**, meet the specifications for lead and phosphorus as required by the Regulations.
- b) **Buyer** agrees that it will not cause or allow unleaded gasoline purchased from **ARCO** to be contaminated in any manner that will violate the lead and phosphorus specifications of the Regulations.
- c) Buyer agrees that ARCO, or its authorized representative, shall have the right to take samples of said unleaded gasoline and conduct or arrange for tests to determine compliance with said Regulations. If the unleaded gasoline exceeds the lead or phosphorus specifications of the Regulations, Buyer agrees that it will not sell such product as unleaded gasoline until such product meets the lead and phosphorus specifications of the Regulations.

Product Hazards

11. Buyer acknowledges that it is aware of hazards or risks in handling, storage, use and transportation of Product. Buyer will inform its employees, agents and contractors of any Product hazards or risks.

Tetraethyl Lead Regulations

12. Buyer shall sell any tetraethyl lead treated gasoline purchased under this Agreement in accordance with the rules and regulations now or hereafter issued by ARCO's suppliers of tetraethyl lead, United States Public Health Service or any governmental agency having jurisdiction thereof.

Excused Performance

13. Buyer shall not be obligated to order or accept deliveries if unable to operate Buyer's business by reason of fire, flood, war, civil commotions, strikes, blockades, or other causes beyond Buyer's control. ARCO shall not be responsible for any loss or damage resulting from any delay or failure in delivery due to fire, flood, storms, earthquake, tidal waves, war, military operations, national emergency, civil commotion, strikes or other differences with workers or unions, or from any delay or failure in delivery when the supplies of ARCO, or the facilities of production, manufacture, transportation or distribution which otherwise would be available to ARCO, are impaired by causes beyond ARCO's control, or by failure or shortage of raw materials necessary to the manufacture of the Product to be supplied hereunder, or by the order, requisition or request of any governmental agency or acting governmental authority or ARCO's compliance therewith or by governmental proration or regulation, or from any other delay or failure due to any causes beyond ARCO's control, similar or dissimilar to any such causes. In the event of any of the aforementioned contingencies, ARCO may allocate its available supply of Product among its customers or itself in such manner and at such time as it may at its sole discretion determine. During the continuance of any such contingency, the obligations of ARCO and Buyer shall be suspended and proportionately abated.

Notices

14. Any notice required or permitted by or pertaining to this Agreement shall be in writing and, if to Buyer, shall be addressed to Buyer at the premises and, if to ARCO, to the address specified in the first paragraph of this Agreement. Any such notice shall be sent by prepaid, certified or registered mail and shall be deemed to have been delivered, whether or not received, on the third business day after the date of mailing. Termination

In the event that **Buyer** fails to purchase the "Total Quarterly Minimum" quantity as set forth in the quantity provisions of this Agreement and fails, after receipt of written notice of such failure, to purchase that quarterly minimum quantity in addition to the "Total Monthly Minimum" quantity for the next succeeding month by the last day of the next succeeding month following the quarter in which such failure occurred, **ARCO** may terminate this Agreement by written notice to **Buyer**.

In addition to any other rights **ARCO** may have at law or in equity, for a default described at 15a, **ARCO** shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving **Buyer** not less than five (5) days prior written notice of termination.

In addition to any other rights ARCO may have at law or in equity, for defaults described at 15c, 15a, 15e, 15f, or 15g, ARCO shall have the right to terminate this Agreement.

In the event of breach by either party of any of the other terms of this Agreement and failure to correct the same within fifteen (15) days after written notice thereof, the other party hereto may terminate this Agreement by written notice to the defaulting party.

Leak Prevention And Detection

17. Buyer agrees that with respect to all underground storage tanks and related equipment located on the premises, Buyer shall do the following: (a) Have and maintain properly calibrated tank sticking device. (b) Gauge tanks daily for inventory loss and weekly for any water gain. (c) Verify inventory daily with stick readings to the nearest 1/a", by meter readings and a reconciliation of opening and closing inventory levels. If a variation exists, Buyer shall immediately investigate to determine the tightness of the product storage and supply system and make all necessary repairs and replacements prior to placing the equipment back into service. Buyer agrees to maintain on the premises records of such daily inventory verification for a period of not less than twelve months. (d) Keep fill caps tight. (e) Keep fill boxes free of dirt, ice and snow. (f) Immediately remove any water in excess of one inch (1") in any product storage tank. (g) Immediately investigate any leak detector activation and if a leak exists, make all necessary repairs and replacements of the faulty product piping. Buyer covenants and agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend ARCO from and against all claims, losses and damages for personal injury or death or damage to property, cleanup costs and fines not caused by ARCO's negligence. In addition, Buyer's failure to comply with the provisions hereof concerning underground storage tanks and related equipment shall constitute grounds for termination of the Agreement.

Assignment

18. This Agreement, and any amendment or supplements thereto, shall not be assignable by Buye, either voluntarily in whole or in part, including by incorporation or by operation of law, and shall not become an asset in any bankruptcy, estate, receivership or guardianship proceedings.

Dear ARCO customer:

Federal law and the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulation have set forth some rules which require certain owners of underground storage tanks to submit notices, as specified, to designated state agencies or departments for each underground tank they own. The purpose of the notification program is to assist EPA and the States in locating and evaluating underground storage tanks. The specifics of these rules are contained in the Federal Register, Volume 50, Number 217, dated November 8, 1985. The rules include the following provisions:

- 1. Owners of certain underground tanks used to store petroleum or hazardous substances on or after November 8, 1984 must notify designated State or local agencies of the existance of their tanks by May 8, 1986. Owners who bring tanks into use after May 8, 1986, must notify within 30 days.
- Owners of certain underground tanks used to store petroleum or hazardous substances that were taken out of operation after January 1, 1974 must also be reported unless they were removed from the ground.
- 3. As appropriate, the notifications must include the age, size, location, the name of the substance stored, and the type of tank.
- 4. Sellers of petroleum and hazardous substances to be deposited in underground storage tanks must "reasonably notify" the owner or operator of the underground storage tanks of their obligation to register their underground storage tanks.

This letter is being sent to you in response to the requirement that ARCO, as a seller of regulated substances which are to be deposited, inform its customers of their responsibility to register

their underground storage tanks. If you should resell a regulated substance to be deposited in an underground tank, you also have an obligation to inform your customers of their notification responsibility.

Although this notification program is mandated by Federal law, the States have been given the responsibility to implement their own notification programs. All notifications are to be submitted to the designated state agencies. We have attached a listing of the designated state agencies and advise you to contact the agency in your state for further information regarding compliance with state programs. We have also enclosed a copy of the notification form developed by EPA. The States may develop more comprehensive forms which might require additional information.

An underground storage tank that has already been registered in California meets the federal notification requirements for tank owners and no further action is required.

FACILITY INVENTORY DATA BASE FACT SHEET

Purpose

The Facility Inventory Data Base (FID) was created within the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) to facilitate the identification of complete environmental regulatory profiles for facilities. Currently, regulatory information on a given facility may exist in multiple sources located in multiple regulatory agencies at federal, state and local levels. Because these agencies may not routinely share facility information, it can be difficult to develop a complete regulatory profile for a facility.

<u>Function</u>

The FID integrates facility information from many different regulatory sources by matching the facilities based on their · location. When facility information is loaded into the FID, its county, street name and street number are compared to the same information from other regulatory sources. Facilities with the same location are then linked. Printouts from the FID list the facilities and cross-reference them to the regulatory sources which matched on the location criteria. Other facility information may include the regulatory ID number, standard industrial classification (SIC) code, contact person/telephone number and comments. More detail on a facility can be obtained by contacting the regulatory source for each cross-reference (contact information can be found in the table below).

Use

When using the FID printouts to find information on a facility at a particular location, the following steps are recommended:

- Find the street name first, then the street number. facilities are listed in street name order, with the street number shown in parenthesis following the street name.
- 2. Check for duplicates. Due to some data anomalies, some street addresses are repeated. The information associated with these duplicates is not redundant, and should therefore be combined to obtain a more complete profile for the address in question.
- Scan the list for possible occurrences of the address where З. the street name is spelled differently. Examples are the substitution of a single letter such as "q" for "g", and "s"
